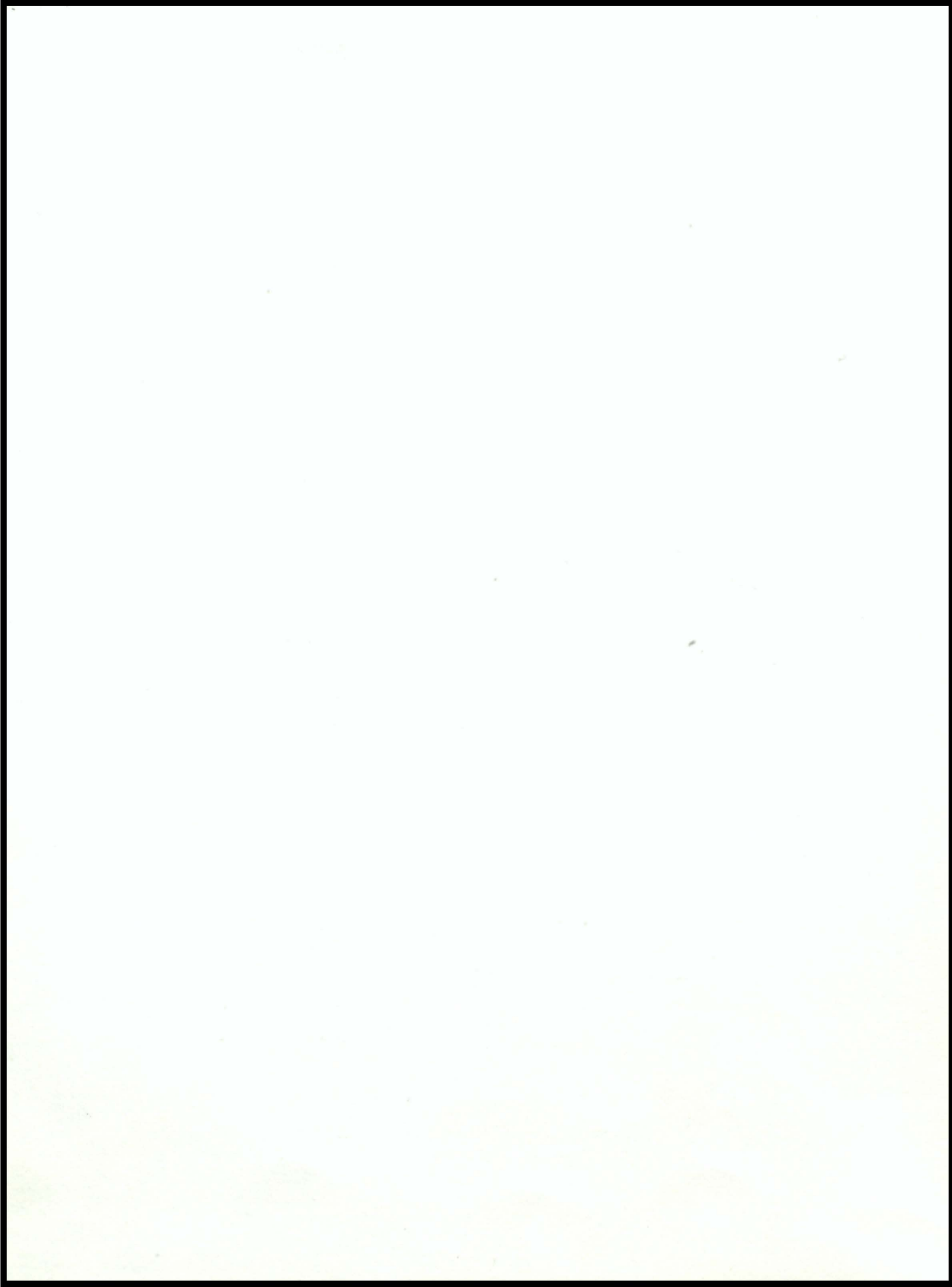

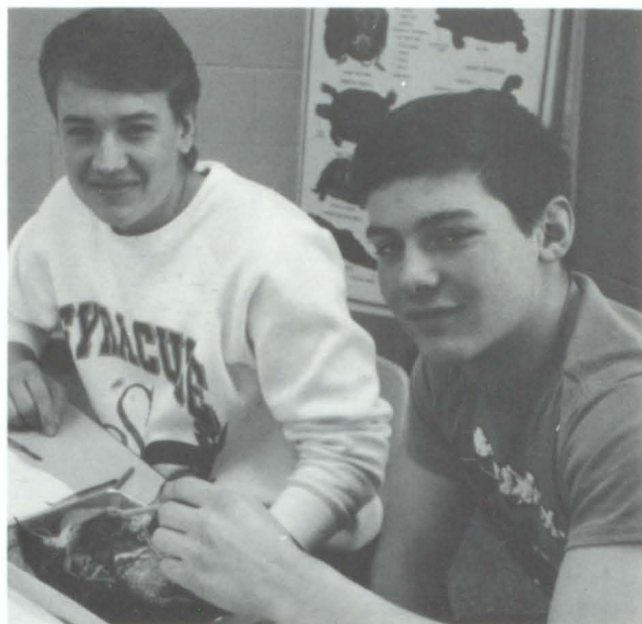

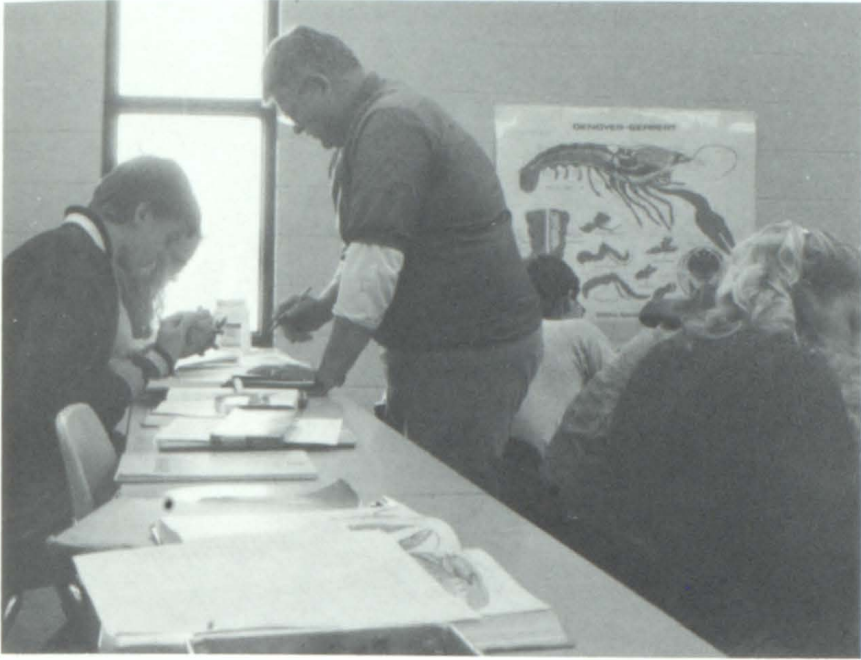

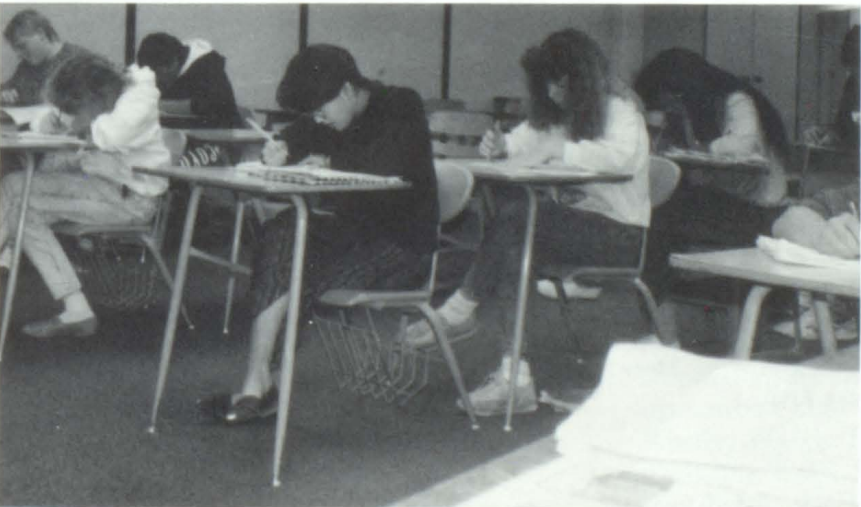

