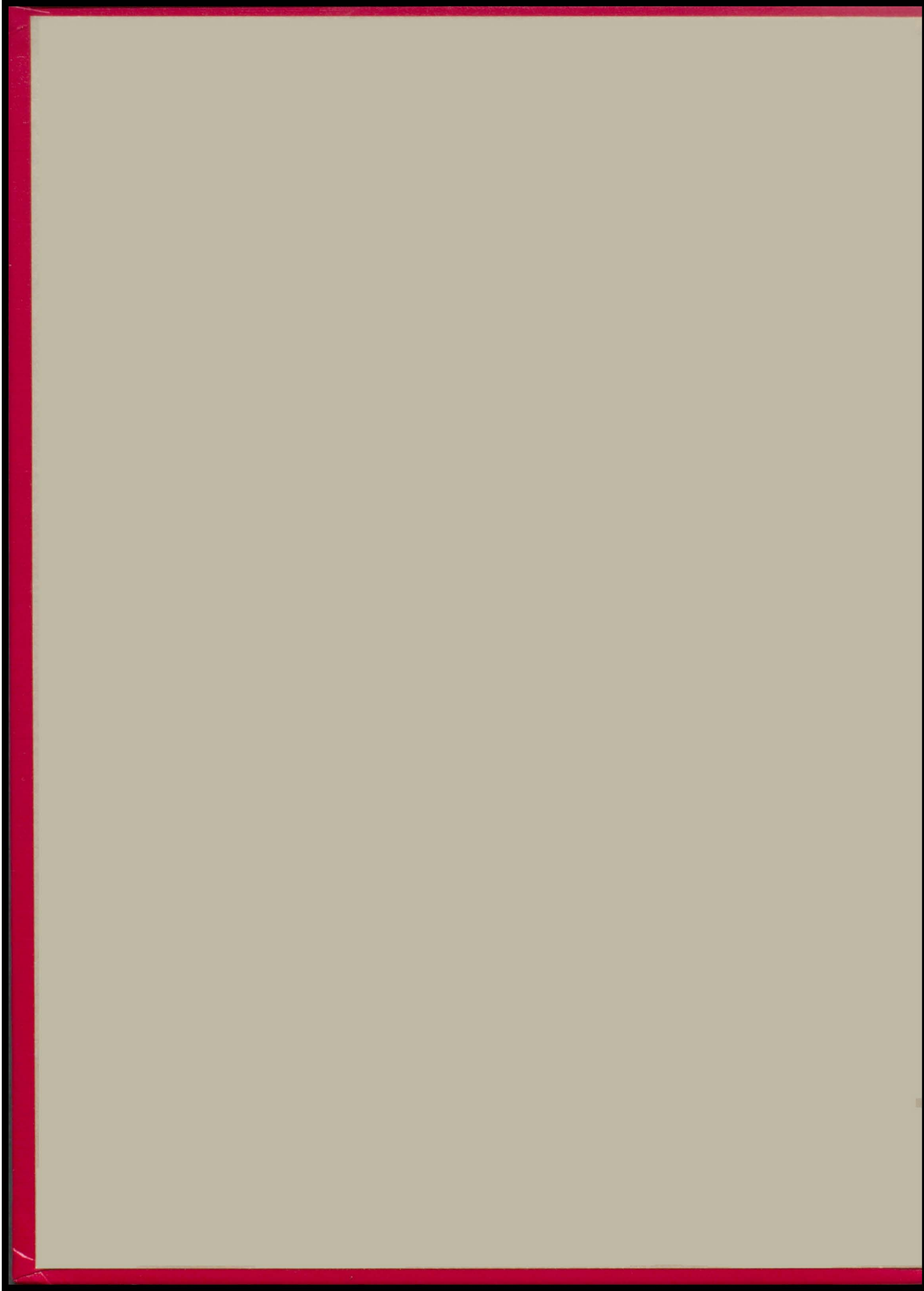

that,

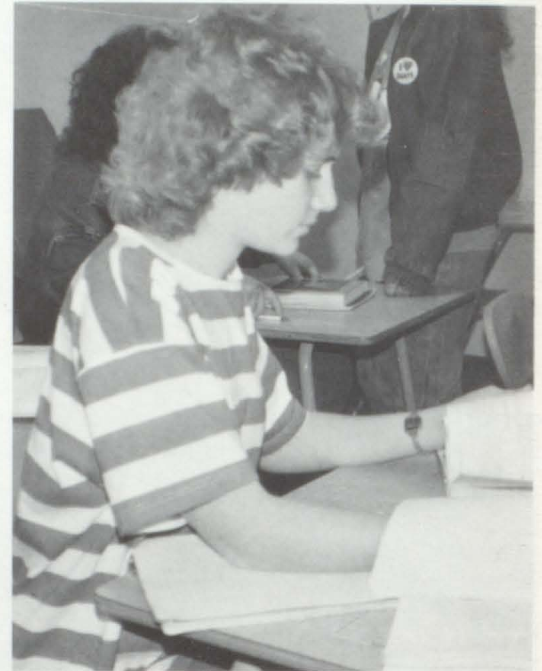
And it wasn't long before they were on the floors and mats.

