
ADMINISTRATION KEPT BUSY AT WHS






ENLARGED FACULTY TEACHES STUDENTS










HOMECOMING BIG EVENT AT WHS





RAIDERS WIN C.MD TOURNEY

The Wagner High School Raiders won the CMD tourney, were District 27 runner-up, and tied for first in the CMD Conference. The Raiders were also rated as one of the top ten teams in the state by the AP Poll. The Raiders compiled a record of 20 wins against only 6 losses. The team, composed of two seniors, three juniors, and seven sophomores, became one of the potential power houses in South Dakota class "B" basketball. Playing in three benefit games, the Raiders lost to the number three and ten rated teams respectively and won one over Menno. The Raiders won their first seven games in a row before dropping their first decision. In conference tourney history, the Raiders became the second team to win the tourney; defeating Geddes, Lake Andes, and Delmont to do so. In District 27 action the Raiders won over Lake Andes, and Ravinia before being edged out by Armour in the finals. Under one of the most highly regarded coaches in the state, Coach Wiblemo led his team to state wide fame.



FOOTBALL TEAM HAS 3-4 RECORD


