In the Wagner Middle School grades 5-8, core reading is taught 90 minutes every day. In grades 5-6, core math is taught 45 every day and in grades $7-8$ core math is taught 90 minutes a day. In grades $5-6$, Reading intervention groups were also formed based on achievement and re-evaluated based on MAP scores. All students participate in a group. These groups meet for 45 minutes, every day, every other week. The focus of the intervention was reinforcing informational text. Vocab Surge and re-teaching of core concepts were also taught when needed during interventions. ICU is another program in place for all students. All students are expected to complete every assignment. Extra time, extra help, and re-teaching are the foundation of ICU.

In grades 5-6, core math is taught 45 every day and in grades 7-8 core math is taught 90 minutes a day. In grades $5-6$, Reading intervention groups were also formed based on achievement. These groups meet for 45 minutes, every day, every other week. The focus of the intervention was reinforcing informational text. Vocab Surge and re-teaching of core concepts were also taught when needed during interventions. Math Interventions in grades $5-6$ were taught at the end of the day, pulling students to re-teach
needed concepts. In grades $7-8$, students were identified to need extra help by unit tests, and then pulled at the end of the day for a week using Pearson Course 2 and Course 3 Re-Teach Series. In grades 7-8 Reading Interventions, students were identified by achievement and met every other week.

Summer Programming is offered school wide grades K-7. In the Middle School it is offered grades 5-7. Approximately 20 Middle School students sign up for Summer Programming. One teacher and usually one para is hired for the middle school. In addition, USD teaching interns provide assistance. This year, we have partnered with the University of Nebraska and Kearney who will be sending instructors for a week to work with our students on Health and Fitness.

Also this year, to realign with the new science standards, our middle school adopted a new science curriculum. Professional development was provided to help them with the new curriculum. In addition, our school adopted a new Communication Arts series. Professional development was provided for those staff members. This summer professional development was provided on Kagan Teaching Strategies.

Annually, the Middle School has hosted an open house night consisted of "Science and Wax Museum Night." Science Fair projects are displayed and in grades 5-6 students dress as a historical figure, and read in first person the short biography the student wrote. Parent Teacher Conferences are held twice a year. Teachers contact the parents and schedule the time for each conference. Through the ICU on-line data
base, parents are texted and emailed when their child is added to the list for missing work or assignments to be redone. They are also then contacted when their child's assignment has been completed. In addition, Positive Parent Contacts are required to be logged by staff. This is shared with the school board monthly.