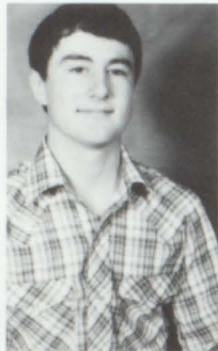
Sophomores

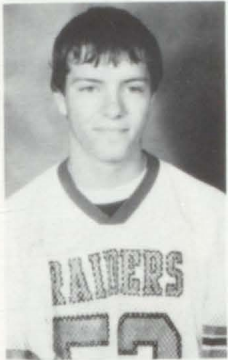

We would like to thank these people for the memories they have given us through our years at Wagner Community School.

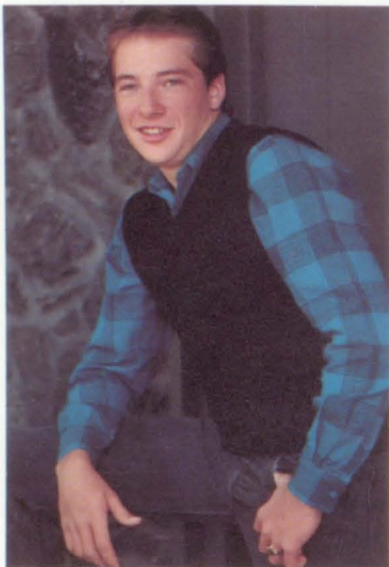

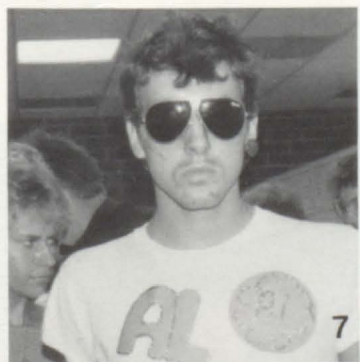
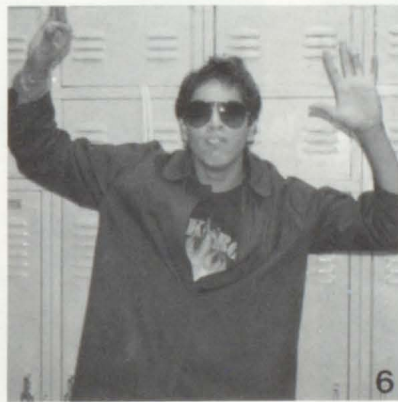

Many students are expanding their Spanish speaking ability by taking a new course, Spanish II.

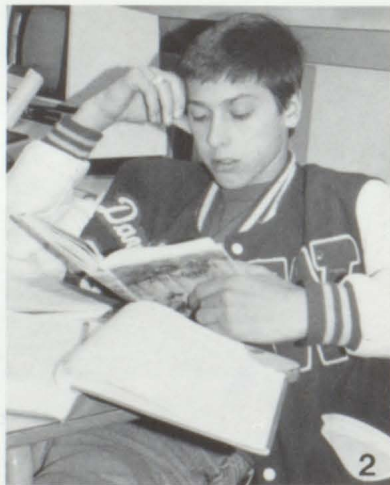

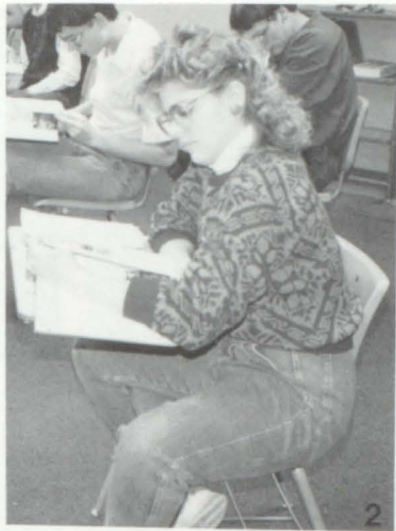
A variety of business courses educate high school students for various business fields. Some classes included are: Business law, Office education, Accounting, and Typing I and II.

