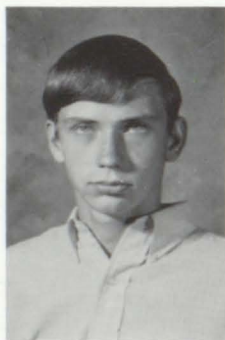
Juniors March On
