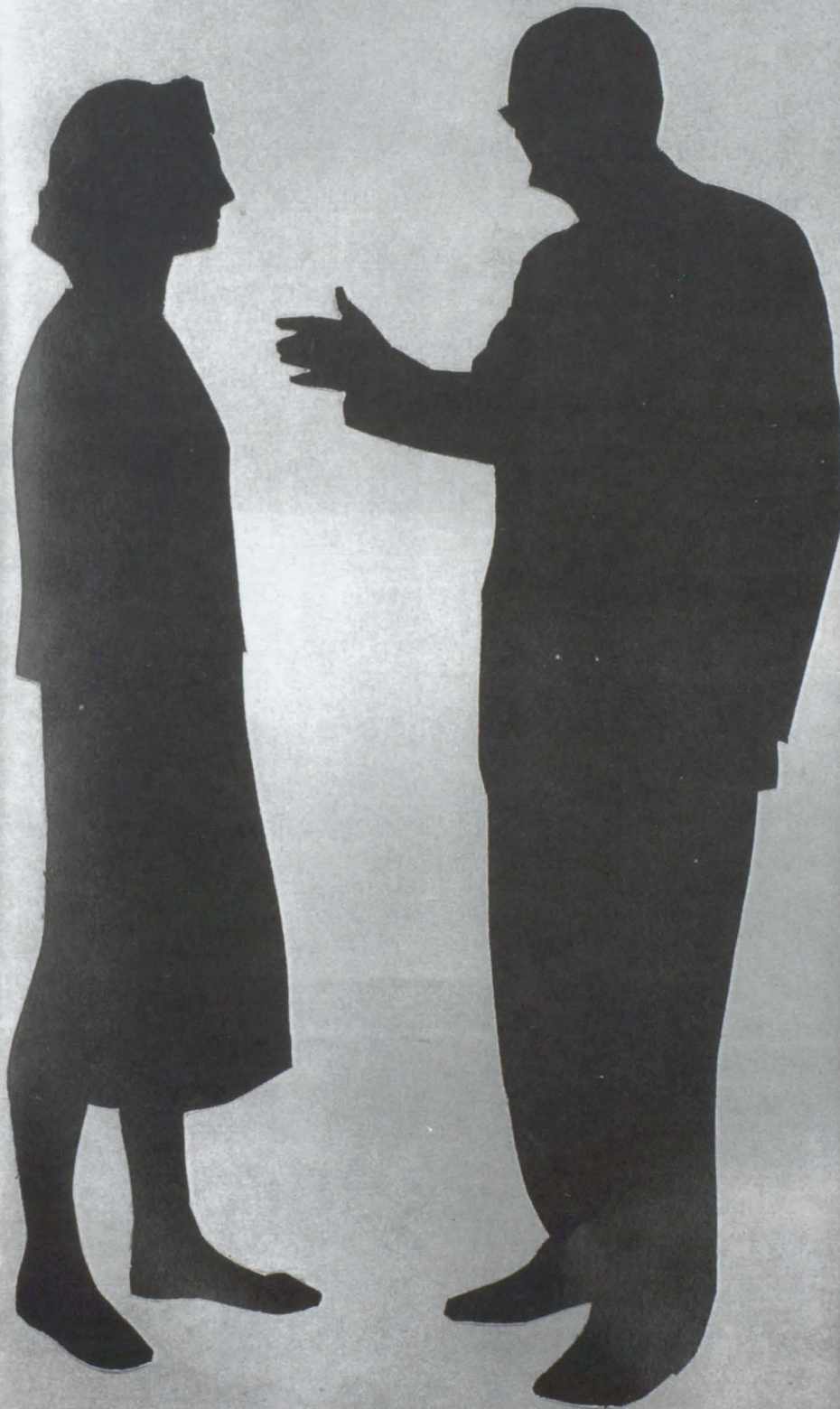

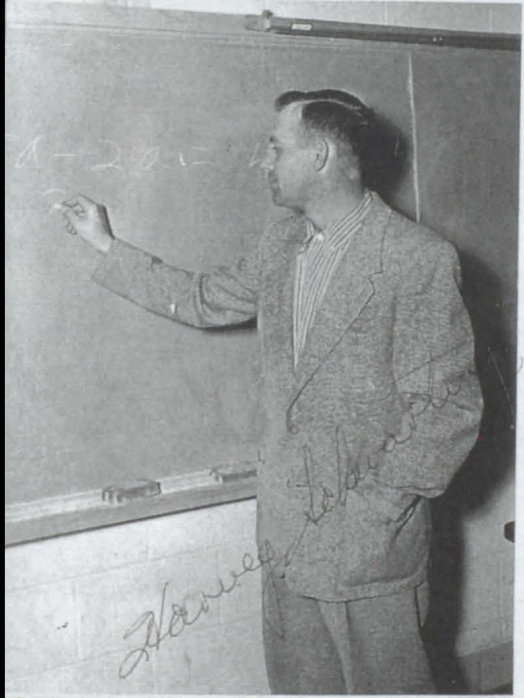


Mr. Johnson teaches all business courses offered at Wagner High. They include Typing I and II, bookkeeping, and shorthand.

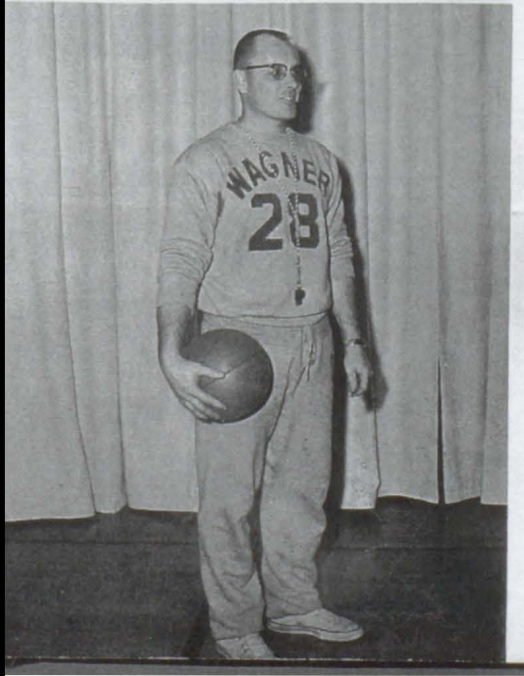