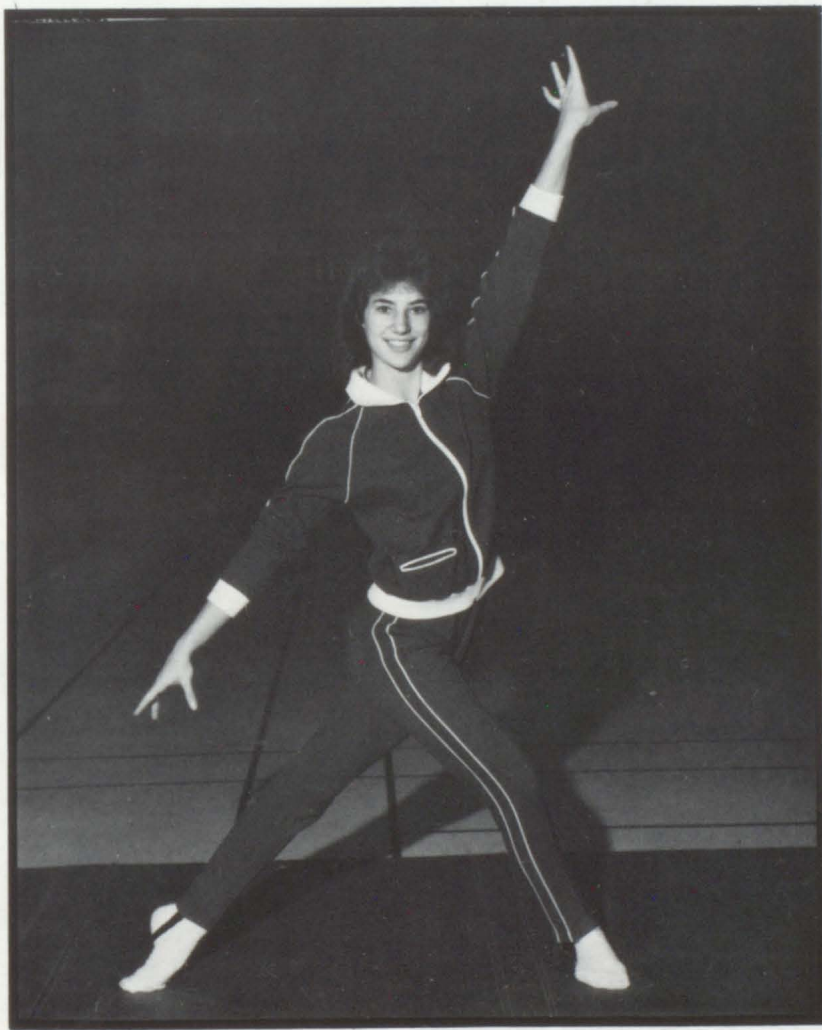

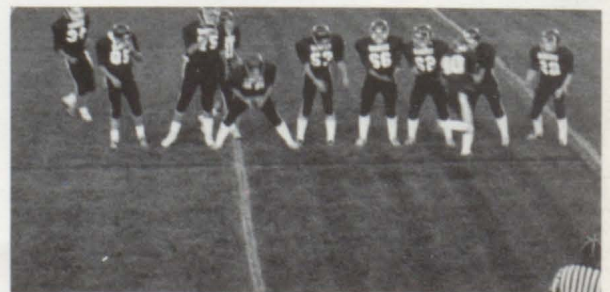

