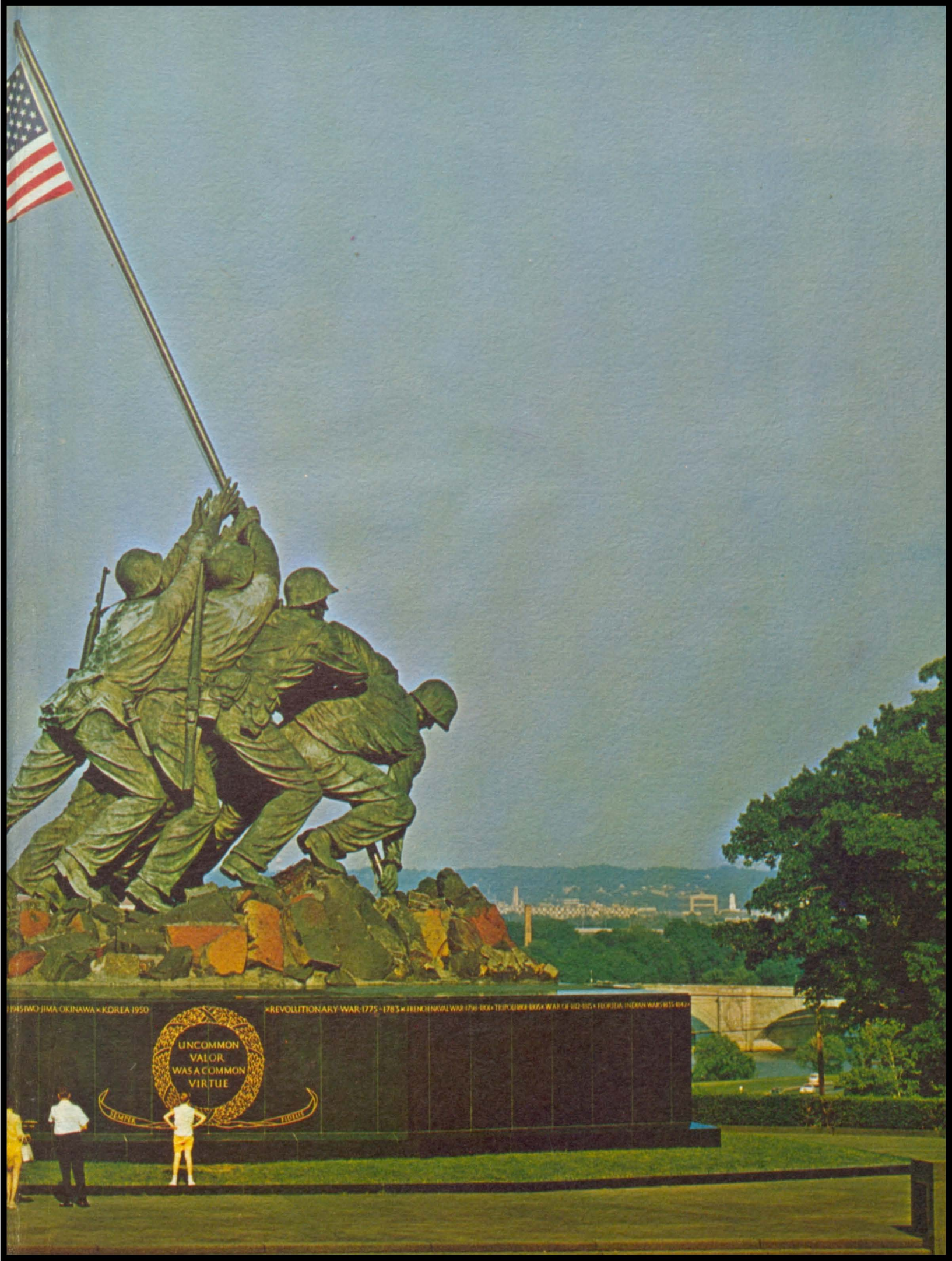

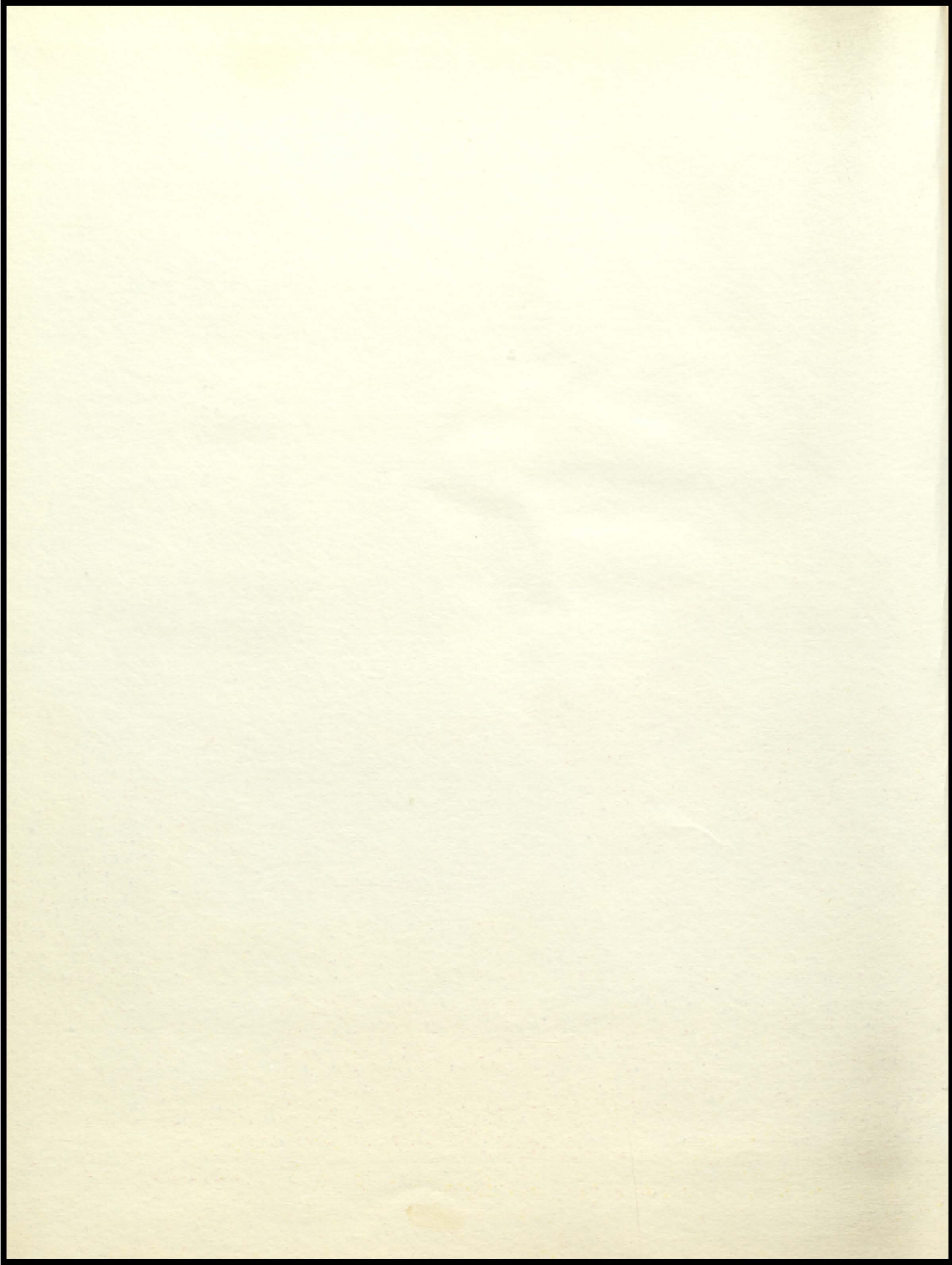

