











Since it was the second year of volleyball for the Raiders, they were more experienced, and therefore they were much improved. 

The people who have made headlines this season are Shawn Williams, Chris Fechner, and Scott


























Band Successful






This year was also a year of examination. The North Central Team evaluated our school. As part of that evaluation, the team talked to teachers, students, and administration to get the most accurate report possible.
