Wagner High School students, faculty, administrators and school board members gave that little extra that made the school above and beyond the average.



Above and Beyond Imagination



The support staff was a great asset to Wagner High School. With out all of these great people our school would not have been the quality school that it was.





















Team has Four-Four Season







Mandy Koupal ended the season by being named to All-Conference and second team All-State. Jenny Durham was given honorable mention.




Excellent Season



The Grand March began at eightthirty, followed by the dance.




