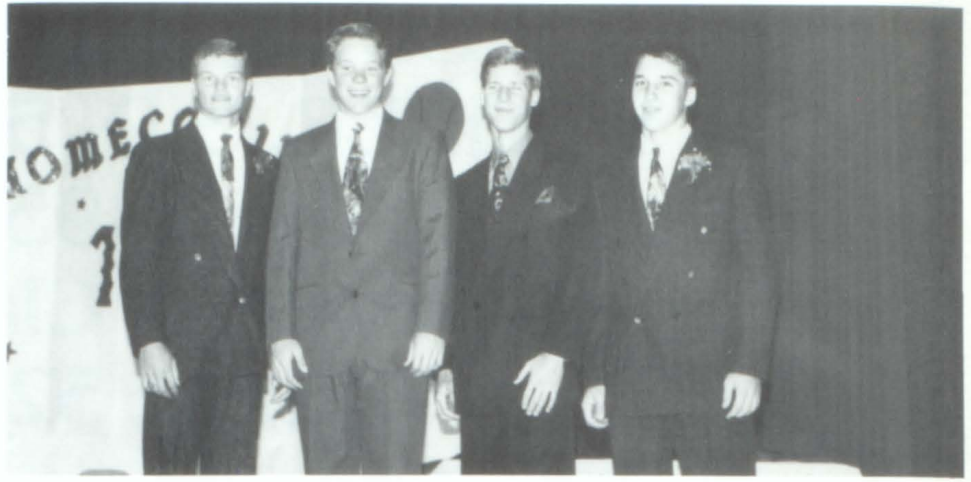

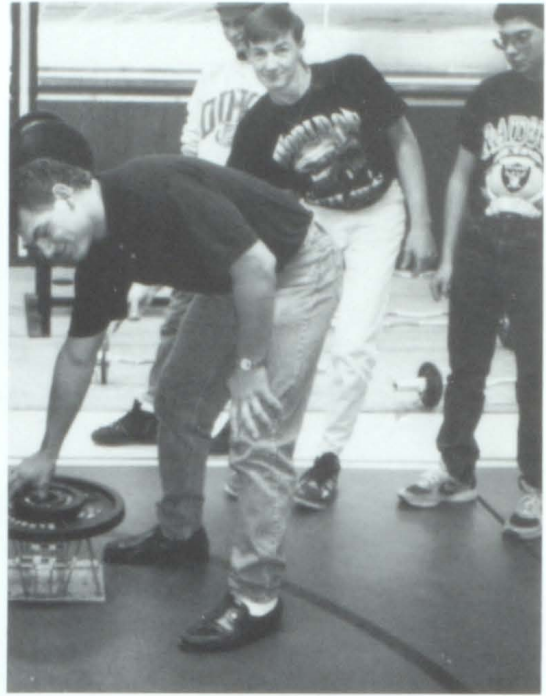

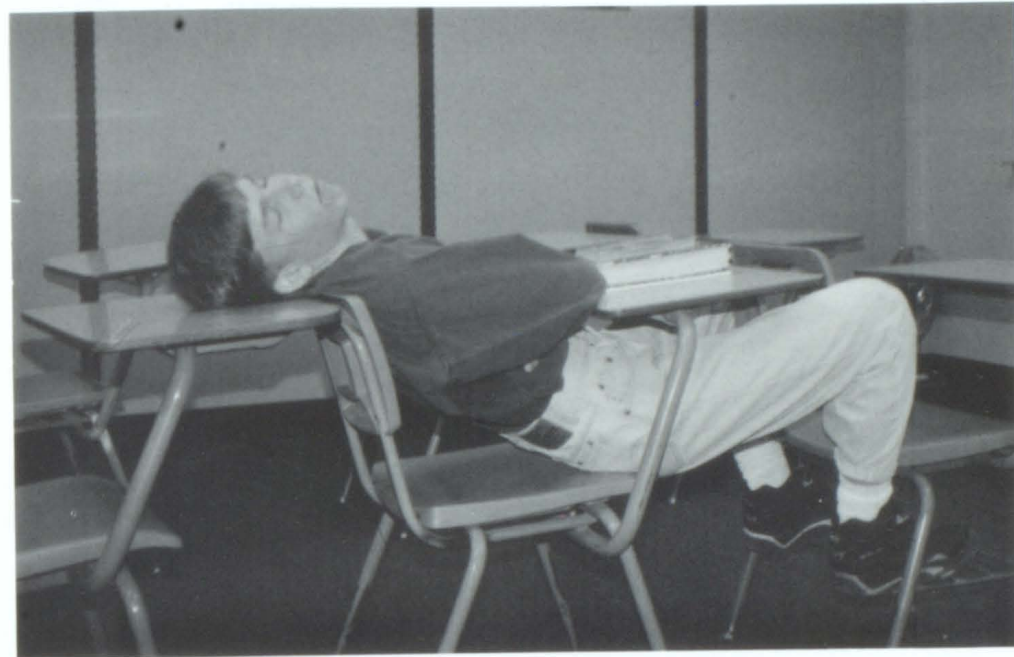

