Celebrating With Mr. Bich

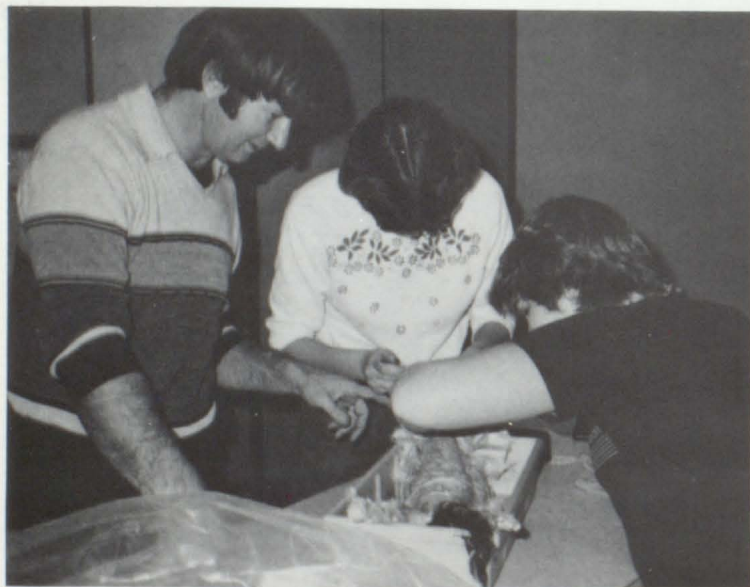

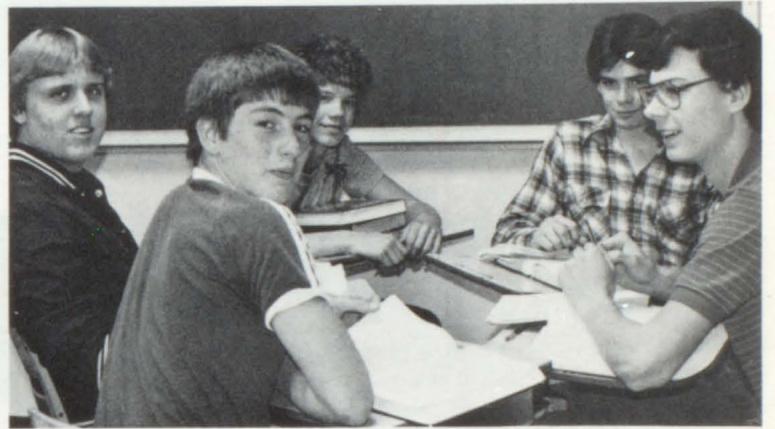

Principal Roger Wiltz has served our school for ten years as Principal. His job involves keeping the students in line and under control.

