Payer, Judy Link, and Cheri Rezac, Dave Birger, Bruce Martin, and Neil Martin as servers for their prom.



A strong defense, ball control offense, and a nevergive-up attitude by the players provided the ingredients for a successful football season.







the class flower; light blue and dark blue as the class colors; and the class motto: "Yesterday is experience; tomorrow is hope; today is getting from one to the other as best we can."