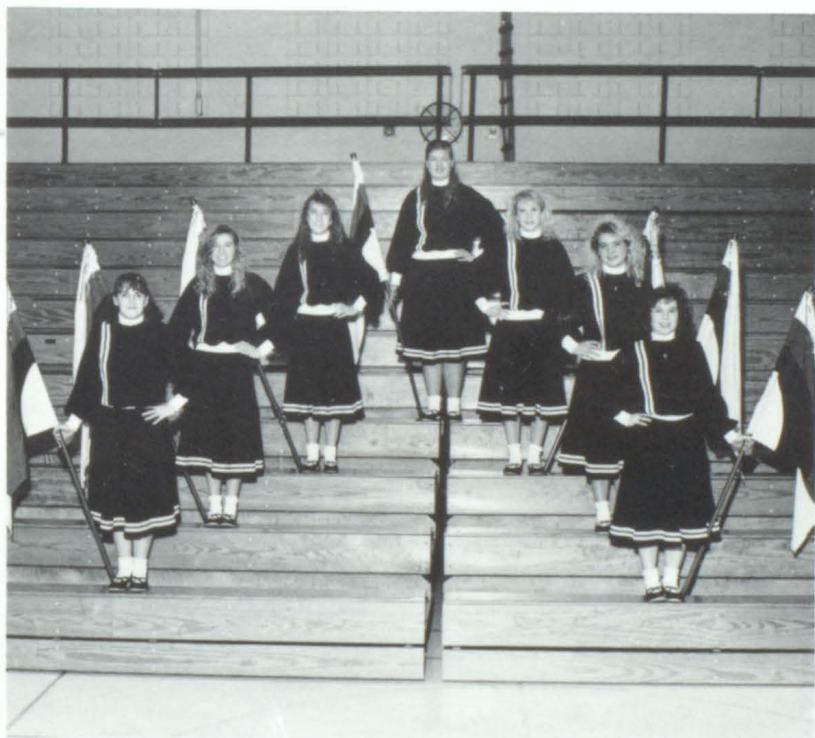

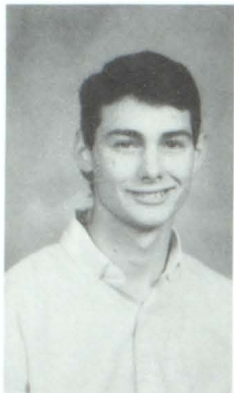
# Juniors

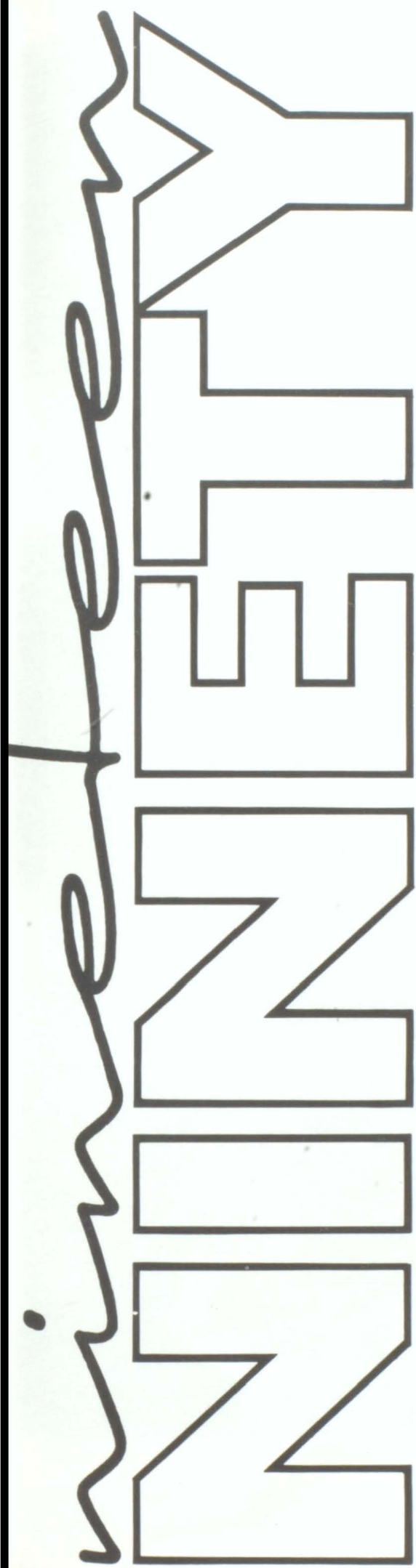

