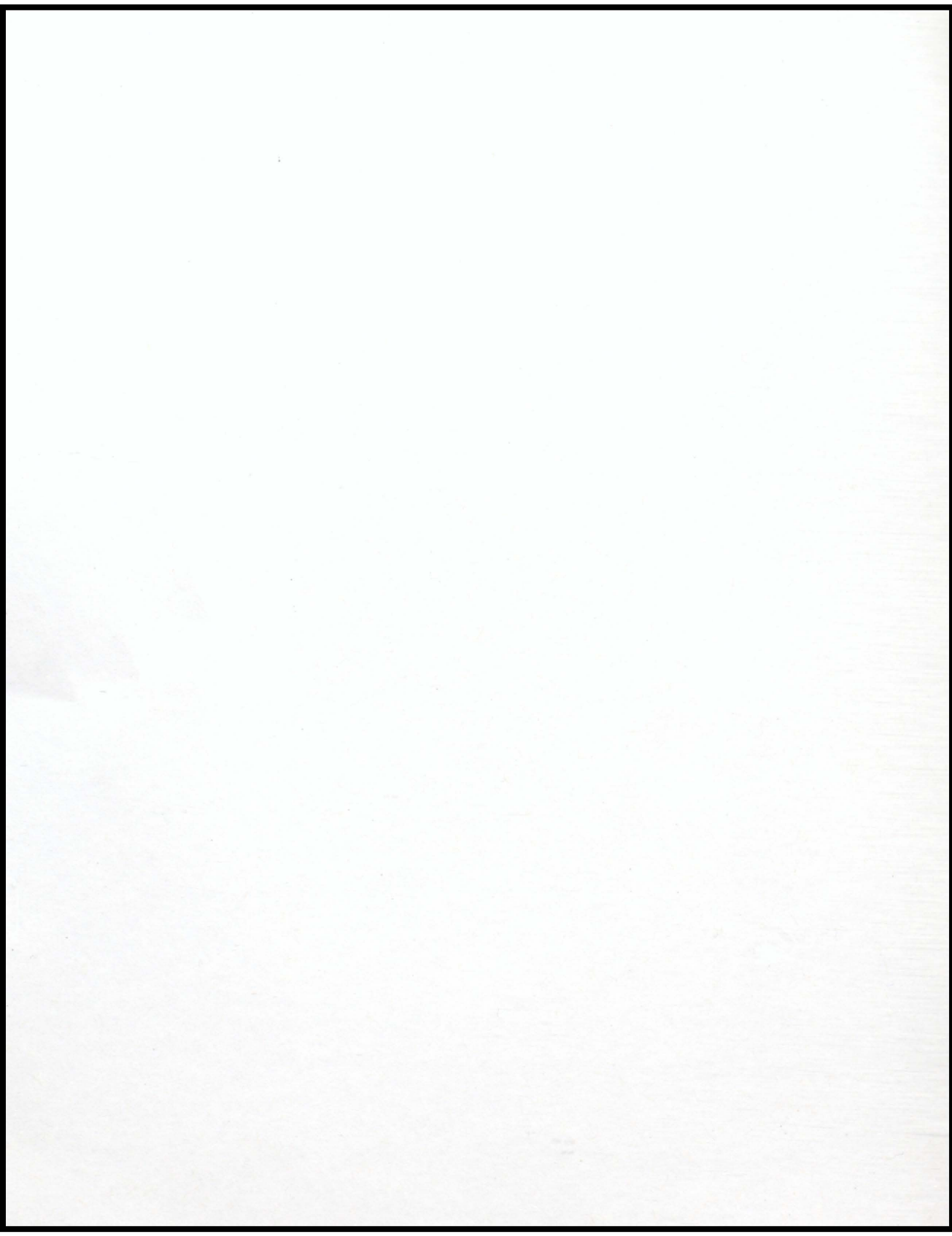