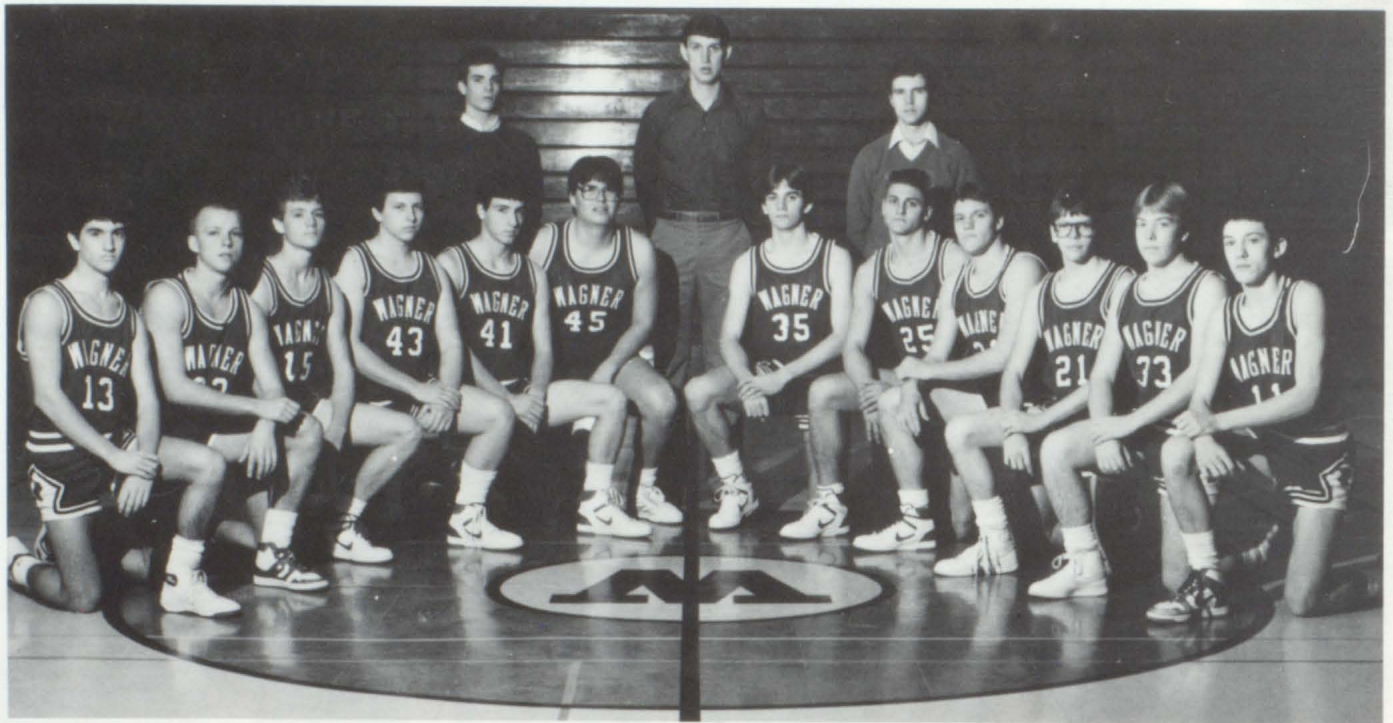

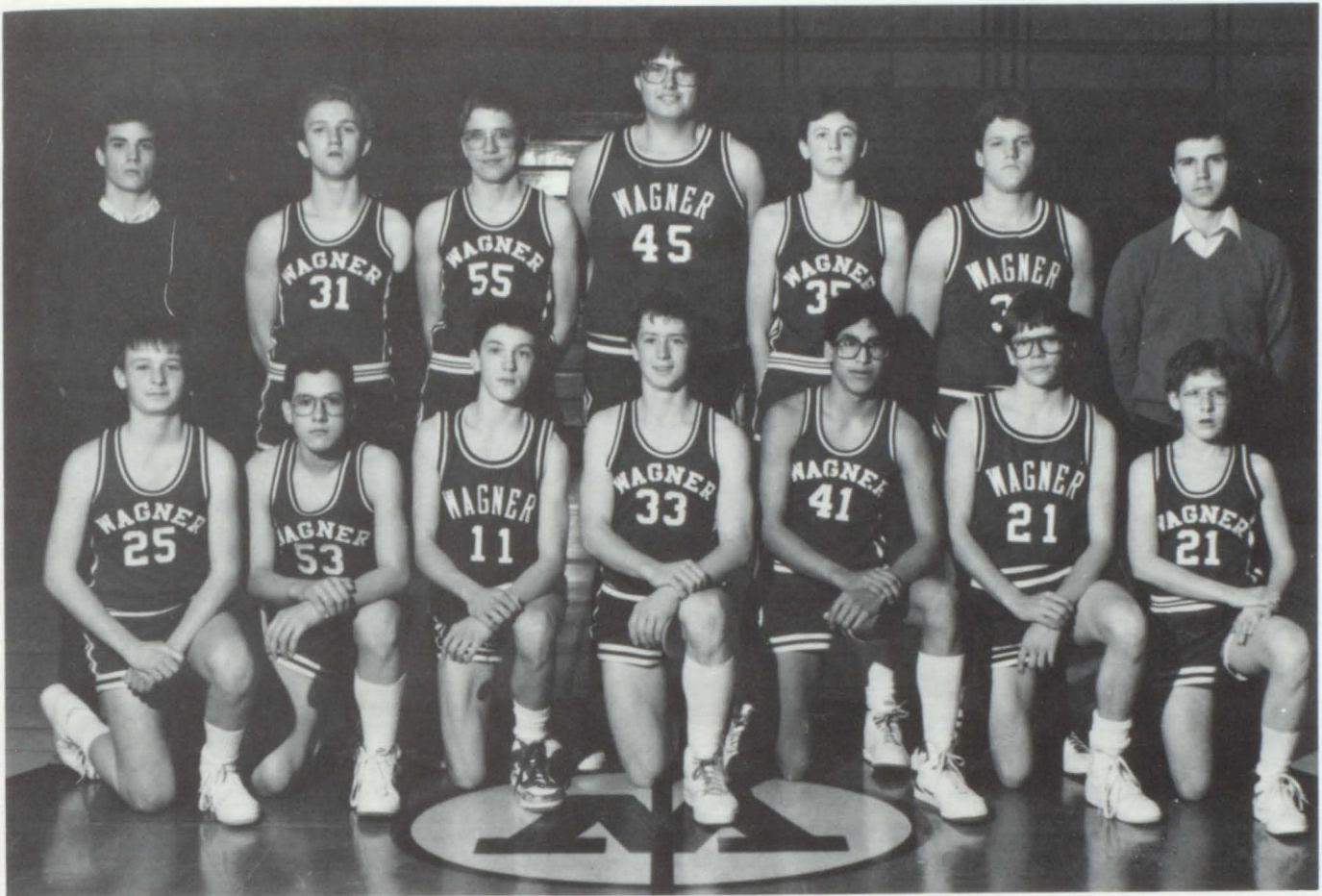

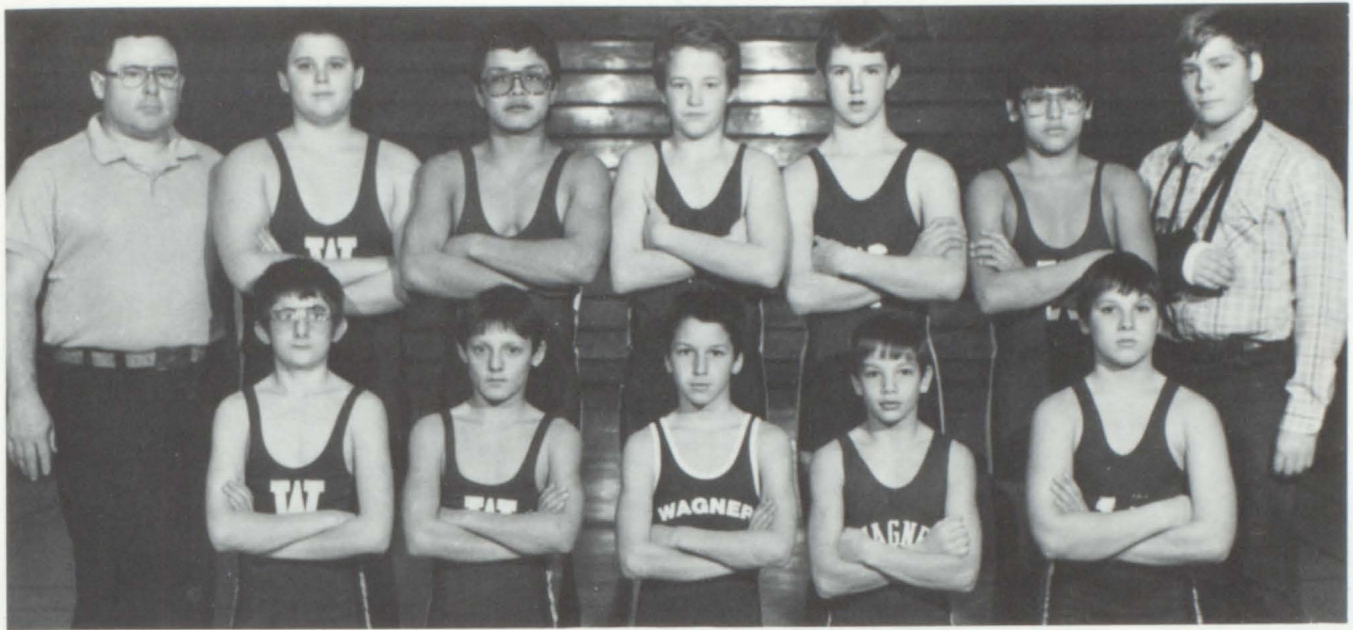

