












class of 2001

This year's annual staff had a mix of students. They ranged from freshmen to seniors. Some were experienced while others were newcomers. They all worked together to create the greatest annual ever.



This team of eleven staff members worked hard to get at least one issue out each month. They searched high and low to have the best news coverage around the Wagner Community School.




The paper featured advertisements and announcements. The Mystery Person was also brought back this year and made students search the Raider Report for interesting clues.






National Honor Society Remains Active Throughout The Year






THE BAND REPORT

Thanks to the leadership of three seniors; Mandy Koupal, Suzie Sully, and Molly Swatek. The Wagner basketball team had a record of 23-1. The team broke two records this year, most points scored in a game against Scotland and best field goal percentage in a game (73%) against Burke.

This year has been a great season for Mandy Koupal. She received the Spirit of Su award, all-conference, all-tournament at the state tournament, academic all-state, WNAX player of the year, first team all-state. During her career, Mandy broke six Wagner individual records. These included most points scored in a game (38) in 1997, most field goals made in a game (17) in 1997, most free throws attempted in a game (20) in 1996, most

The three things that motivated this team to victory were making their goal, pursuing their goal, and turning their goal into reality.




The familiar jump shot by Mandy Koupal during the State Tournament held in Watertown.





The Raiders placed second at both the Region tournament and the Kimball tournament.





Aaron was also selected to the LMVC and SESD All-Conference teams.