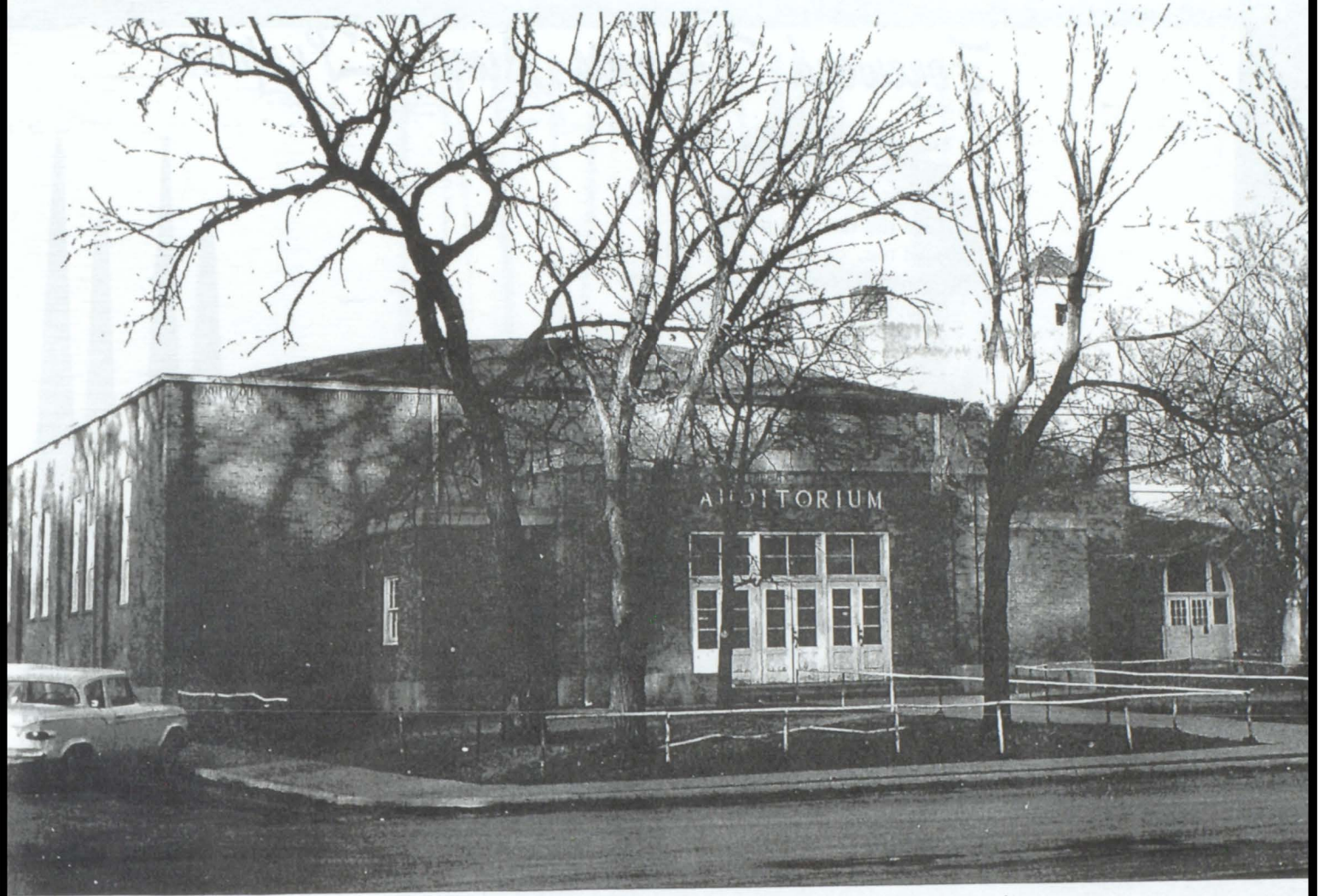