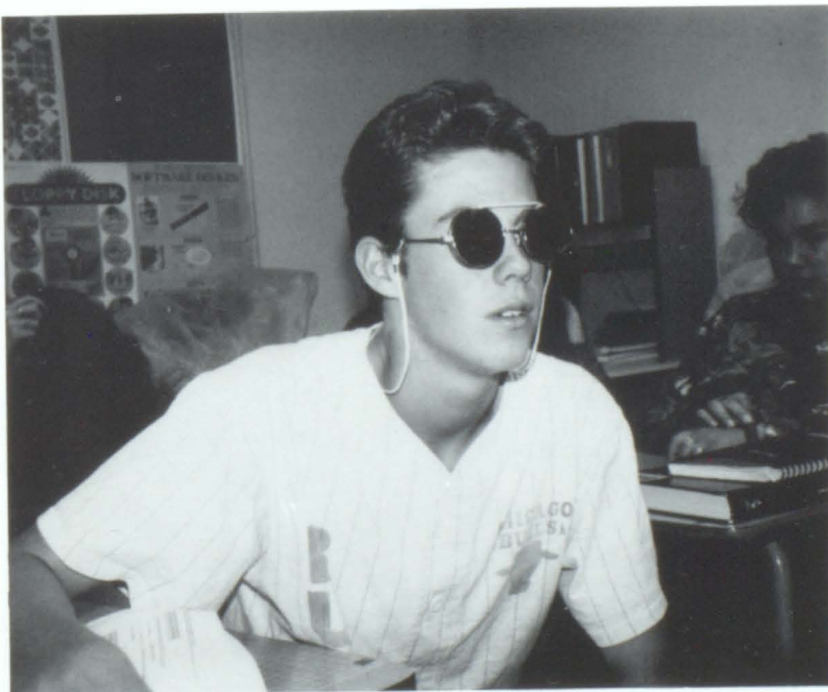

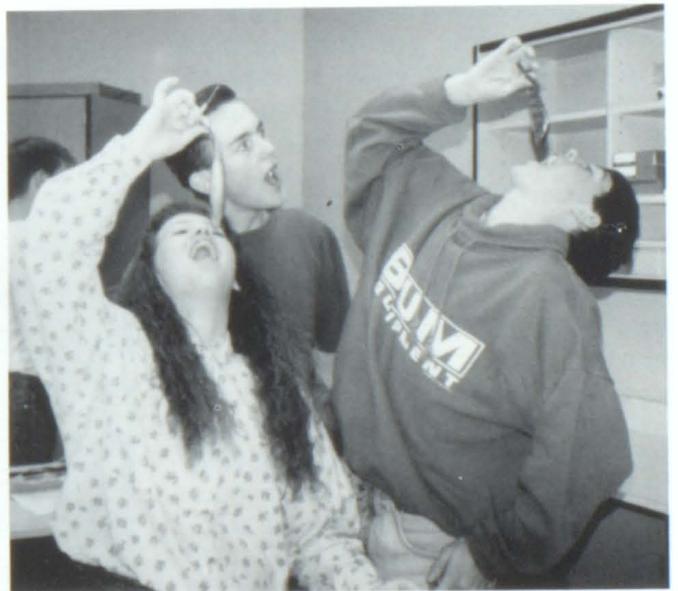

Many Choices

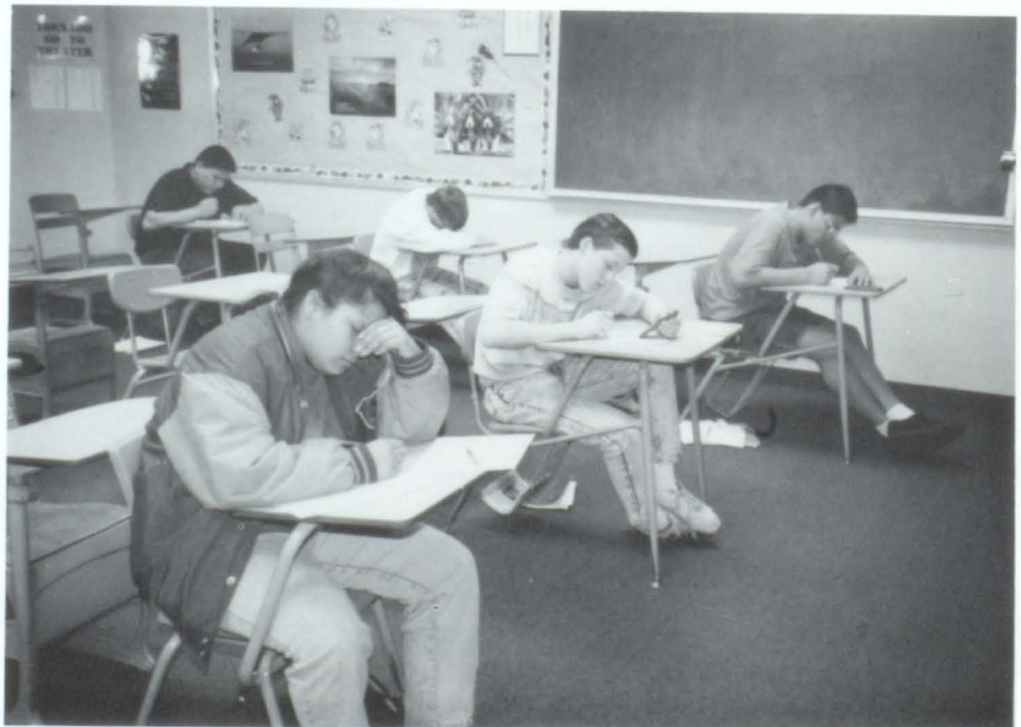

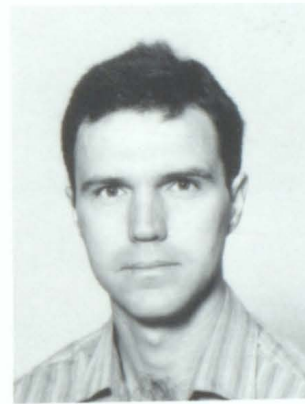

The statistical leaders of the team were: Jay Swatek first in rushing with 534 yards and 5 touch-

