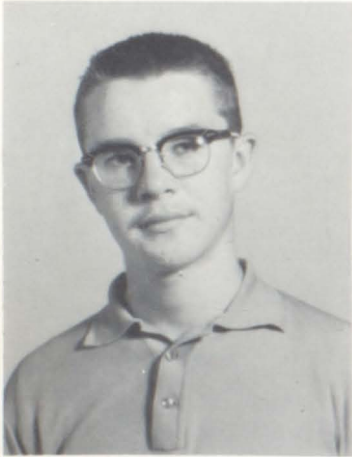


This English II is a good example of the studious classes held at Wagner High School. These attentive students studied grammar, literature, and speech this year.