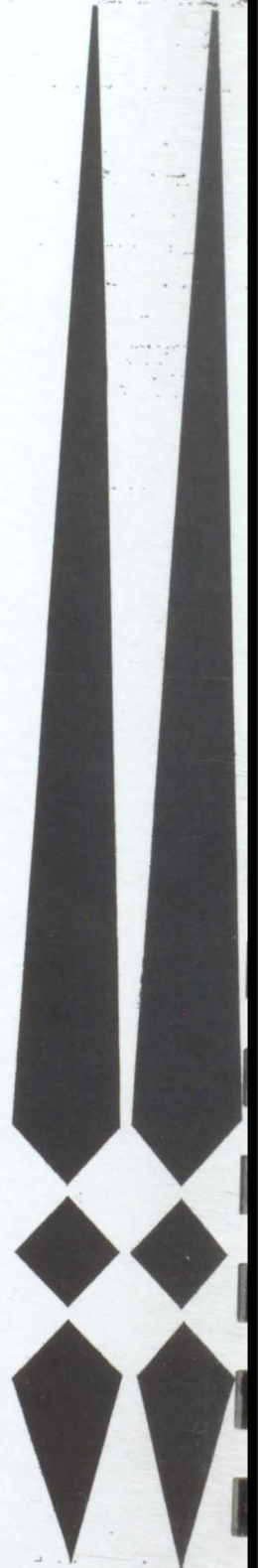
Foreword Presents Aims, Purposes

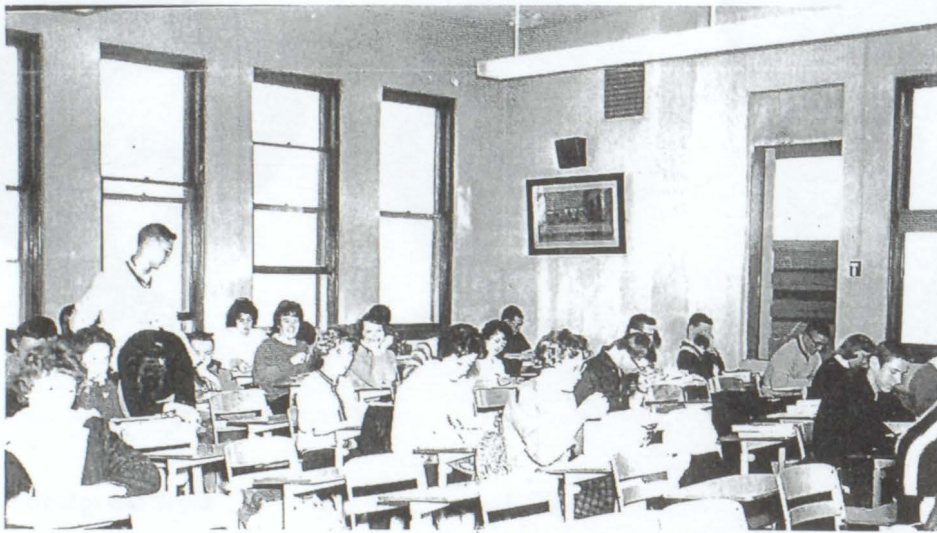




The English I class is shown hard at work posing for their picture for the annual.

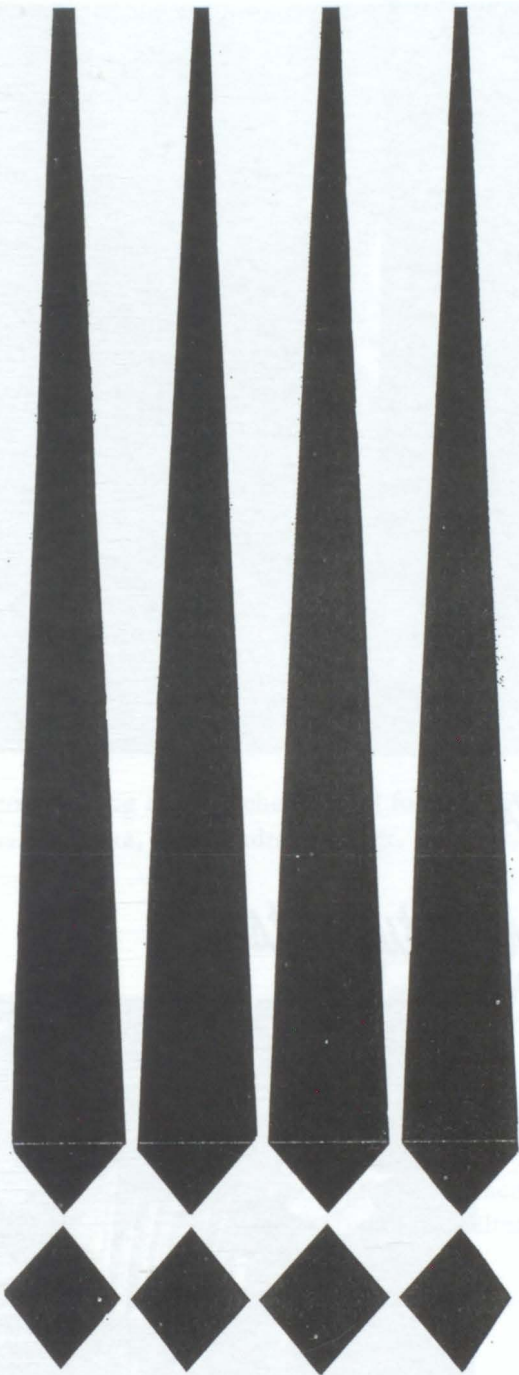
This 6th period study hall appears to be concentrating on their mountains and mountains of schoolwork. However, this is not always the case!

