ATHLETICS

For the first time in history Wagner entered the State basketball tournament. The players not only had the ability, but the drive to play hard and to come from far behind to win.

Probably the most outstanding comeback they staged was against Platte in the first game of the district tournament held at Delmont February 23, 24, 25. The Raiders lagged behind throughout the game as much as 18 points, then pushed ahead in the last few minutes to win 57-56.

The Delmont game was no nip-and-tuck situation; it ended 49-28 with all ten men having seen action.

In the final game of the tournament, the Wagner team beat back a determined Andes quint, 30-26. Stedronsky took scoring honors with a total of 10 points.

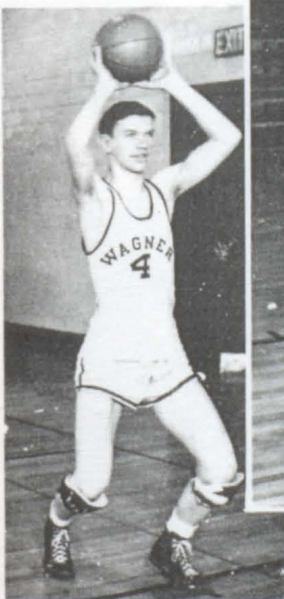
The Red Raiders returned to Delmont for the regional tournament, defeating Tripp in the first game 43-41 and Bonesteel in the finals 44-41. The first was exciting, going into an overtime period. It was Heida who shoved in the winning basket in the closing seconds.

Two Wagner players were named on the all-tourney team: Stedronsky, at guard and Doty at center. Goldhammer rated honorable mention.

In the State tournament, the Raiders lost all three games, but made a good showing. In the game with Strandburg, the two teams broke an all state "B" tournament record by making a total of 111 points. Stedronsky was the highest scoring player with 62 points to his credit; he was also named on the All-State team.

Wagner was proud of its football team this year. It took the Charles Douglas county championship by winning all of the six conference games. Their one defeat was at the hands of Miller, a non-conference foe.

The team put four men on the all conference line-up, three of whom were seniors: Ray Rezac, right guard; Vernon Stedronsky, right end; Clifford Bridge, left halfback; one junior: Richard Doty, right halfback.

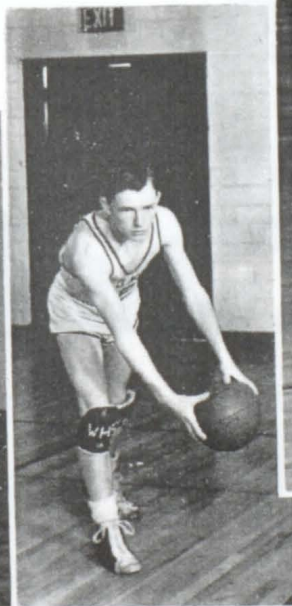

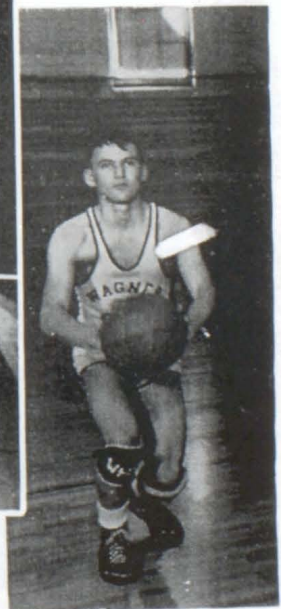

The queen's attendants were Donna O'Connell and Frances Slama; the king's, Clifford Bridge.

