



There were many memories to make, experiences to learn from, and much fun to be had by all.





Quiz Bowl





The girls had a very challenging season and did a great job. They worked hard and it paid off. These girls should be very proud of themselves.






This year the Raider basketball team had a tough season. The season ended with 3 wins and 16 losses.


Team Successful