The biology class is busy studying dissecting procedures in preparation for a lab. During their lab periods the biology students dissected such things as frogs, worms, and crayfish.

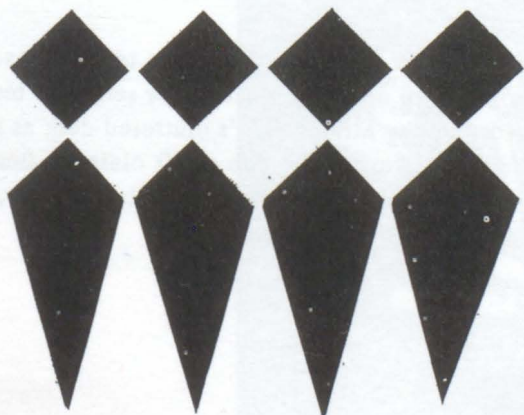

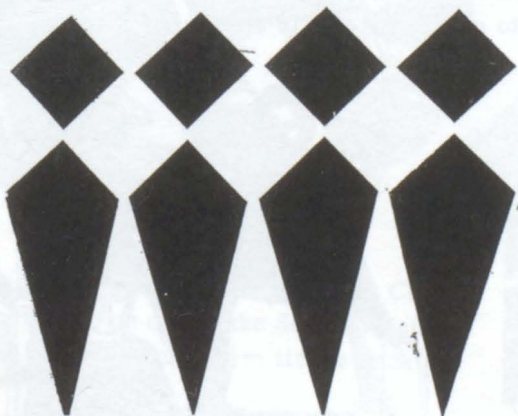

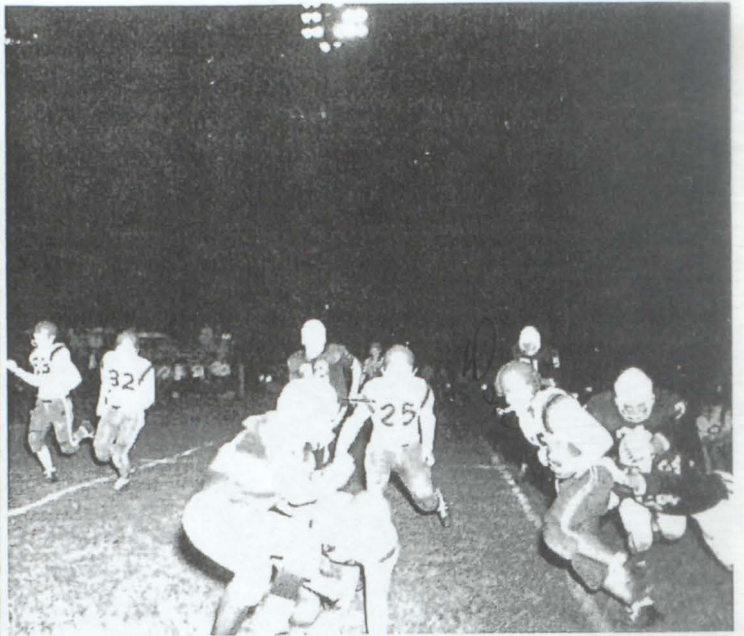

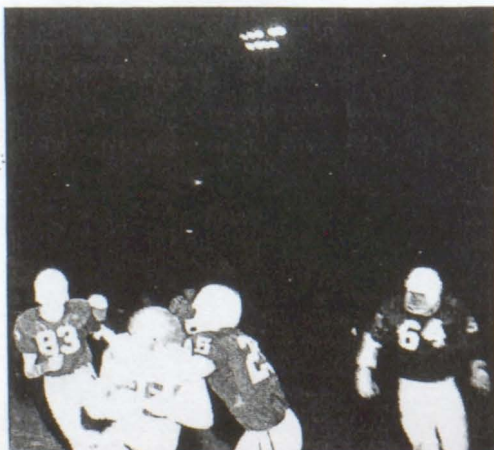


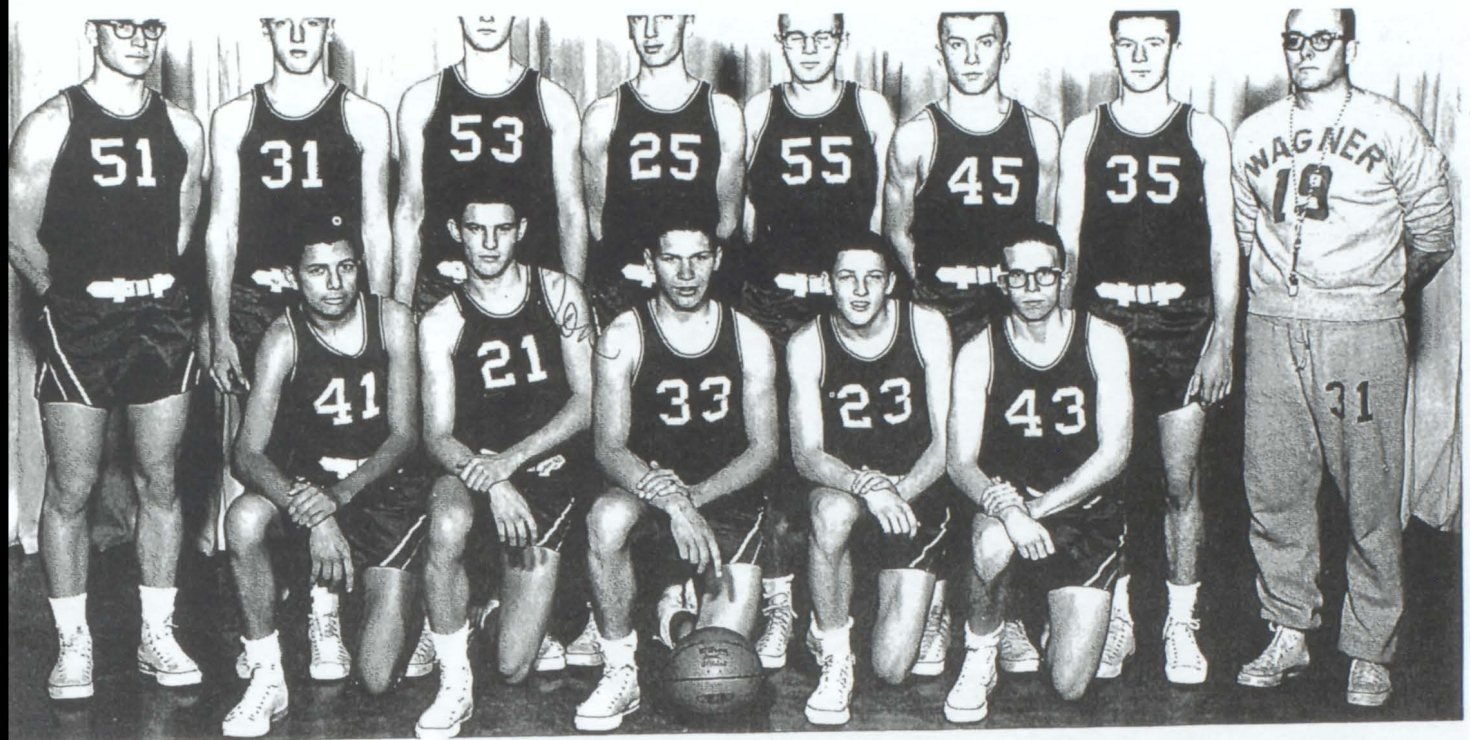