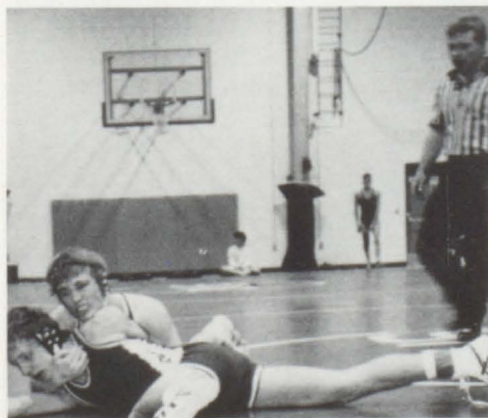
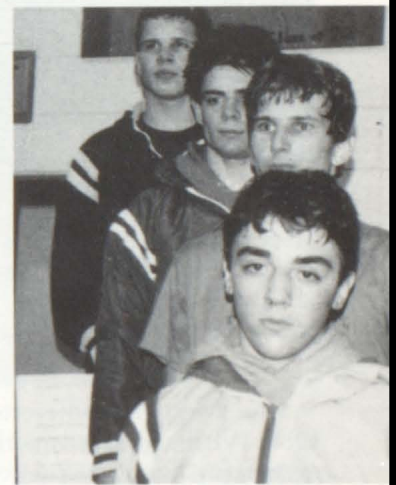

