



Skills are Taught


Skills are not only learned by students but are taught by teachers who care. All teachers have different ways of expressing that they care about the future of their students, one of which is by giving homework.





Our memories will always live in our hearts.





The first performance for the group was as part of the Area Chorus Festival in Avon on October 18. The chorus performed as part of a large group with chorus members from other schools.




Band Marches








The volleyball team had a season record of 22-11-2 and placed seventh in the State Tournament.




Many New Gymnasts




