Recap of the first playoff game of 2007
On Tuesday night the Red Raiders traveled to Platte to take on the Black Panthers in 1st round play off action. The first quarter ended with a O-O score. This picked up in the second quarter. After forcing the Black Panthers to punt Wagner took over in excellent shape at mid field. The Red Raiders capped off the 11 play 48 yard drive with a 4 yard run by Mavrick Hill, which put Wagner up 6-O. On the kick-off Platte returned it deep into Wagner territory. With the ball sitting on the 15 yard line, the Red Raider defense stepped up to the challenge. After picking up a first down on the 2 yard line Wagner then preceded to turn the Black Panthers on 4 consecutive plays, the biggest oncoming on 4th down as the Red Raider defense made a stop on the 1 ft line to turn the ball back over to the offense. Wagner went into the half with a 6-O lead. The second half started with both teams trading positions, then mid way through the third quarter the momentum swung Wagner's way. After a roughing the punter call on Platte the Red Raiders then took over and began a 14 play 65 yard drive capped off with a 1 yard run by Hill and the 2 point conversion a pass from Chase Kuhlman to Andy Hall which gave the Red Raiders a $14-0$ lead. On the next Platte position the Black Panthers were able to score on a 64 yard run to pull within 14-6. After that Wagner's defense was able to step up again and force a fumble to seal the victory for the Red Raiders. The Red Raiders advanced to the 2nd round of the playoffs where they took on the Bon Homme Cavaliers in Wagner that Monday night.