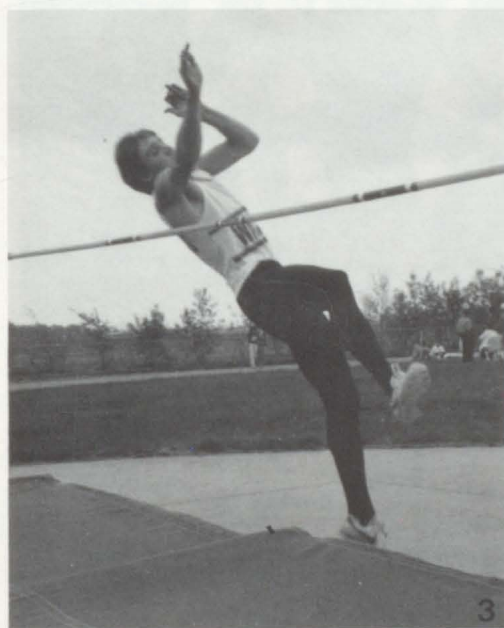

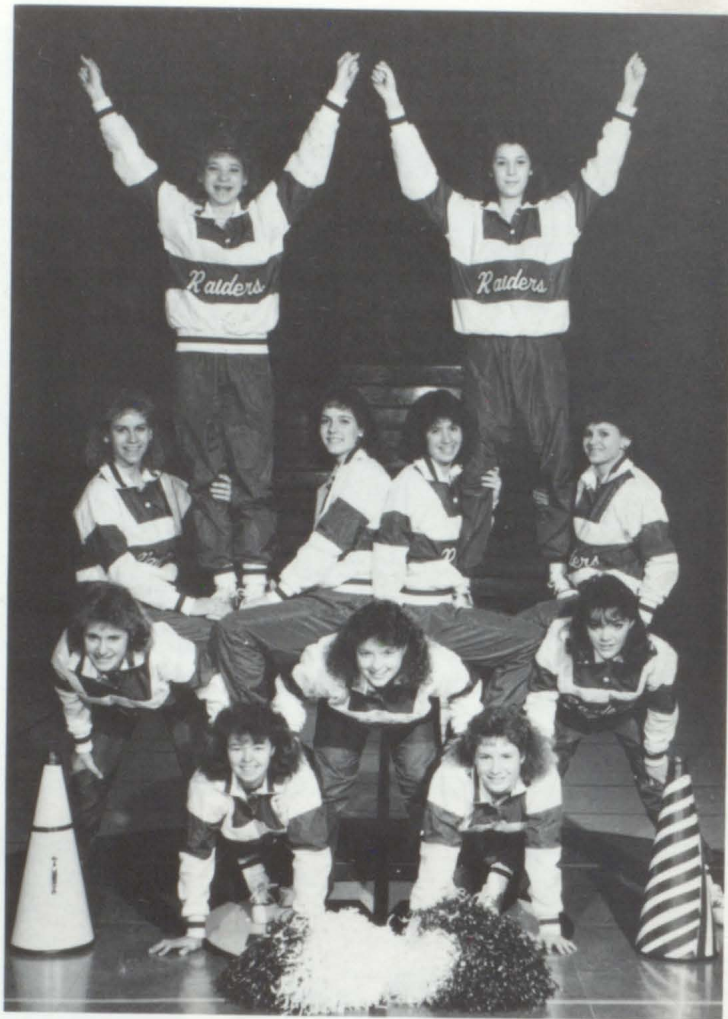

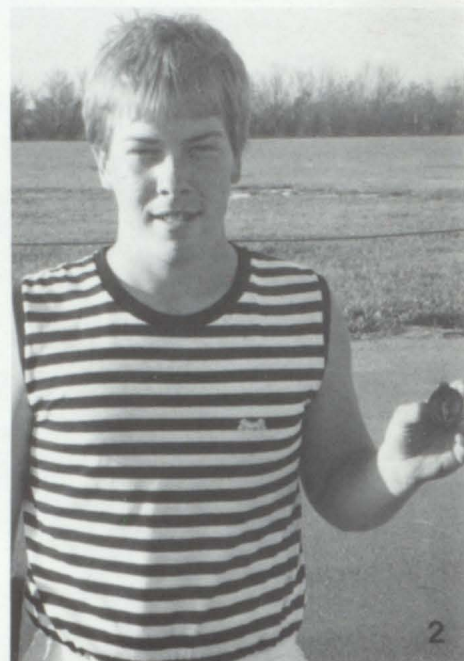

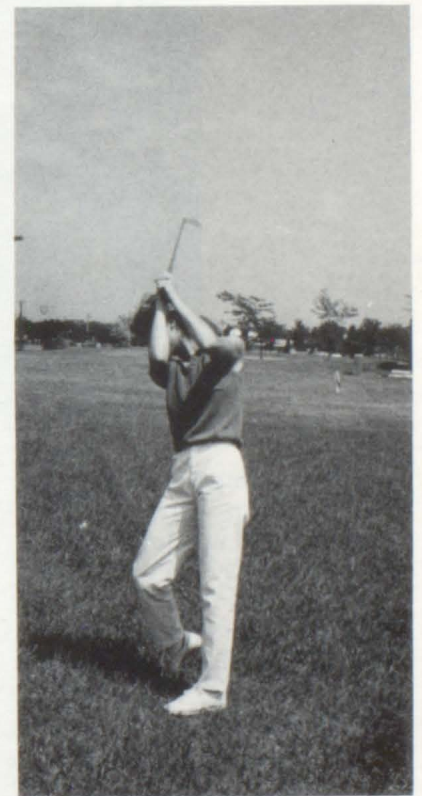