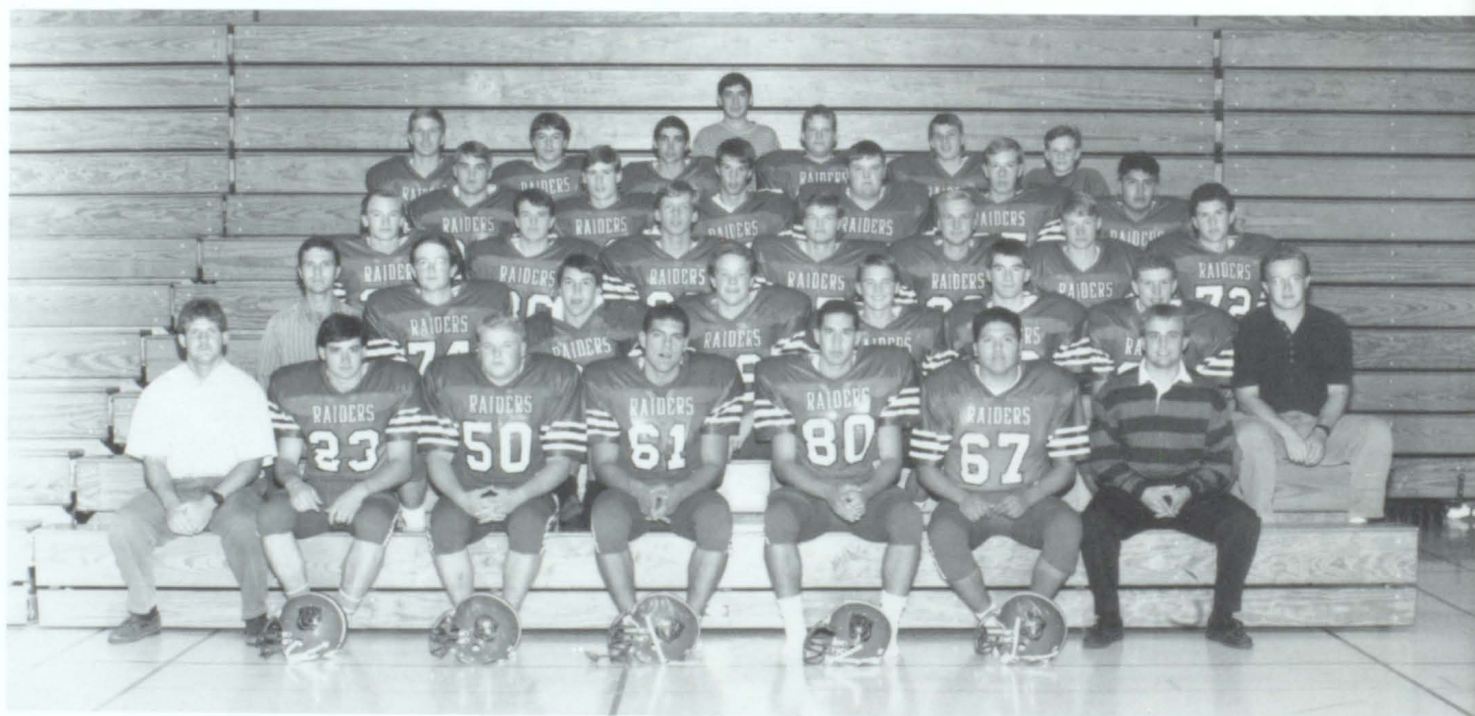

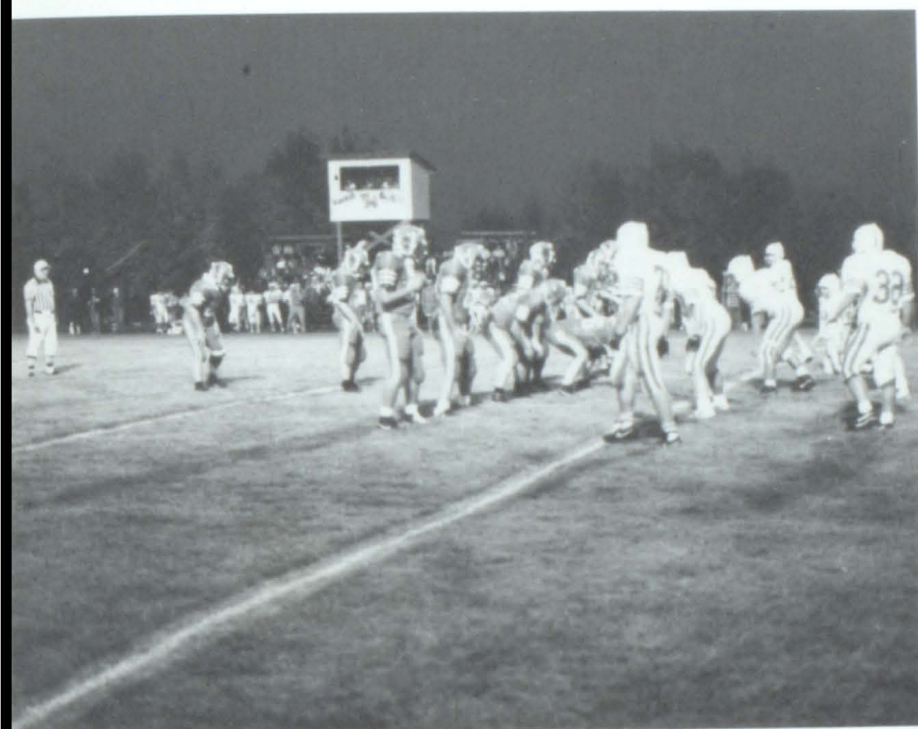

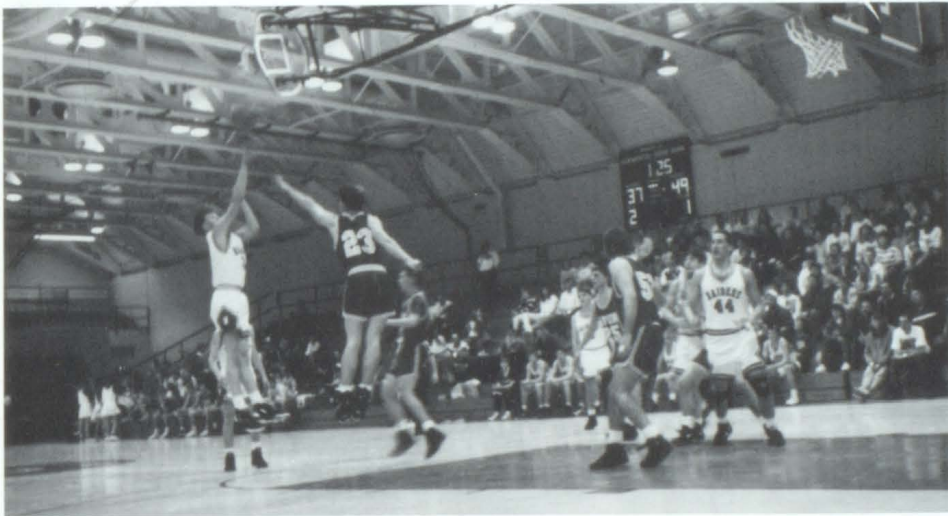