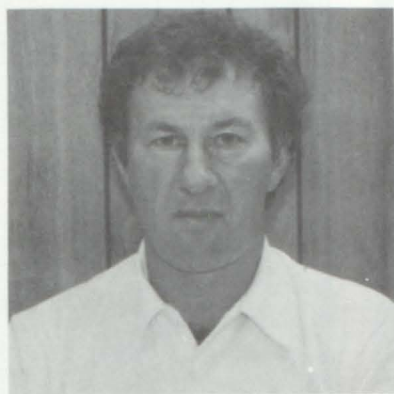

Support Staff Helps Students

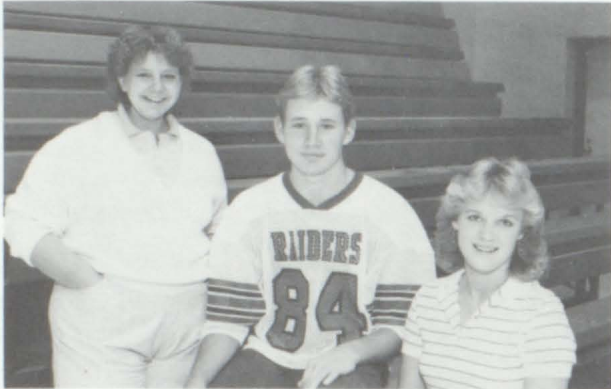

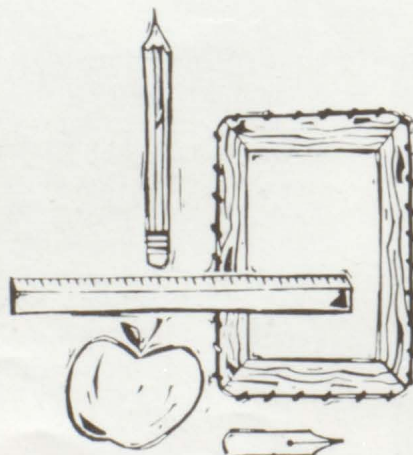
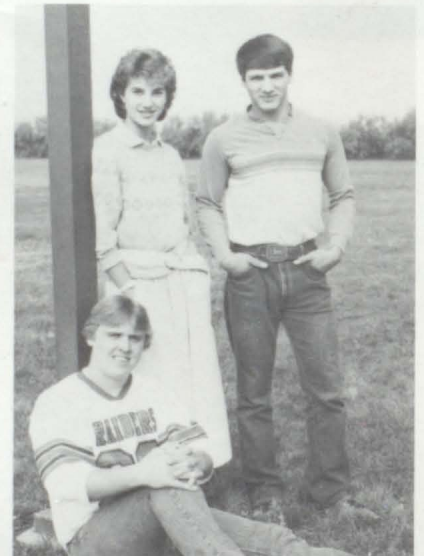