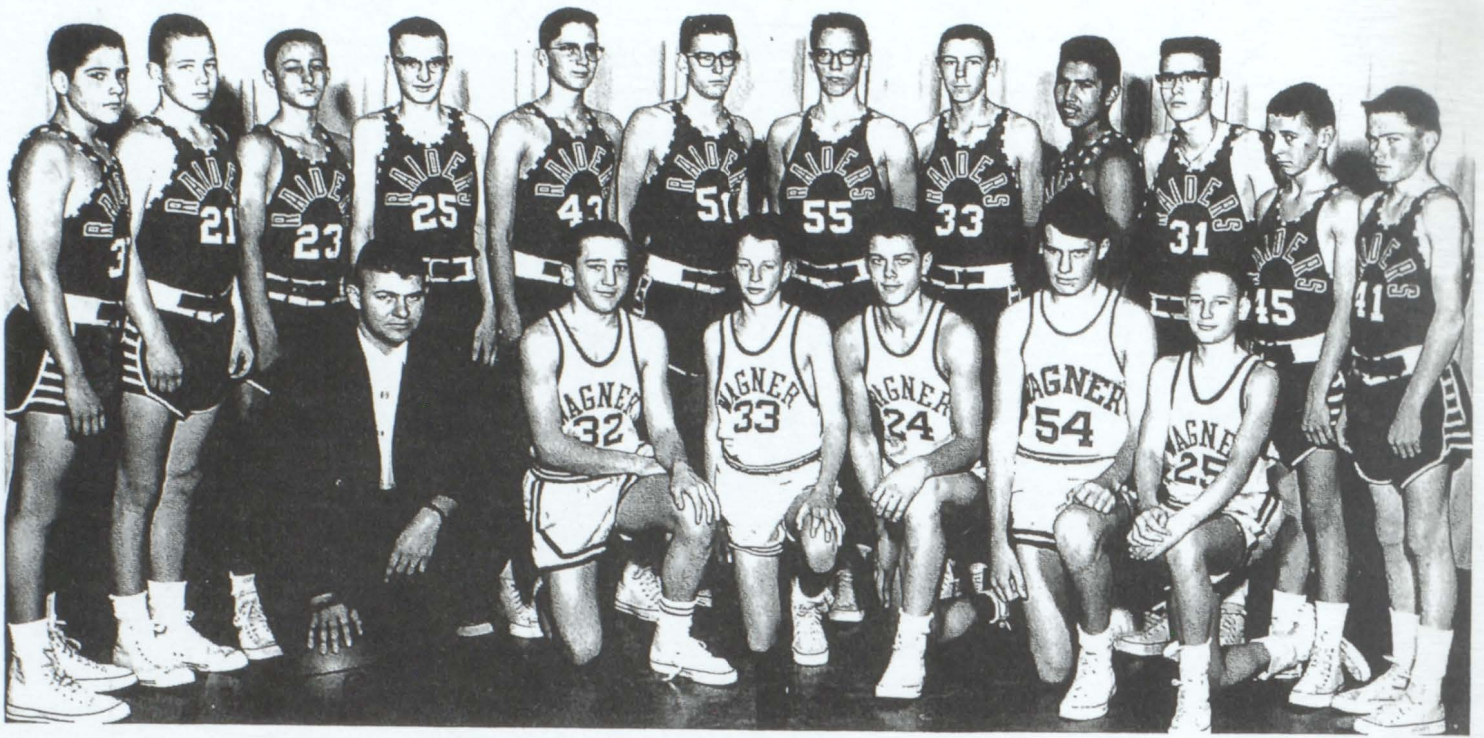

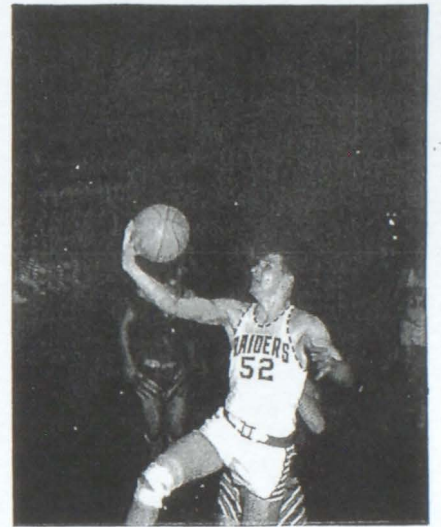


The picture at the right shows Wagner's Gordon Mattis easily outjumping an Armour player