Wrestlers Finish Fourth

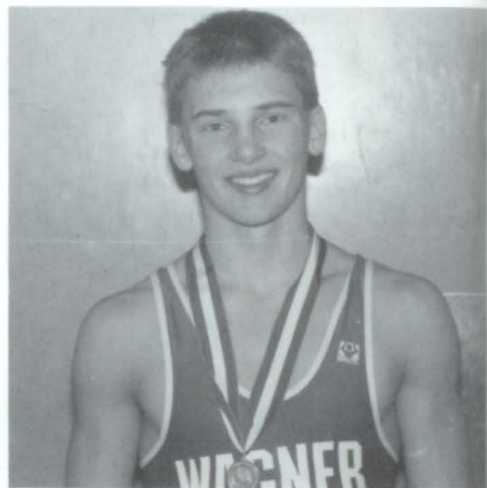

Four Qualify for State

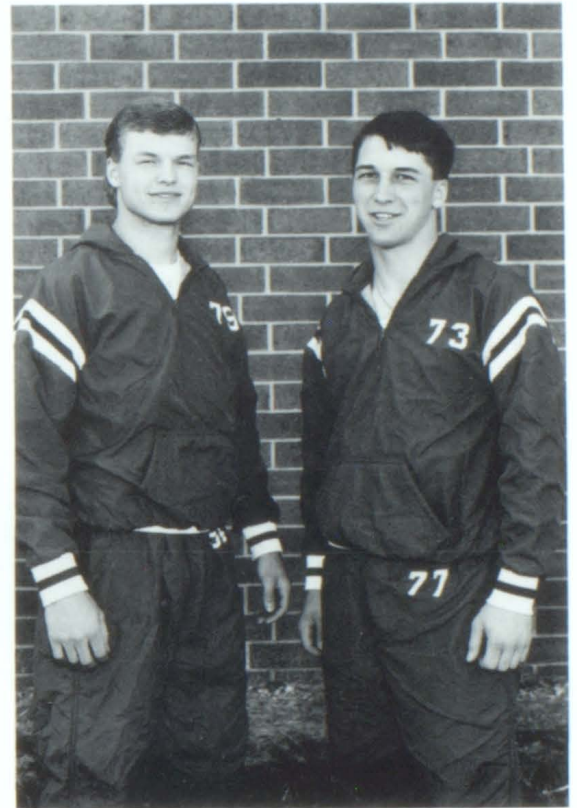