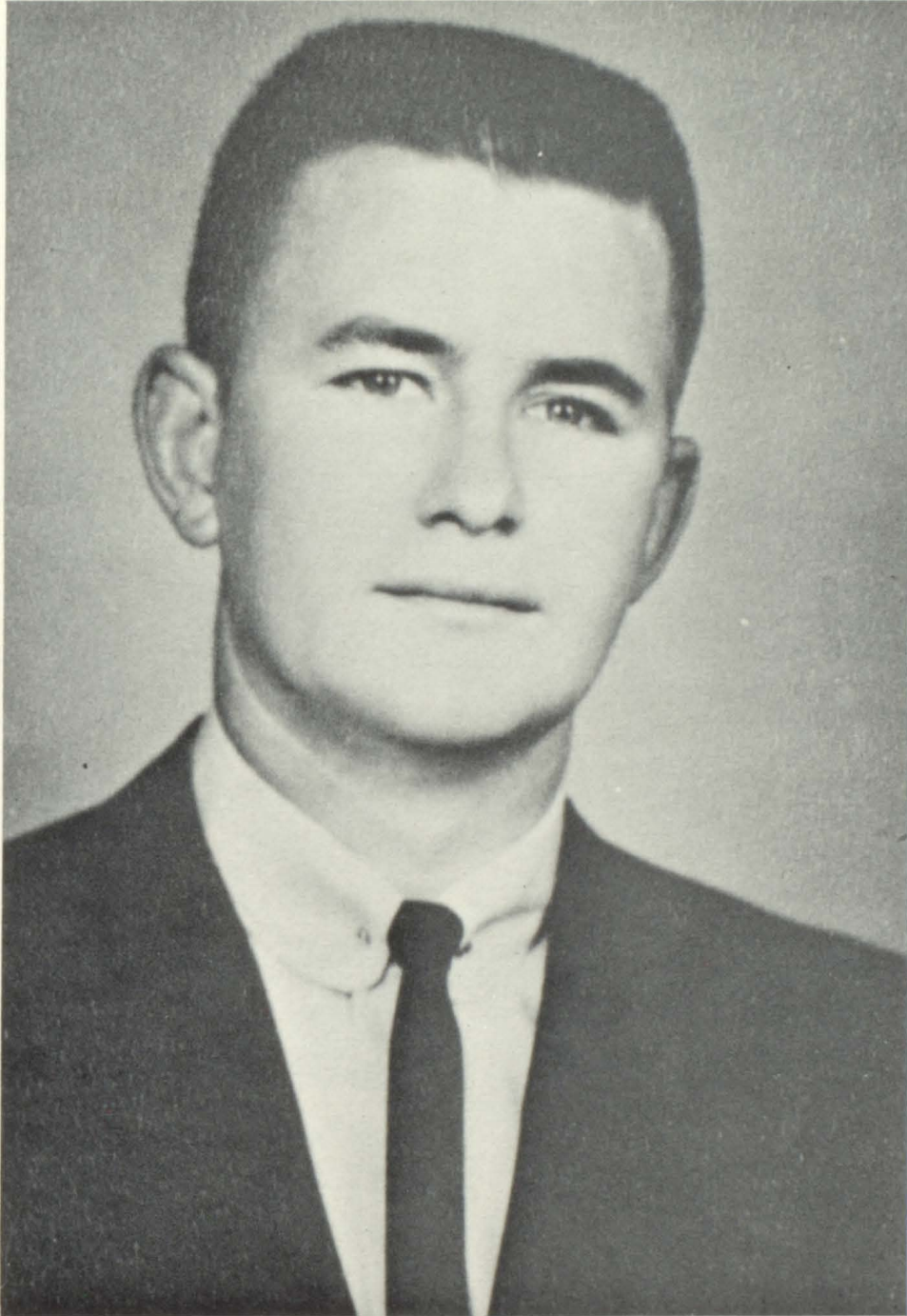


A Pencil's Tour

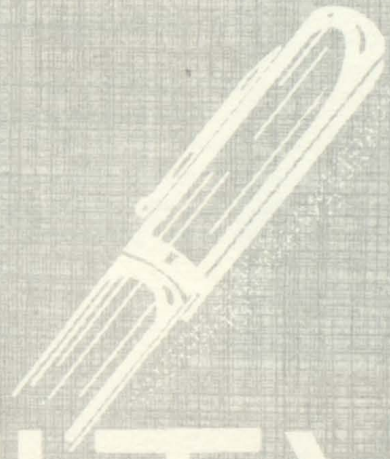