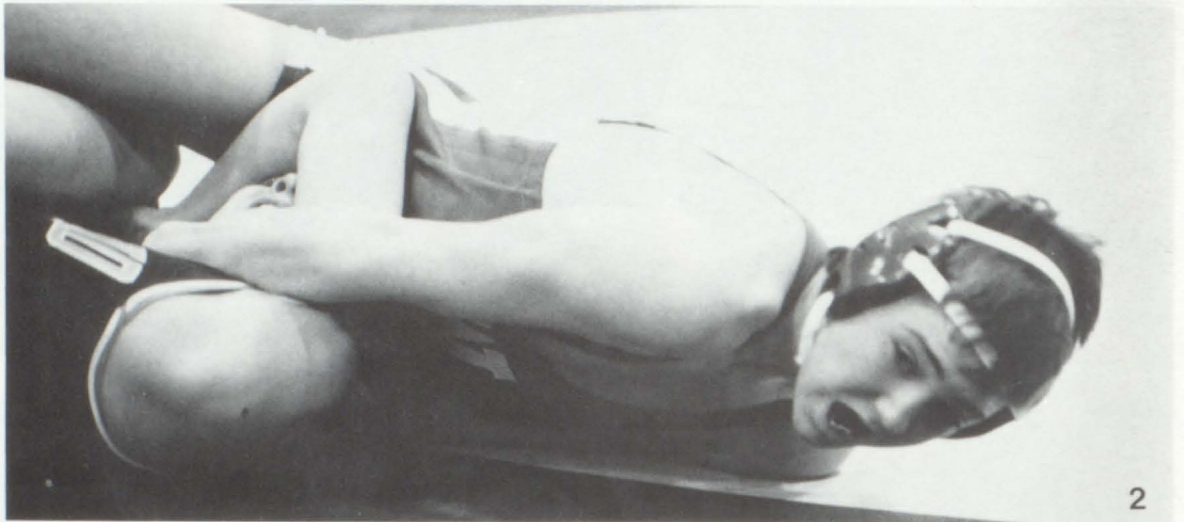

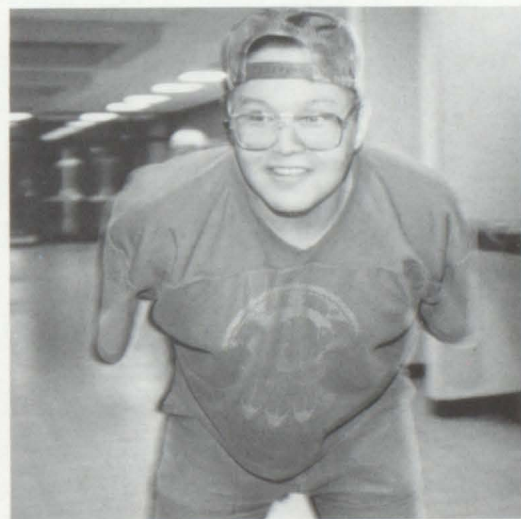

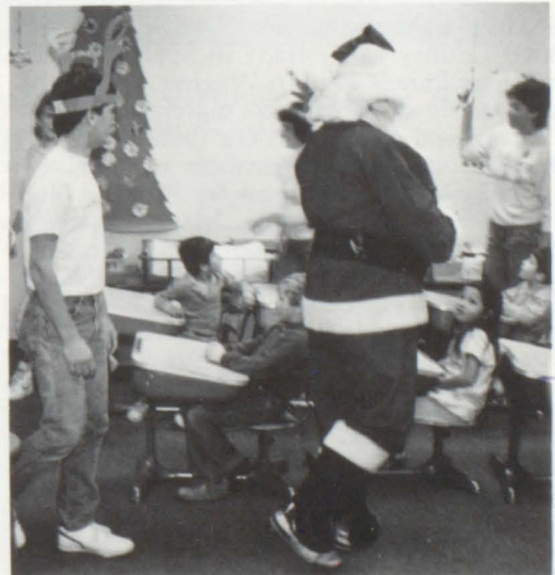

