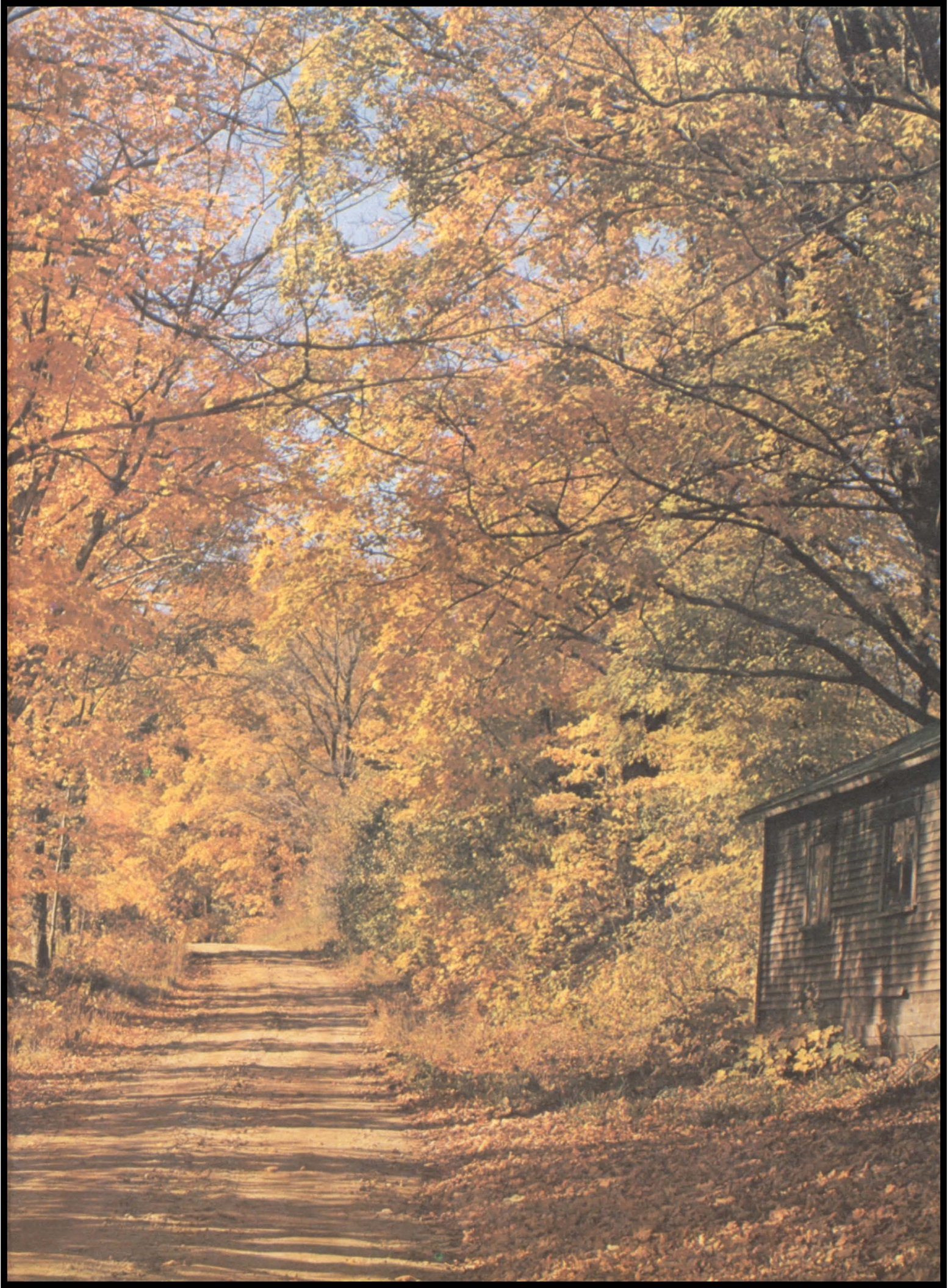

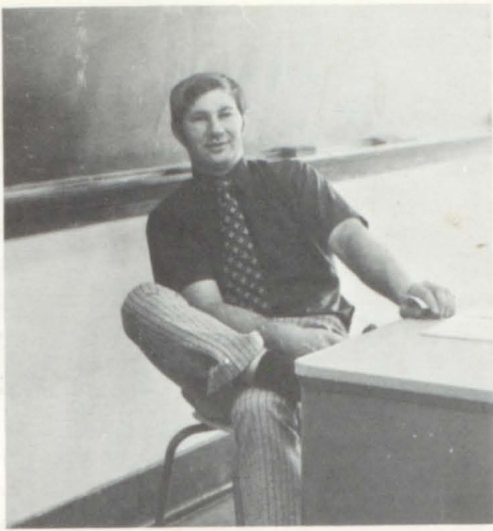




## PHASES OF MR. CARROLL'S DAYS
