Ryan Hanson made this comment about his sophomore year. "The sophomore year is a bit harder than last






Exciting Season For Girls Basketball Team





Jamie Meyers concentrates on her floor routine.




Two Wrestlers Retain Titles













The Wagner High Chorus entertained the public by singing at their annual Christmas, Spring, and Pops Concerts.



Those students in grades 7-12 who are interested in joining next year are encouraged to see Mrs. Schoepf and sign up.










