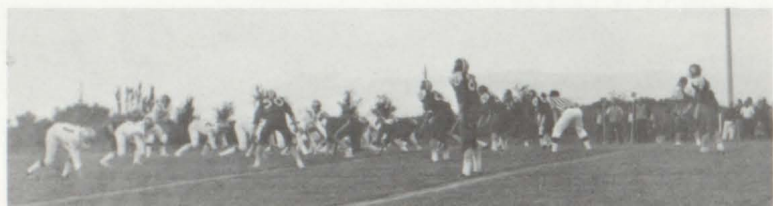

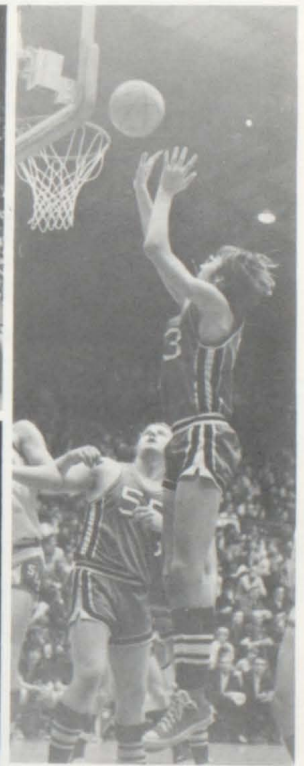

This year's State B Basketball Tournament saw Wagner's Red Raiders still in action, but did not come about effortless, for both District and Region play proved some tough competition.

Losing the first game to Salem left Wagner in the running only for the last four places. The second game proved fatal also, Sully Buttes upending Wagner by 37 points. Wagner placed 7th by winning their last game (Leola) by one point.

The Red Raiders of East Charles Mix, under Coach Bich and Assistant Coach Hoff, ended a successful season with twenty wins and seven losses. Using their scrappy defense and offensive teamwork, the Raiders won berth to the State "B's", placed first in the S.E.S.D. conference, third in the L.M.V.C. conference, and first in the Fort Randall Holiday Tournament.

In tournament play, Bich's Raiders had to win four games to enter state competition. The first victory came with Avon (ranked 10th in the season's last poll). Wagner took a decisive 17 point win over the team that had looked to be the biggest obstacle. An added effort was used to defeat Tyndall by one point in an overtime championship game.

Region play at Winner saw Wagner meeting Andes Central and St. Francis. "Red" had beaten Andes twice earlier in the season by small margins. Wagner again beat them, this time by six points. St. Francis defeated Stickney, leaving the two teams to decide who would travel to Sioux Falls.

The championship game with St. Francis showed a lot of physical contact all the way to the buzzer. The clock ticked to a halt that had Wagner ahead by seven points. For the third time in Wagner High history, it would be represented in the State Tournament.