to gain possession for the Raiders.



Coming across the half line Gordon Mattis passes up court and sets up an offensive play for the Raiders.

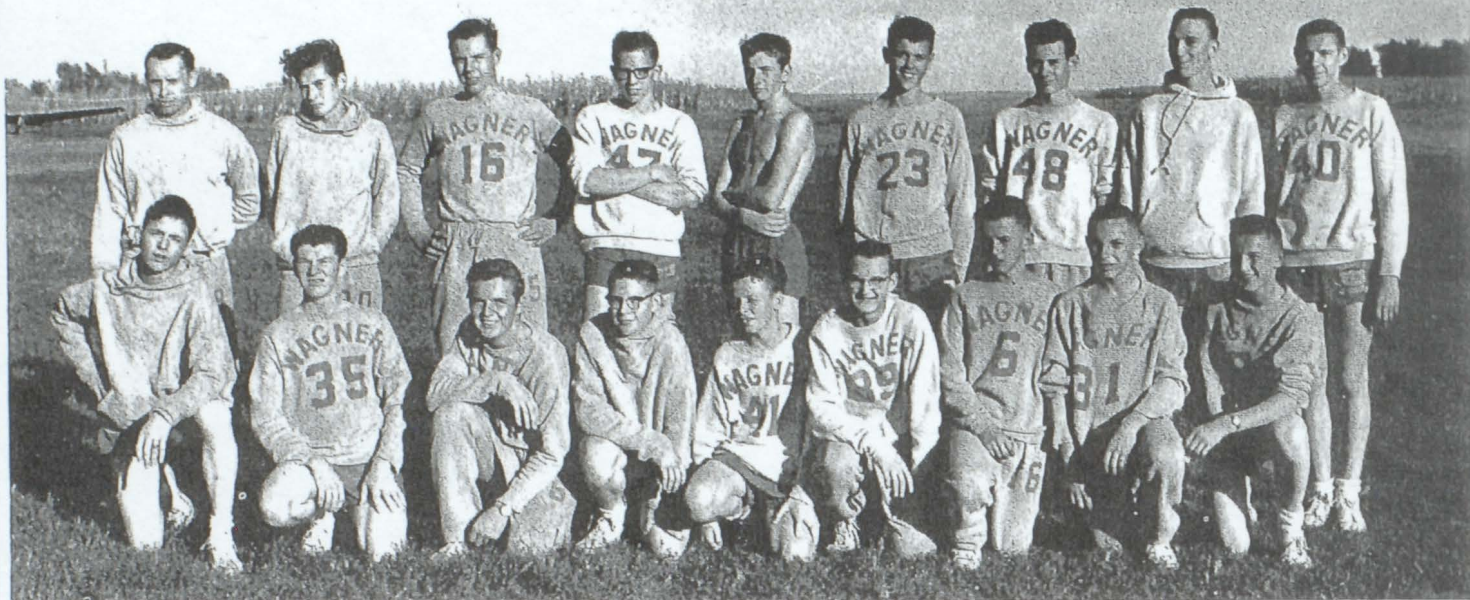