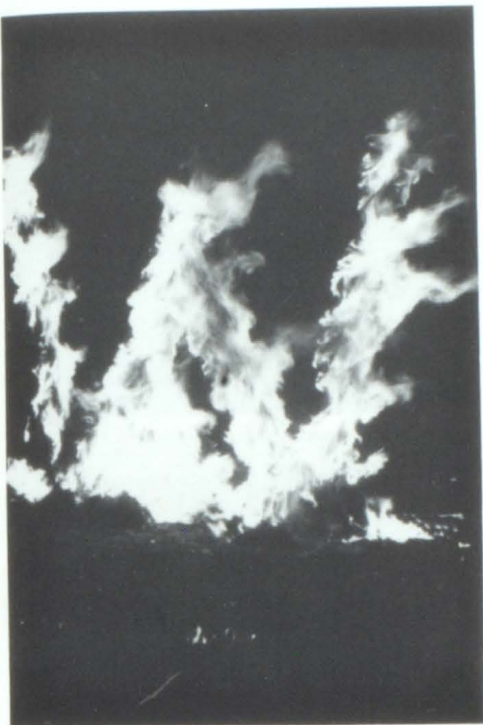

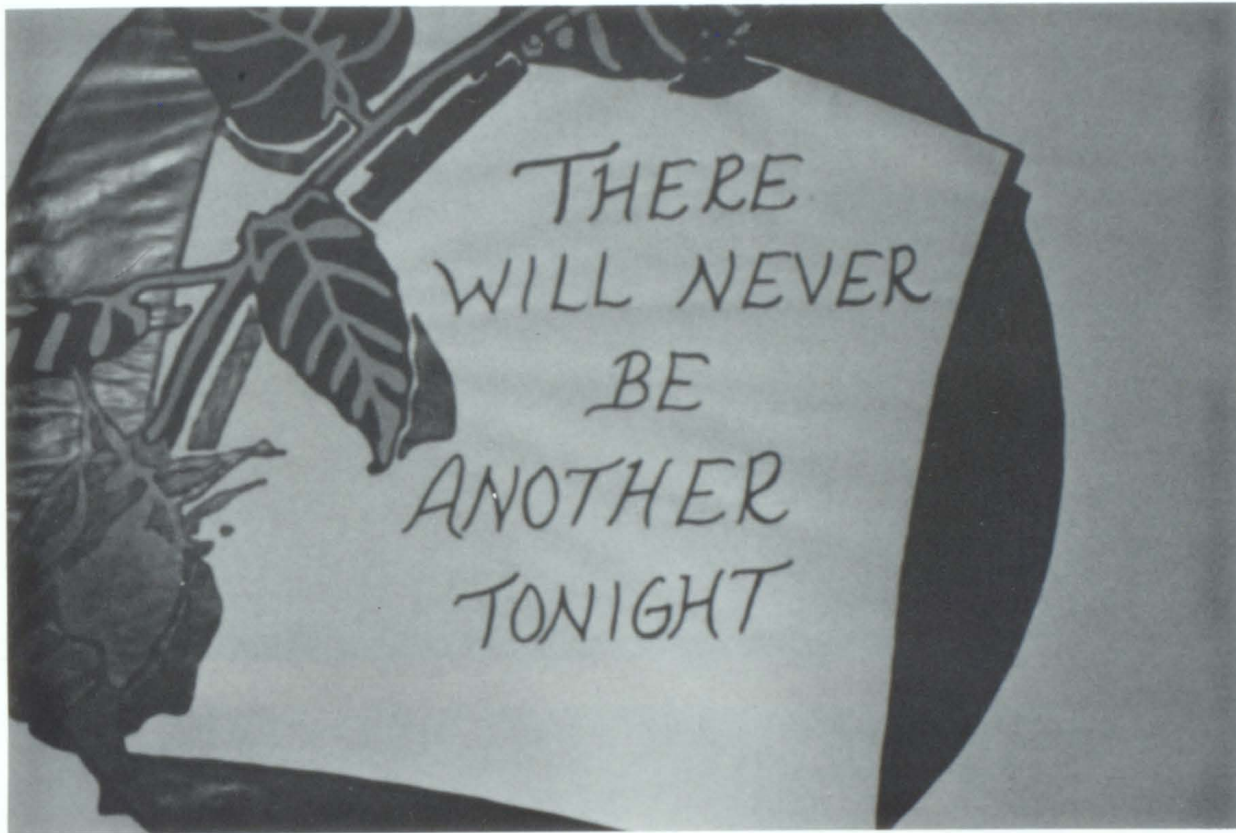

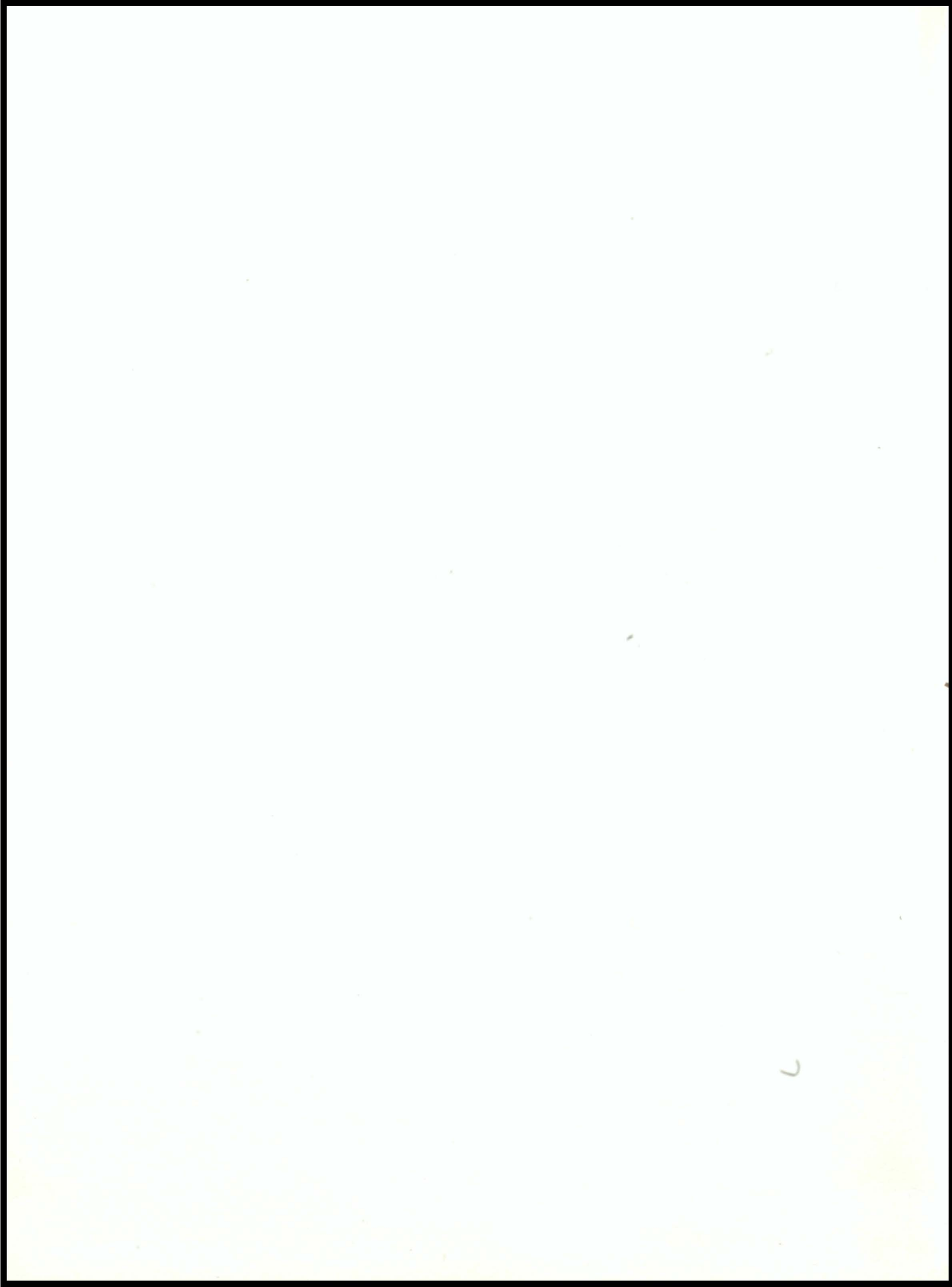
and Renee Wiechmann queen and winning the football game against Chamberlain 38 to 14 were the highlights of homecoming.