Mr. Schwarting sets up an equation for one of his two algebra classes. He also teaches two geometry classes and high school boys' physical education.

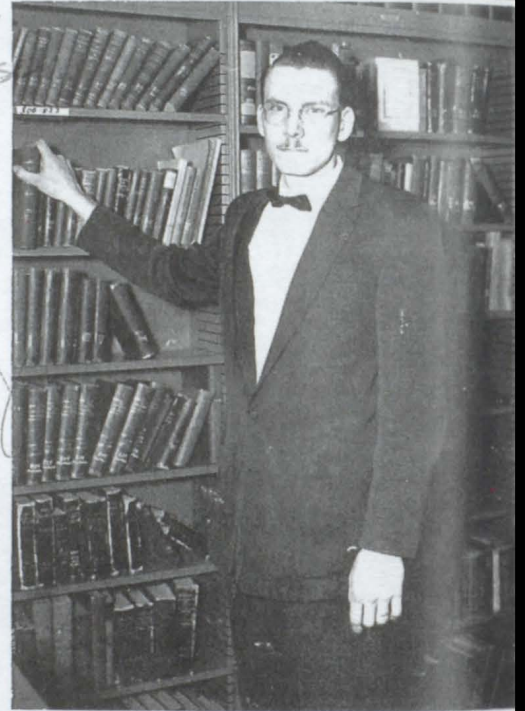
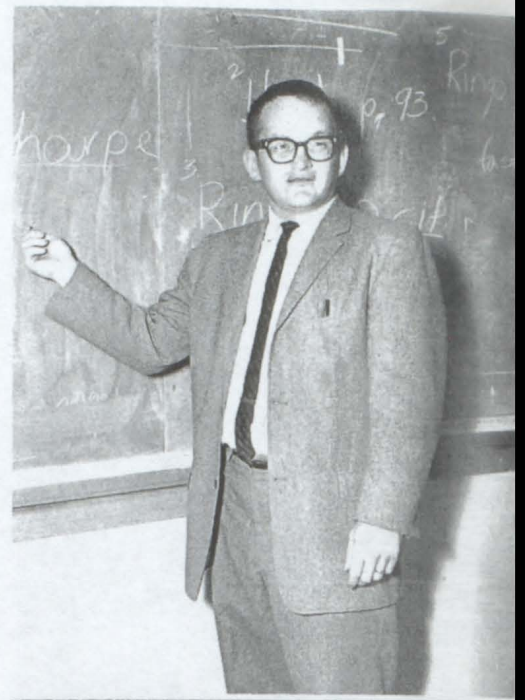