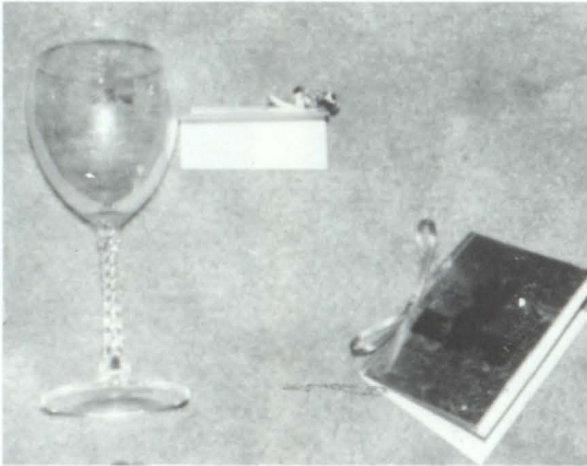

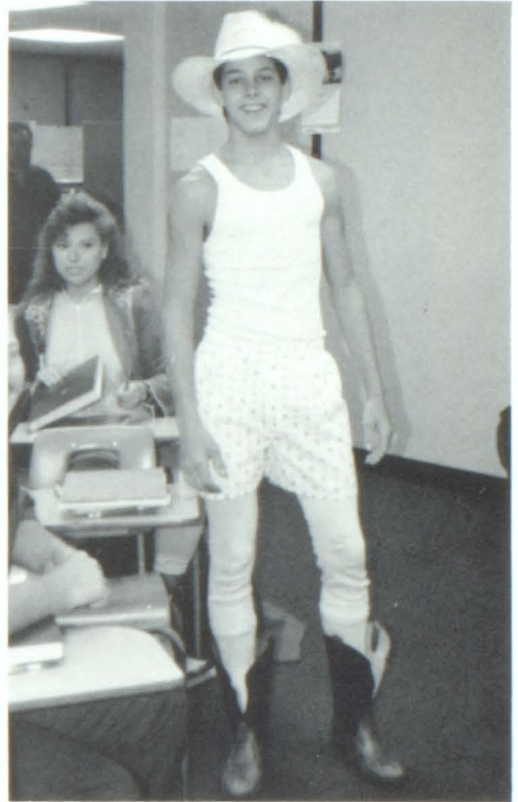

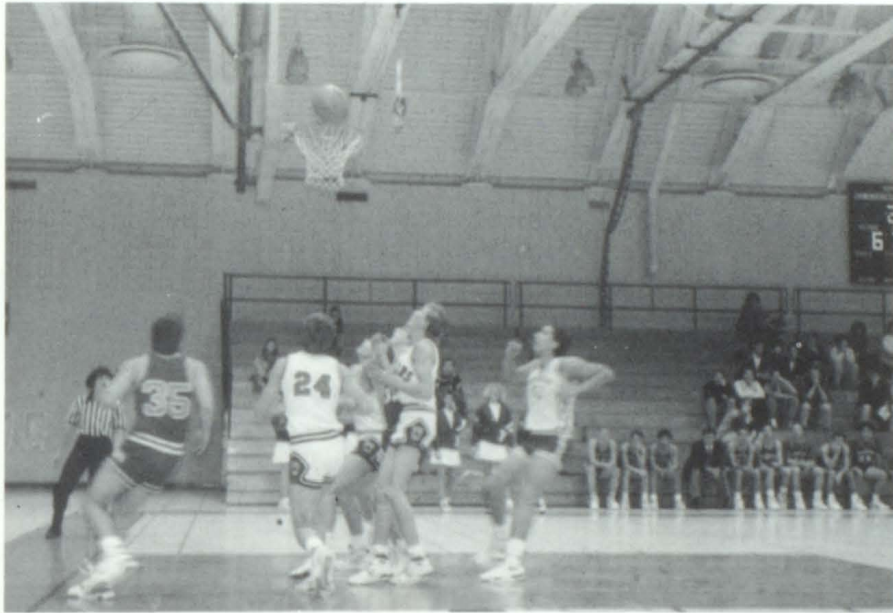

