Mr. Nedved returned to Wagner to teach Economics Socialogy and American History. He assisted in coaching Football and Basketball, and advising the Senior Class.


Miss Moody's classes includes General Science, Biology, and Physics. She is advisor for the Nurses' Club and the Junior Class.







After defeating Bonesteel to receive first honors in the Region 7 contest, the Wagner Red Raiders continued to the State "B" tourney held in Huron.



Our congratulations to the Red Raiders Coach Wiblemo, assistant coaches Mr. Fuller and Mr. Nedved, and the student managers for a job well done.