The Senior Wrestlers did a very fine job this year. Our squad will miss them much with eight out of the starting twelve graduating. They had a good season this year and everyone was very proud of them with a record of 8-4-1. Their first tournament was in Beresford where the Raiders placed second as a team and placed seven wrestlers. Their next tournament was the SESD conference where they placed second as a team with L. Carda 2nd, K. Andersh 3rd, D. Payer 1st, D. Blaha 2nd, D. Blaha 1st, M. Bastemeyer 1st. They went to Freeman for the District Tourney where they again took second as a team with ten Raiders taking home medals and earning the right to wrestle in the Regional Tournament. They were L. Carda, A. Peters, D. Payer, placing 1st; K. Andersh and D. Blaha 2nds; J. Robertson, D. Blaha, M. Bastemeyer 3rds; and J. Soukup and T. Otte 4ths. In the Regionals the Raiders placed 3rd as a team sending 7 wrestlers to represent Wagner in the State Tournament in Mitchell. They were D. Payer 1st, A. Peters, L. Carda, and D. Blaha with 2nds, K. Andersh and D. Blaha 3rd, and J. Robertson 4th. They put on a good show at State with A. 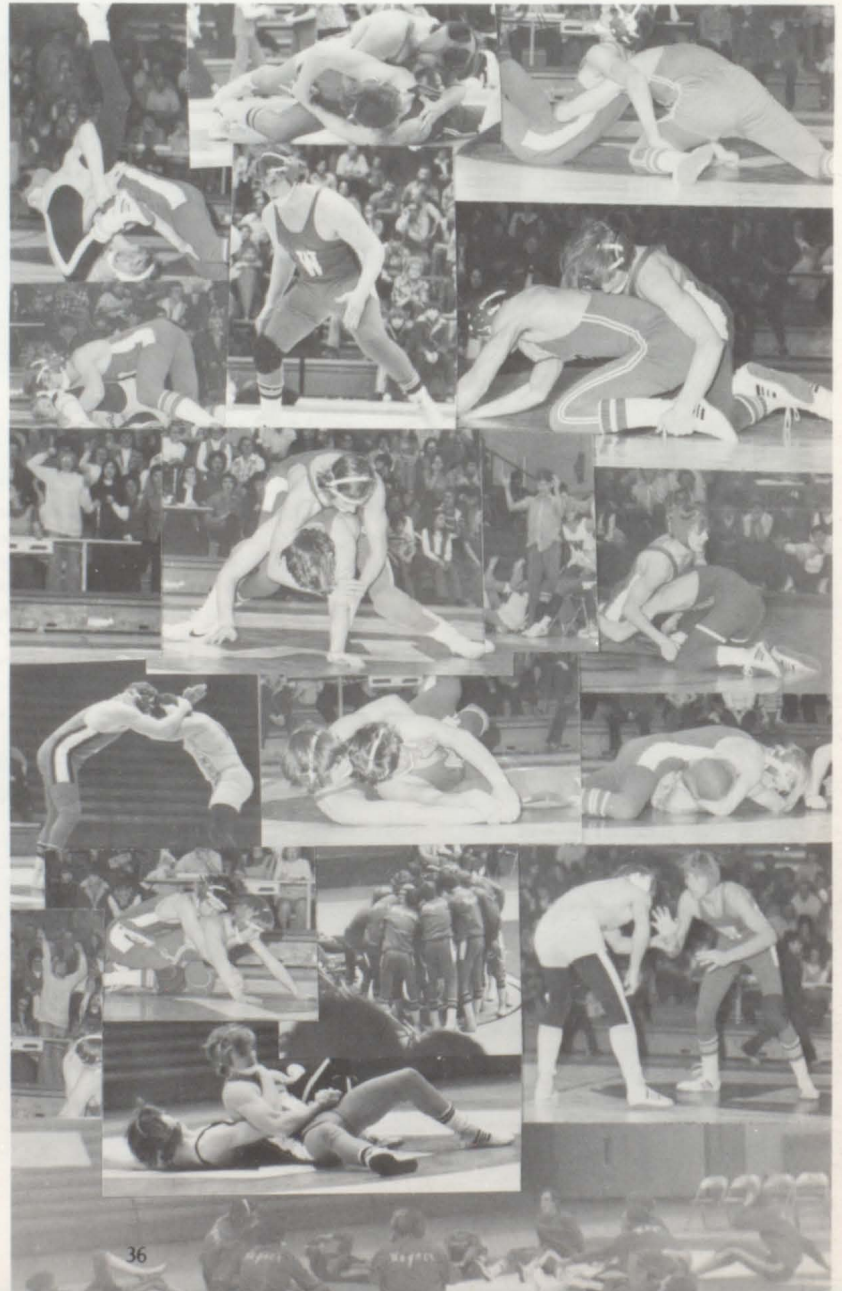

Wagner placed first for the second year in a row in the LMVC Conference and second in the SEDS Conference. In the Regional Track Meet, Wagner's tracksters were short a mere 3 points from winning. Seven runners qualified for the State Track Meet at Rapid City. Larry Vesper: pole vault, high and low hurdles, high jump. Doug Blaha: medley relay. Dennis Blaha: medley relay and two mile relay. Dave Andersh: 880 yr. run, two mile relay. Kevin Carl: Medley relay. Gary Andersh: mile, medley relay, two mile relay. Mike McGuire: two mile run and two mile relay. Only Larry Vesper brought home points. He garnered 4 team points for third in the low hurdles and fifth in the pole vault.

Larry Vesper accounted for four records. He broke Phil Brookman's 10' 11½" record by jumping 12' in the pole vault. Larry also broke Neil Martin's record of 20.7 in the low hurdles by .3 of a second. A 15.6 second effort in the high hurdles tied Richard Doty's record. In the high jump, Larry reached 5' 10" which ties him with two other tracksters.