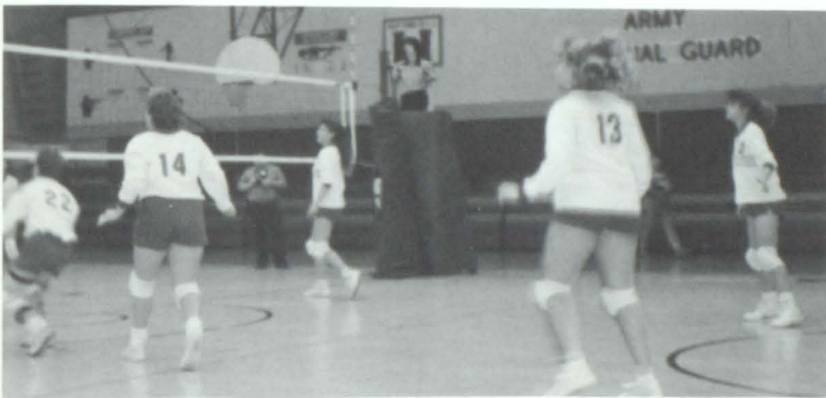

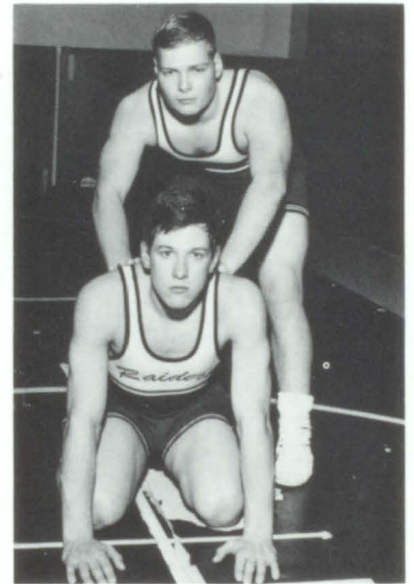

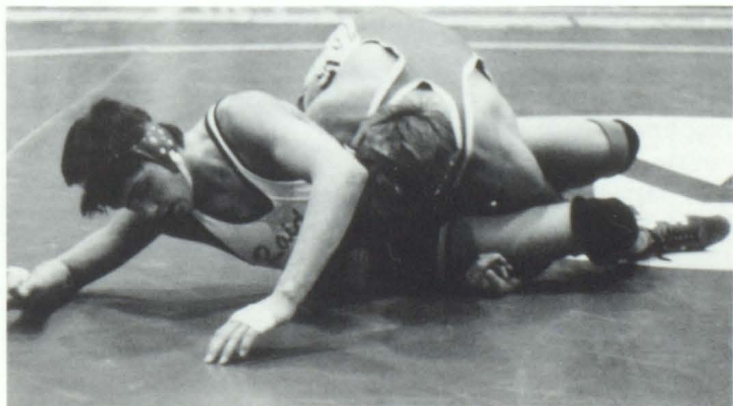

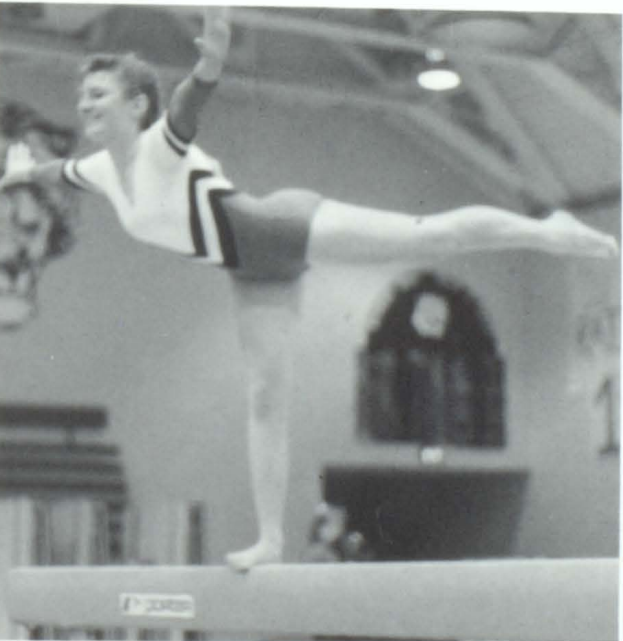

ner-up in Regions. The cheerleaders and fans promoted the school spirit of 1989-90 in what was over-all a good season for all the athletes.