Walt Denker and Leo Anderson are the two janitors responsible for the neat appearance of Wagner High.





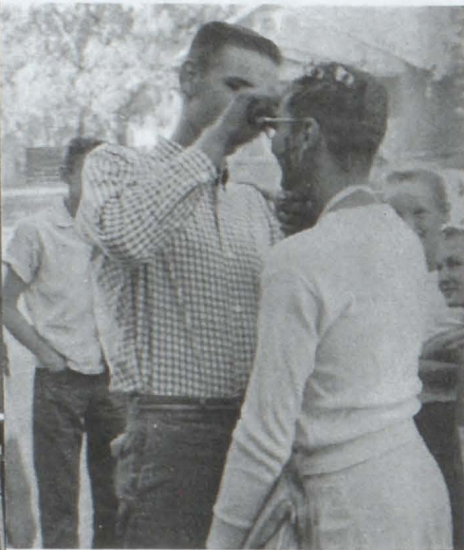


## activities

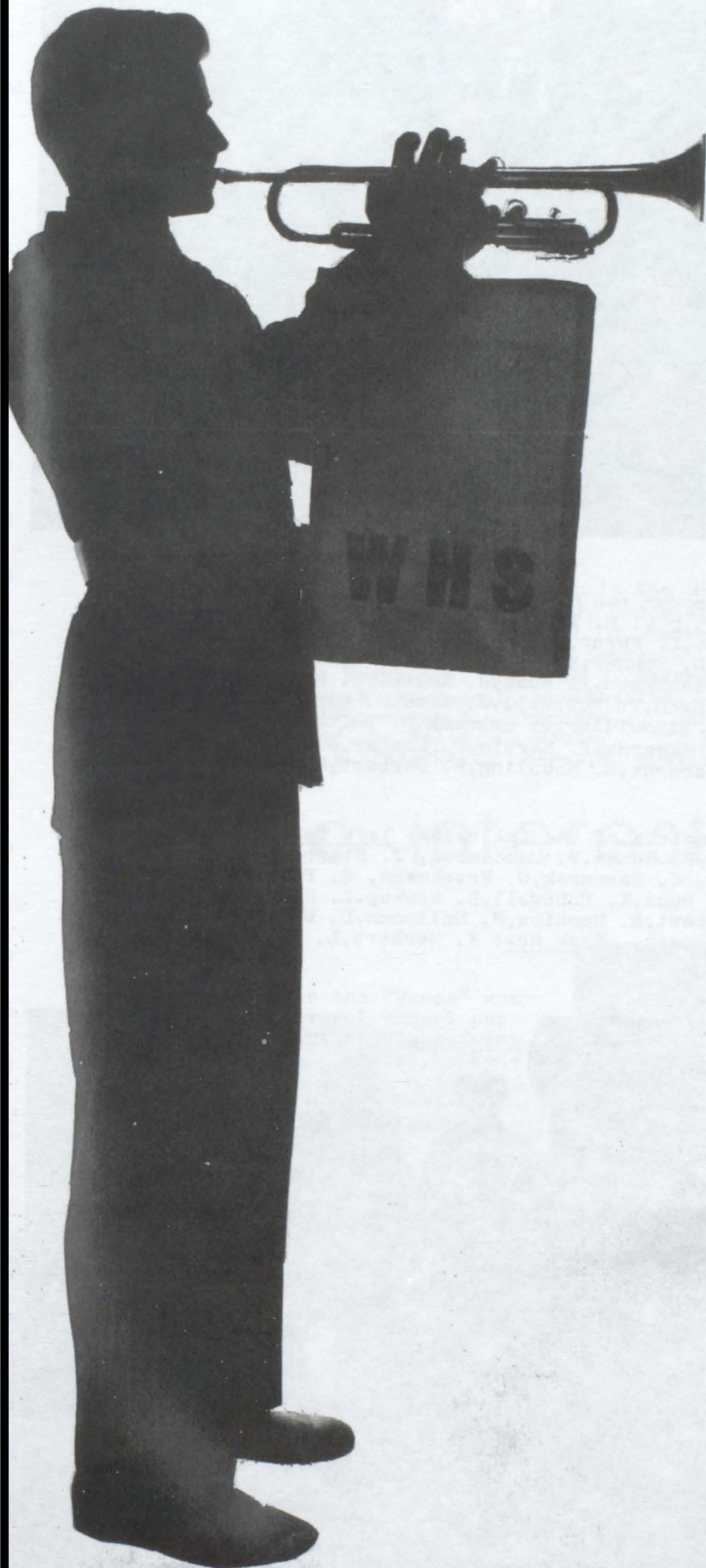

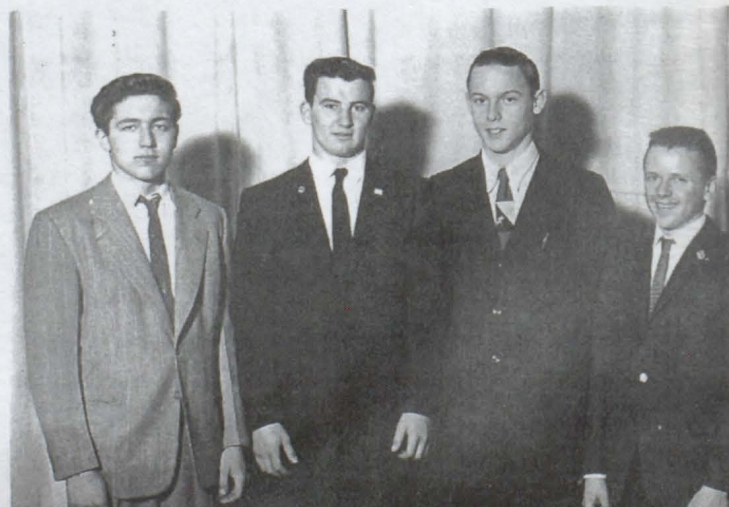

## raiders win conference title

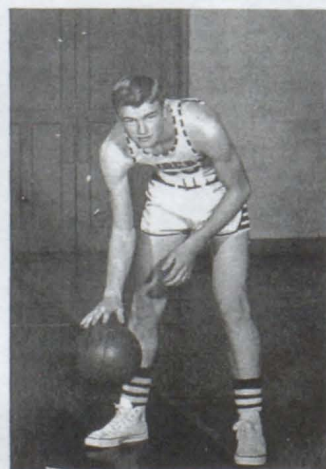
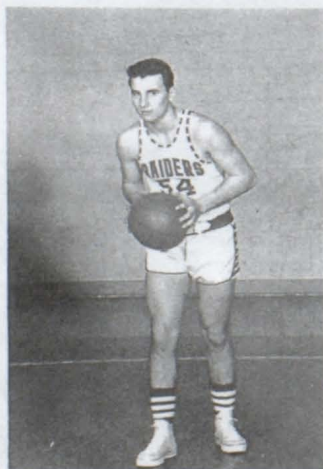

The Raiders lost in the second round of the conference tourney against a powerful Armour team. However the Red Raiders took all the conference games to win the Fort Randall title. The season ended with a 15-9 record. The district tournament games had Wagner heading for top honors all the way into the final round.
