Trojans Spoil Homecoming

The Raiders dropped their third game of the season in SESD Conference action to Parkston 22-6. Following a fumble by the Wagner offense at their own 25, the Trojans pushed across the first score when QB Brooks Goehring sneaked over from one yard out, Tim Konrad added the two-point conversion by sweeping the right side.

The Raiders were again forced to punt and the Trojan's Greg Boehmer dashed 30 yards to score on the drive. The extra point attempt was stopped and the score stood at-14-0.

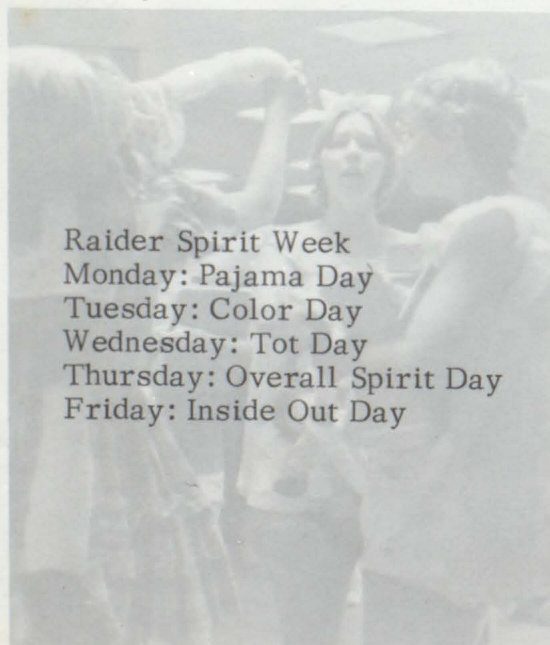
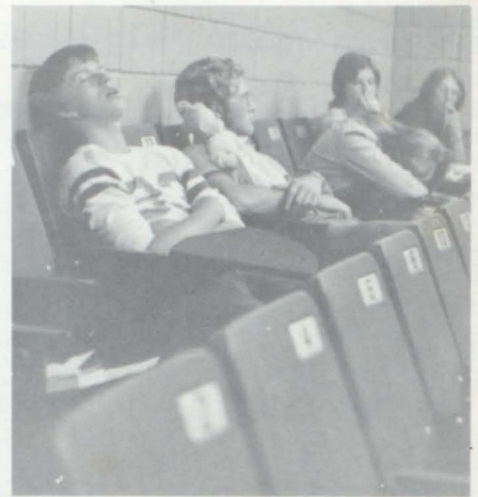
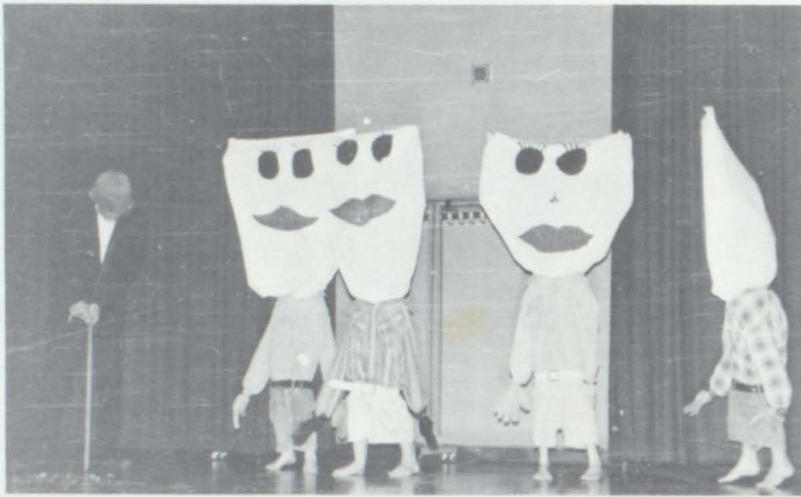
The Wagner offense got it together for a time as David Sully broke loose for a 42 yard run. The drive was halted and the half ended.

Early in the third quarter Dan Petrik picked off a Trojan screen pass attempt and raced 94 yards to pay dirt. The Parkston defense held on the extra point resulting in a 14-6 score. The fired-up Raider defense then recovered a Parkston fumble and moved the ball to a first and goal at the nine-yard line. Sully was injured and forced to leave the game on a run that took the ball to the two-yard line but three remaining plays failed to get the ball across.

Parkston scored again following a spectacular pass play from Geohring to Jay Heisinger, then a four-yard run by Rich Thuringer and the extra point by Heisinger. The score: 22-6. The game ended with both defenses forcing punts.

Defensively Roger Schroeder and Mark Cuka led the Raiders.

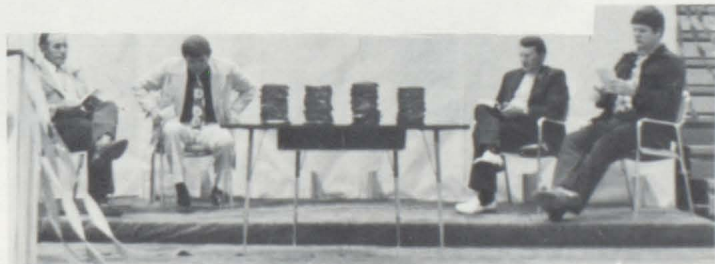
GRADUATION '77