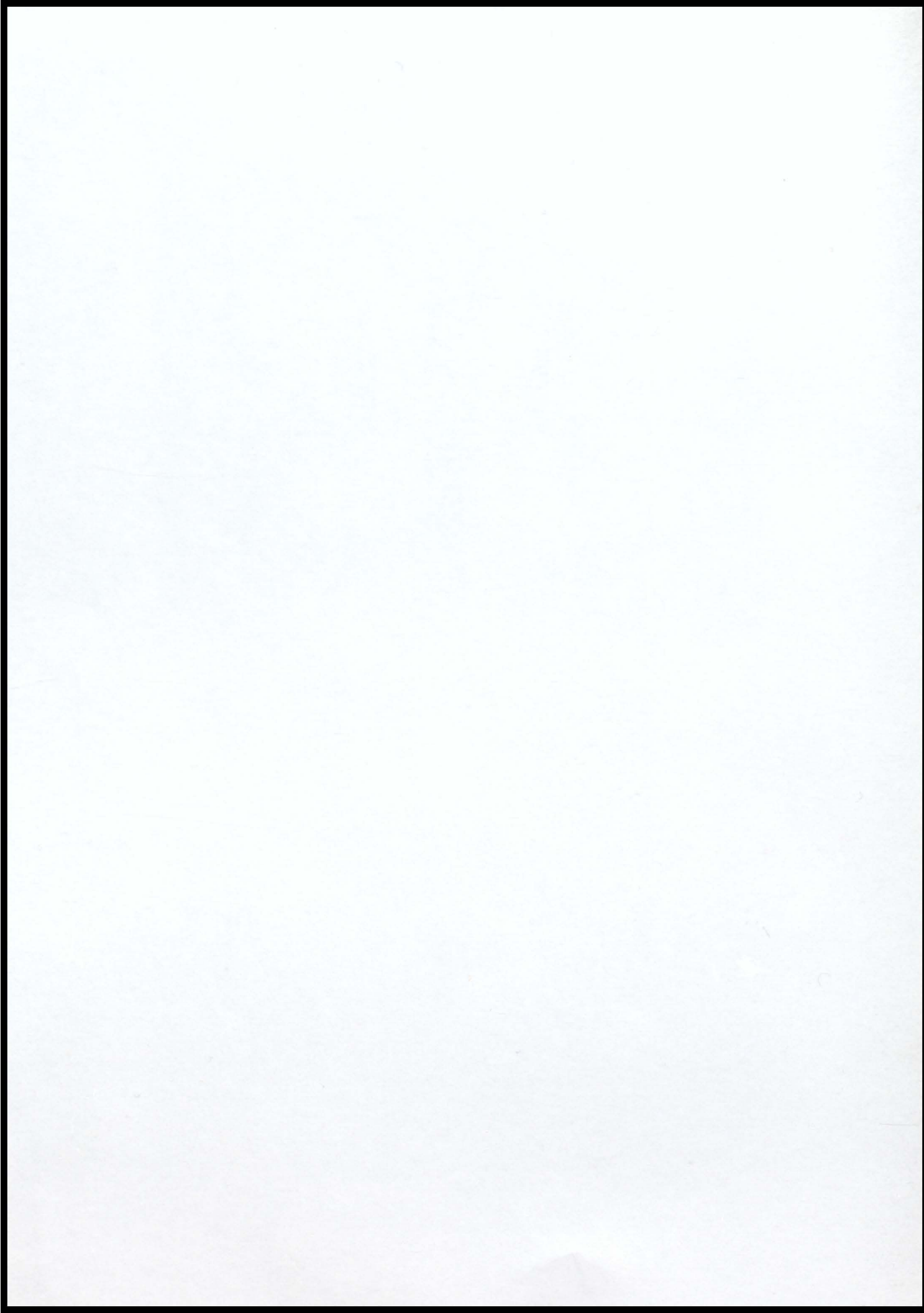

The football game ending 21-12 added to the joy of the WHS students. The dance that followed climaxed the two days of WHS activities.