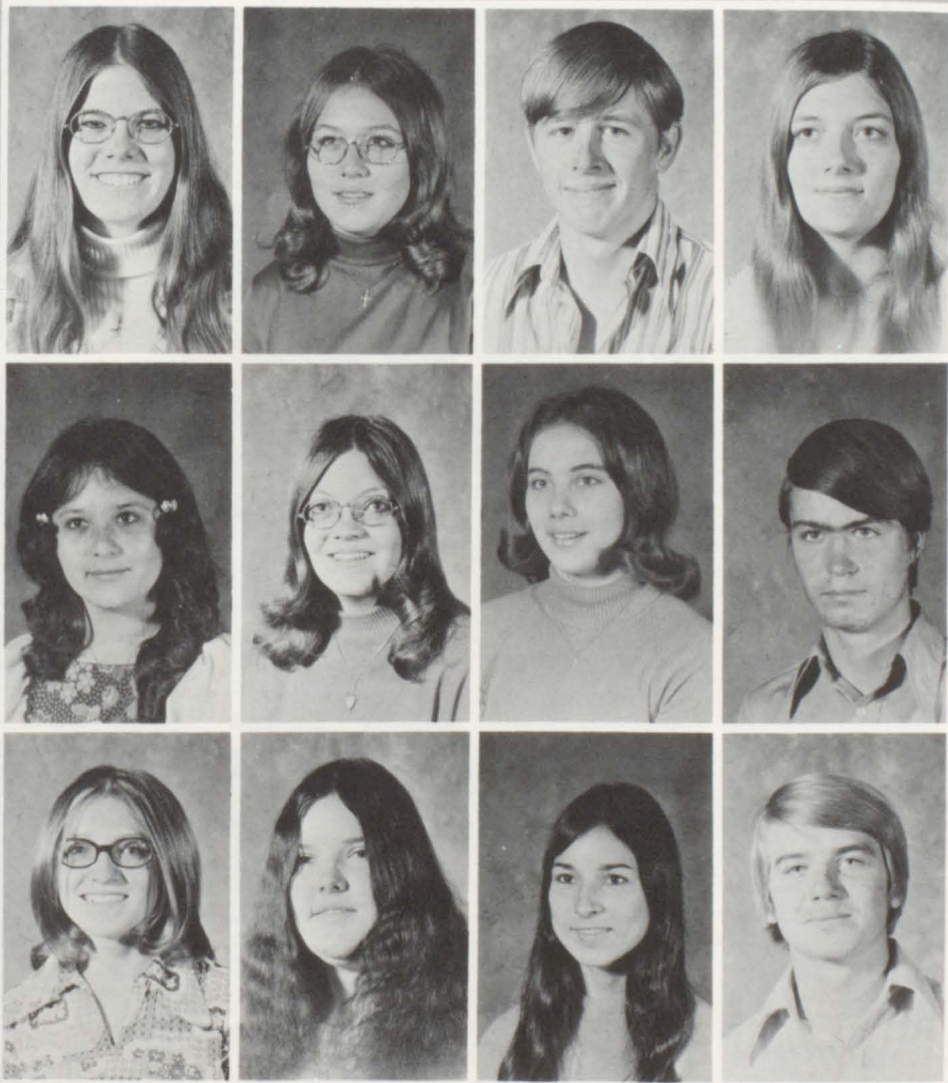
Juniors Keep on Truckin'

Although they were happy for the Senior Class, they were a little sad to see them go and a little scared to be taking their place.

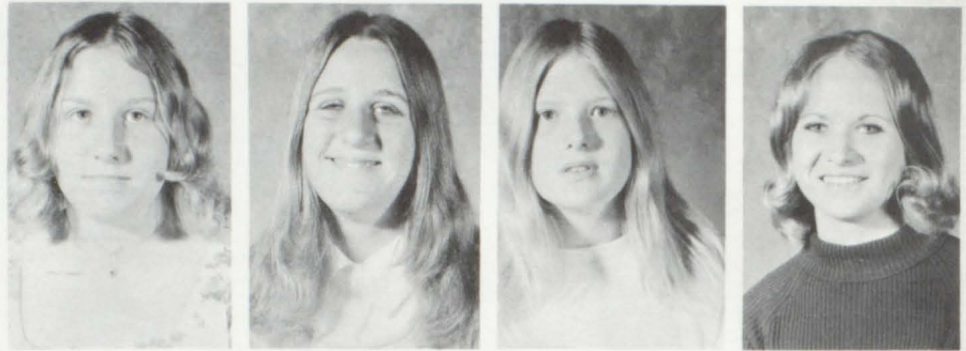