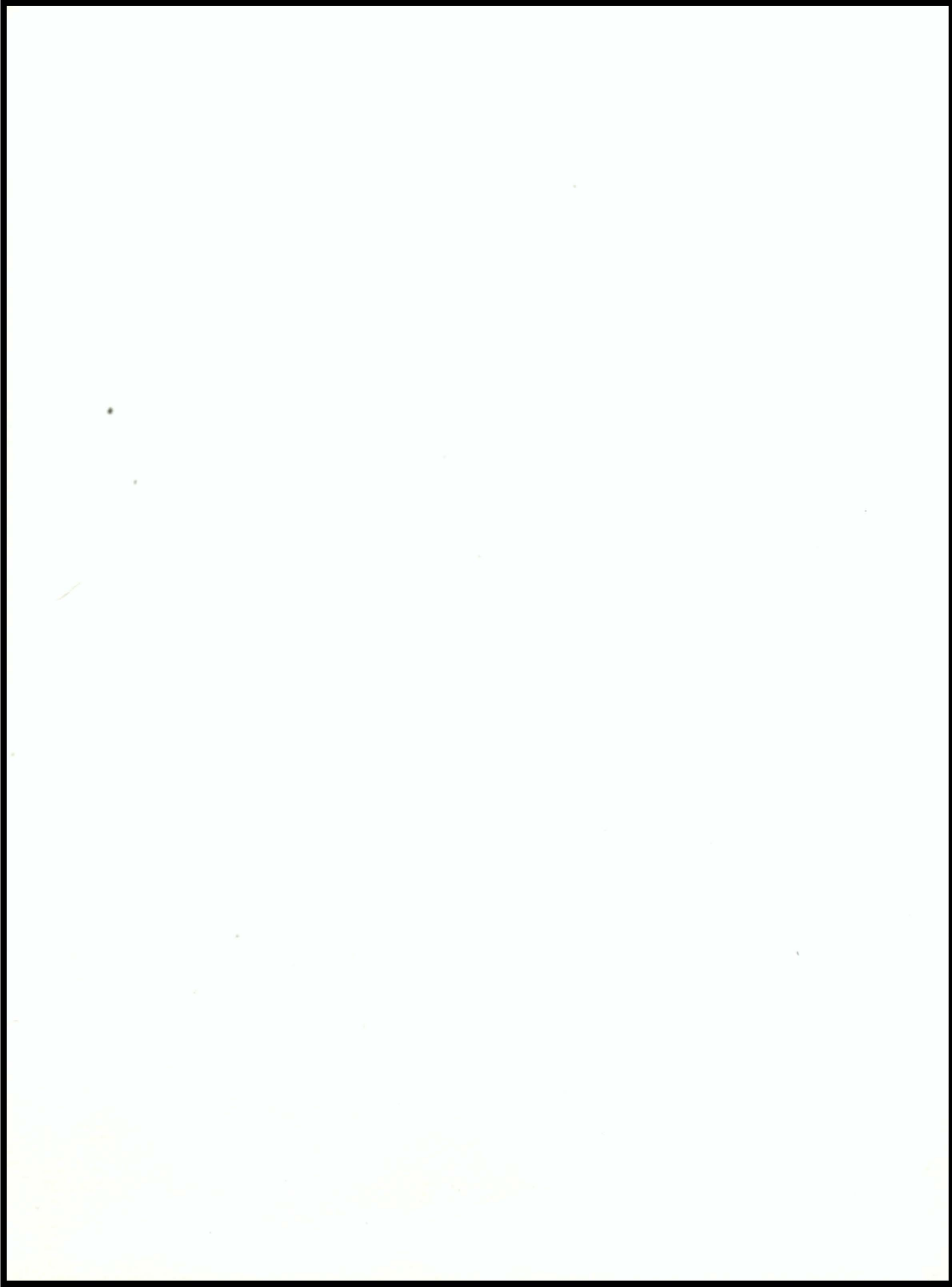
Wagner had many great events this year. Homecoming Week, Music festival and