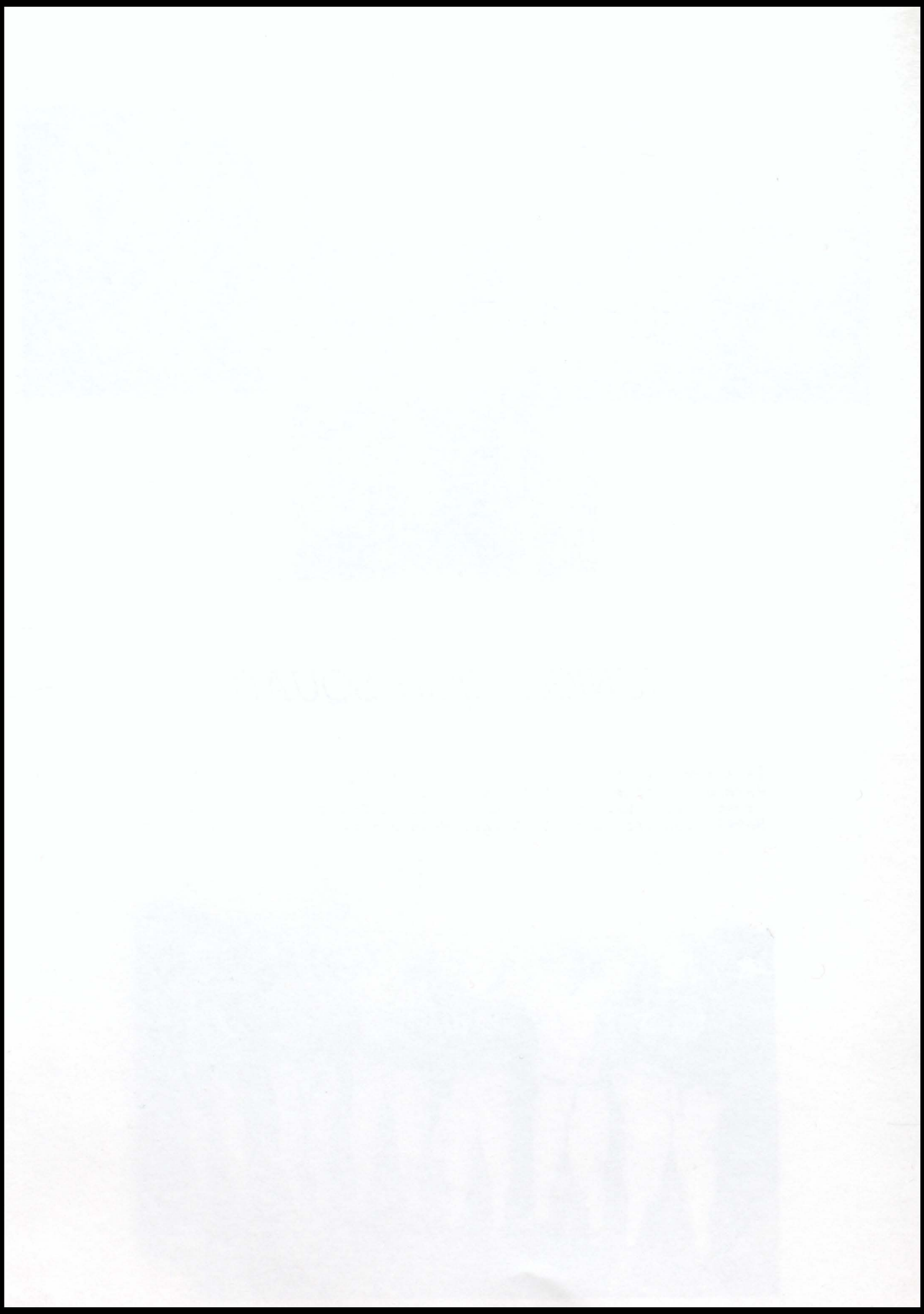

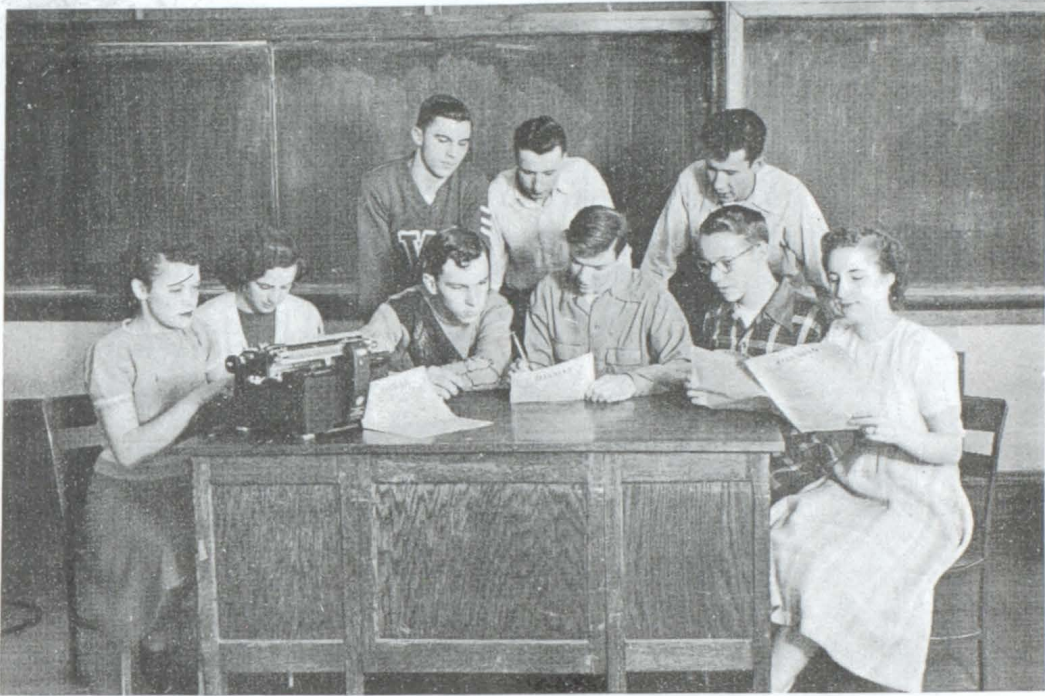


These students' scholastic ratings place them at the top of their respective classes. Their averages are based on semester grades from their entrance into high school through the first semester of this year.

Publication of the Zoanian is under the supervision of Miss Bormann. The issues have been printed by the Wagner Post, rather than being mimeographed as they were in the past.