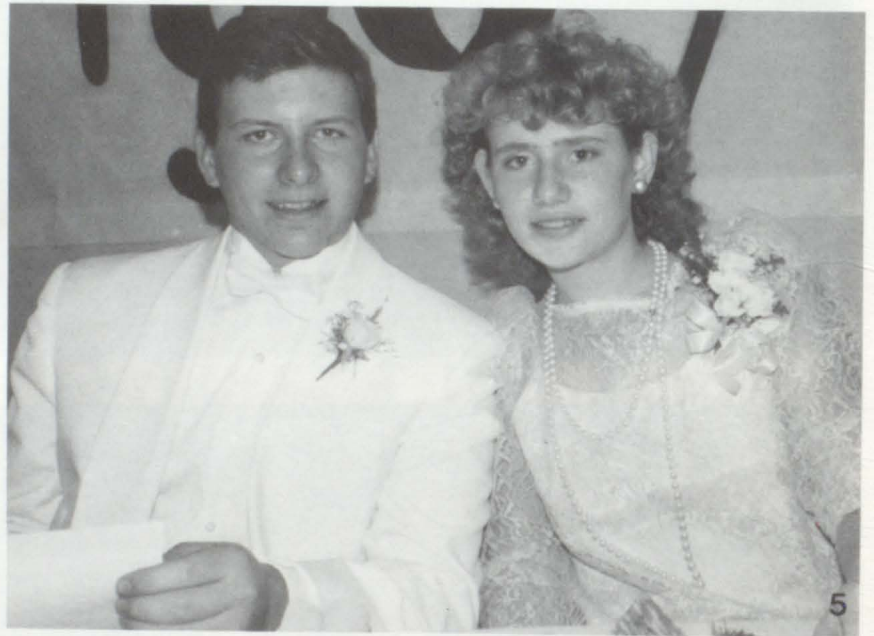

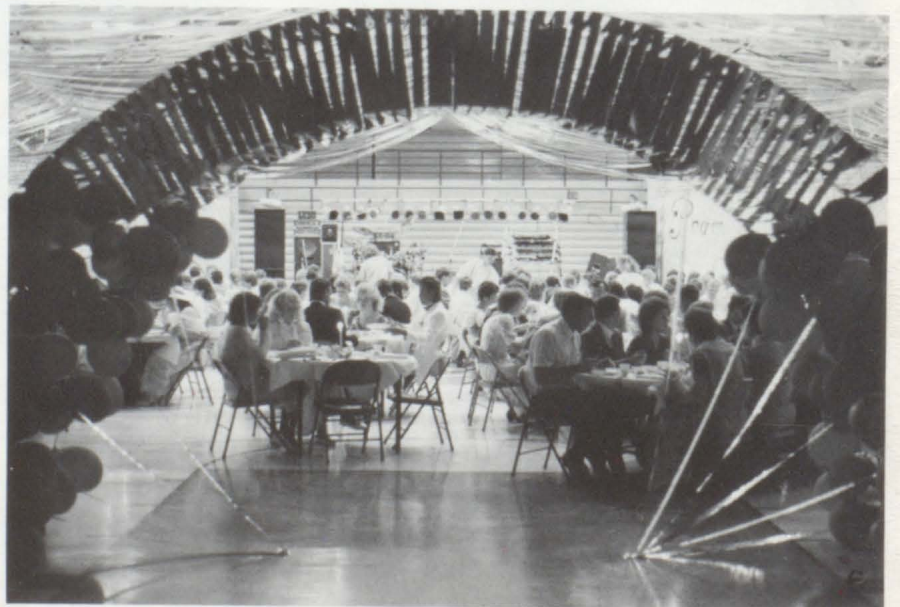




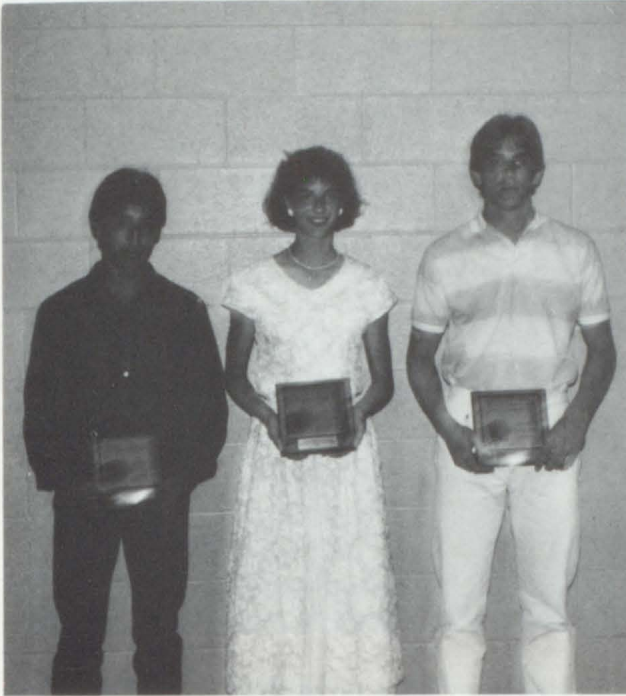

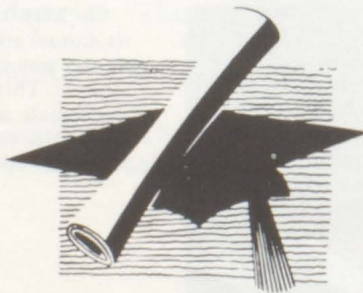
