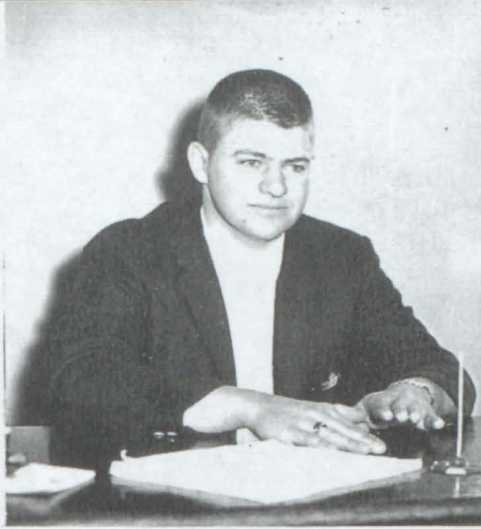

In his fifth year Mr. Wiblemo has been the Guidance Counselor, Assistant Football Coach, and head coach for Basketball and Track.

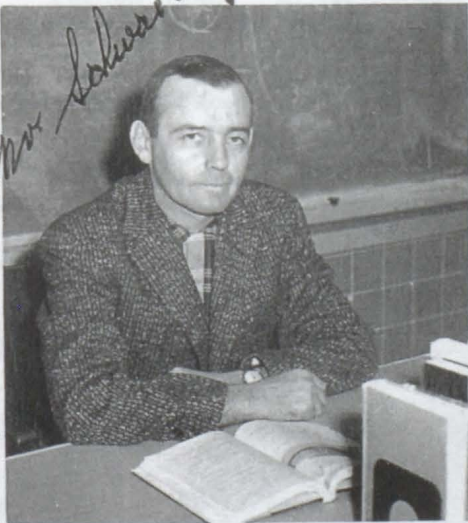
SUPPLYING THE CUES

In Home Economics, Miss Nemer has under her supervision three classes. She has successfully led the FHA and advised the Junior Class.

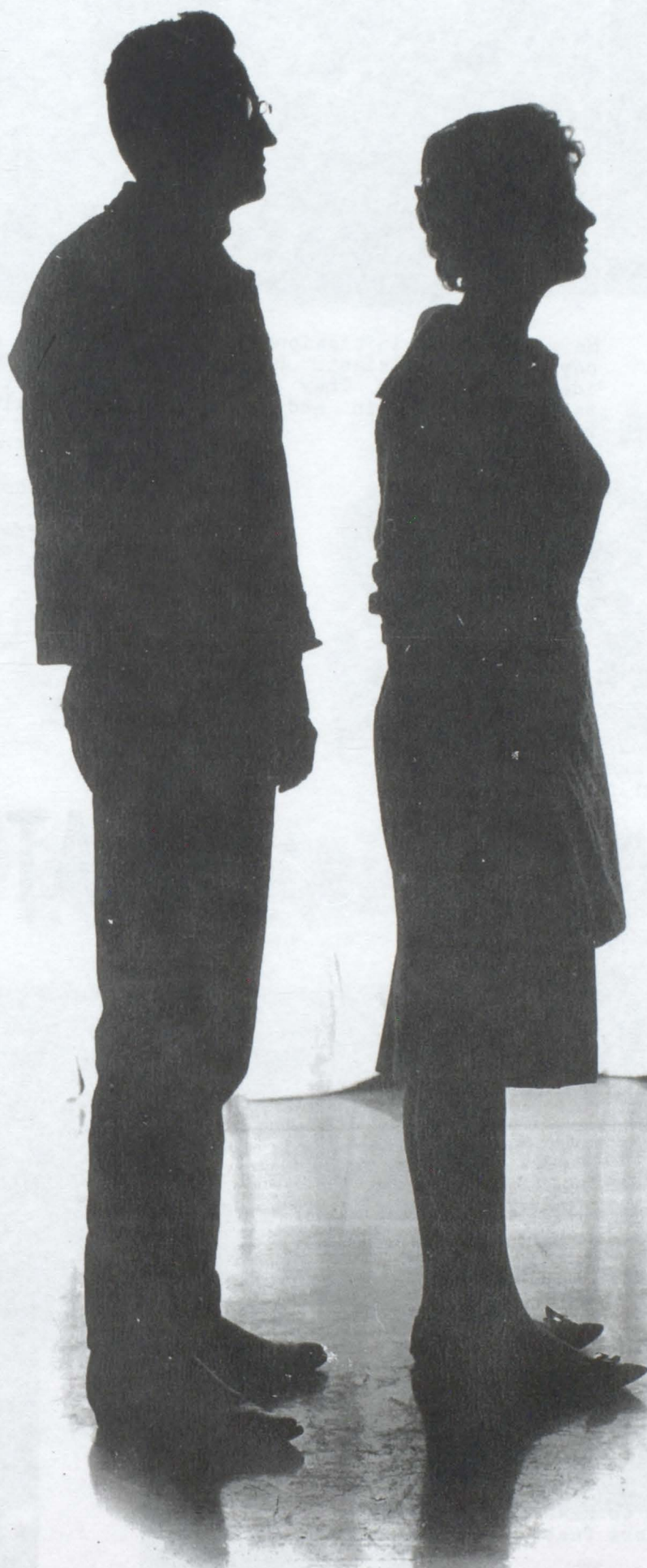
Mr. Warren is the director of instrumental and vocal groups. In addition to giving private lessons, he teaches grade school music.