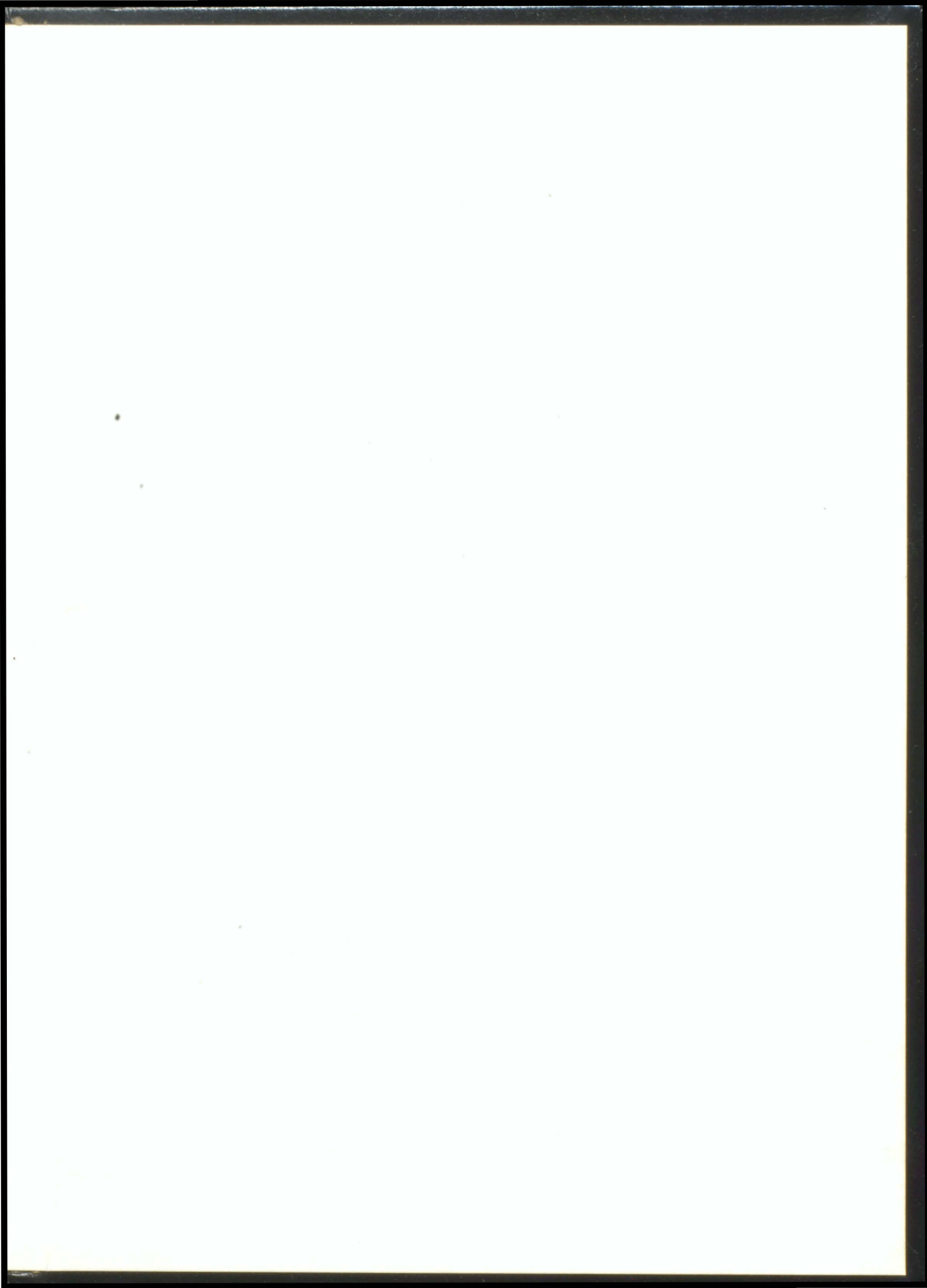