Juniors

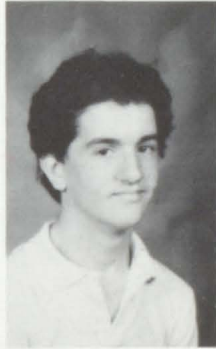

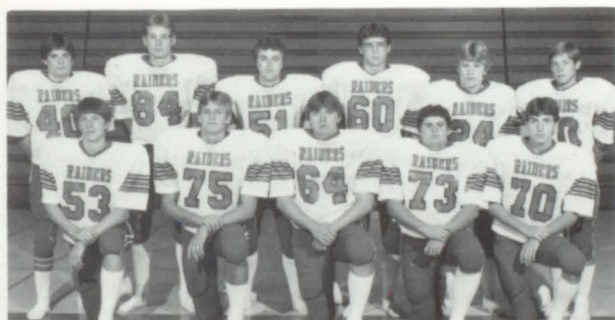

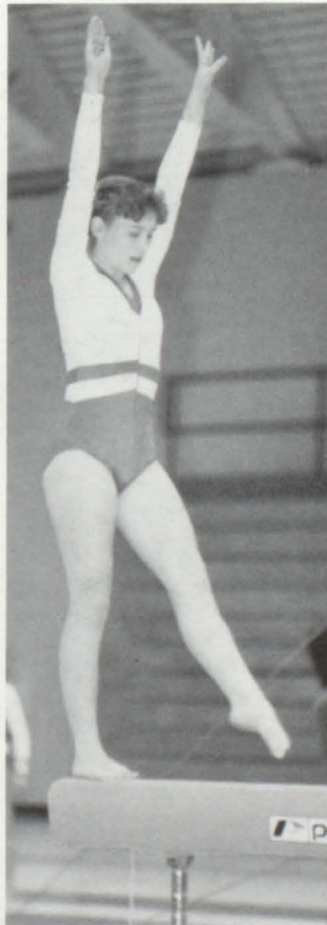

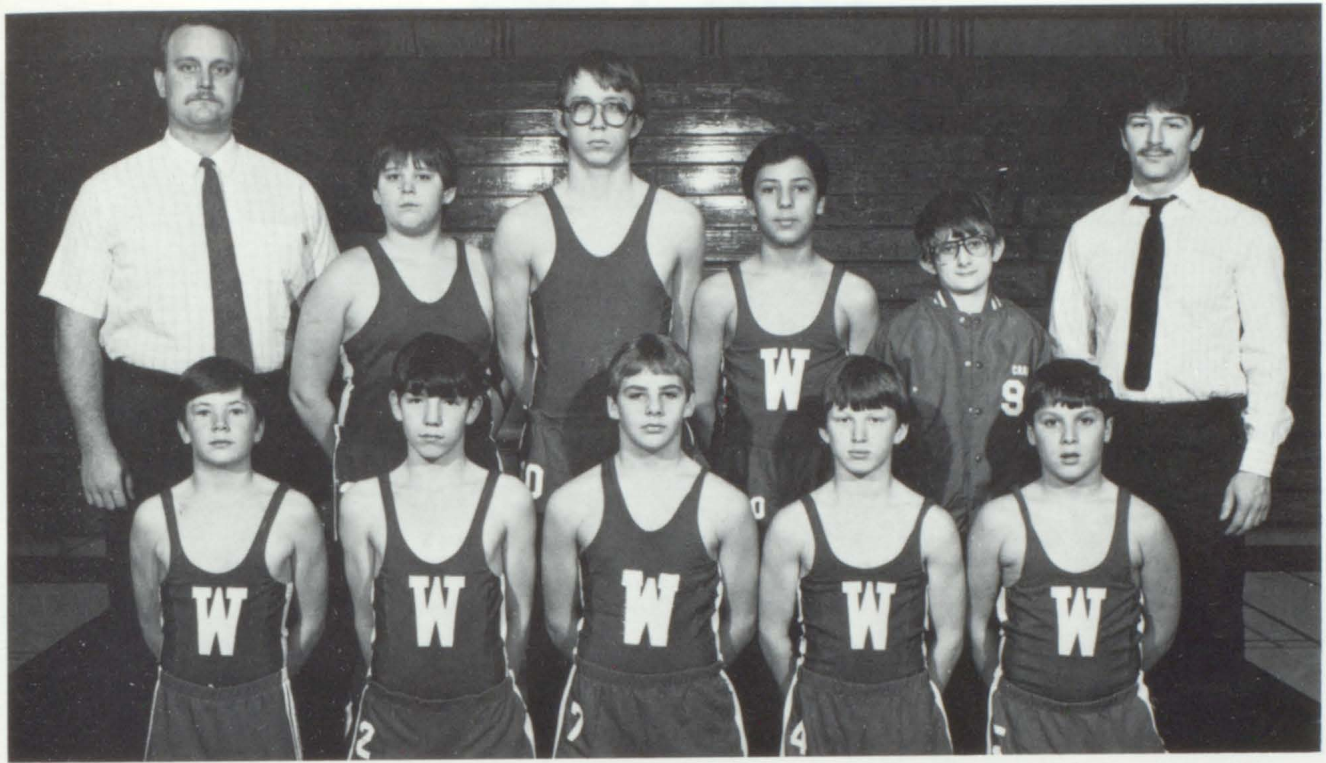

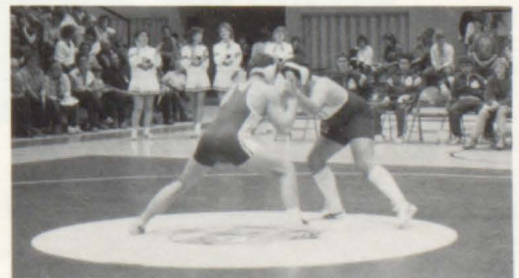

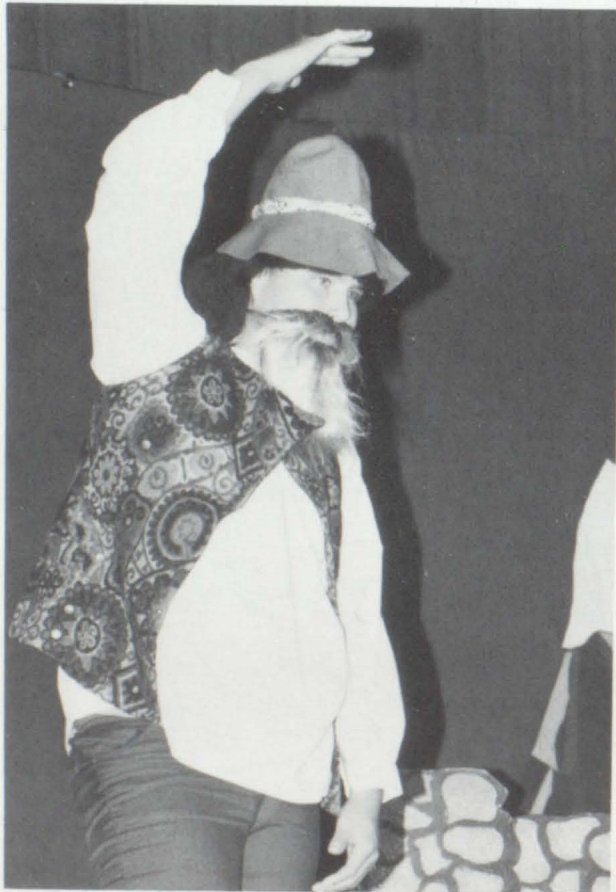


Jack And The Beanstalk

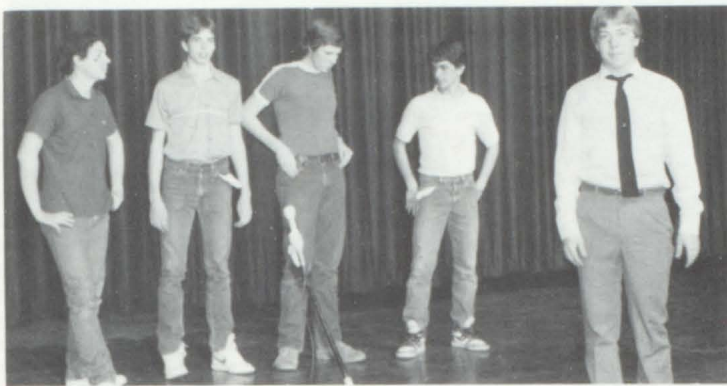