contests, concerts, Prom, the school play and the exciting band trip to Texas were some of the events.

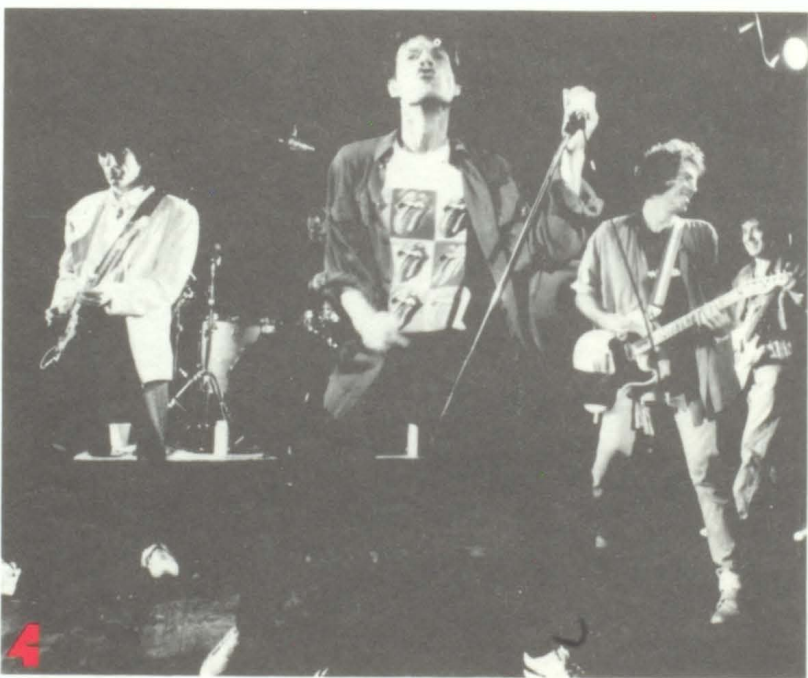
