

New Beginnings




CLASS OF 2000

Wendy Uherka qualified in goat tying and break away. She placed eighth in the average at the championships.










Boys' Basketball team has good season














Below: Robin Bures tees up the women's tee box.






Above: Dawn Gruenewald tries to get out of the rough. Below: Sean Coleman hits a great shot to the green.








Culture Club - a Service Organization










Capturing Memories