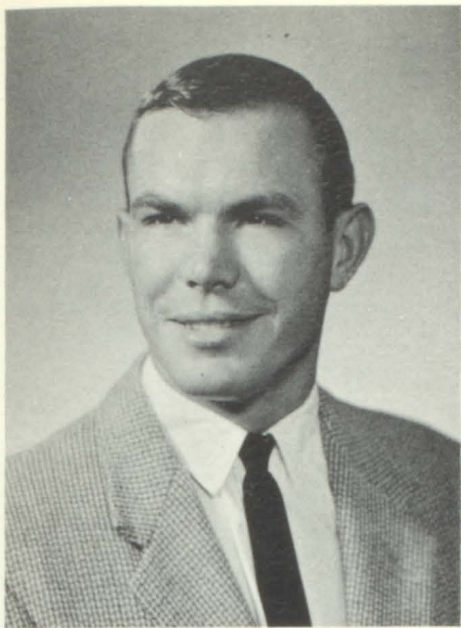

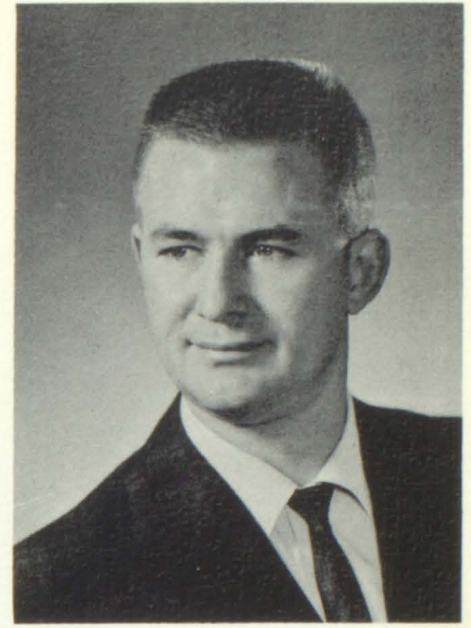


SCHOOL BOARD

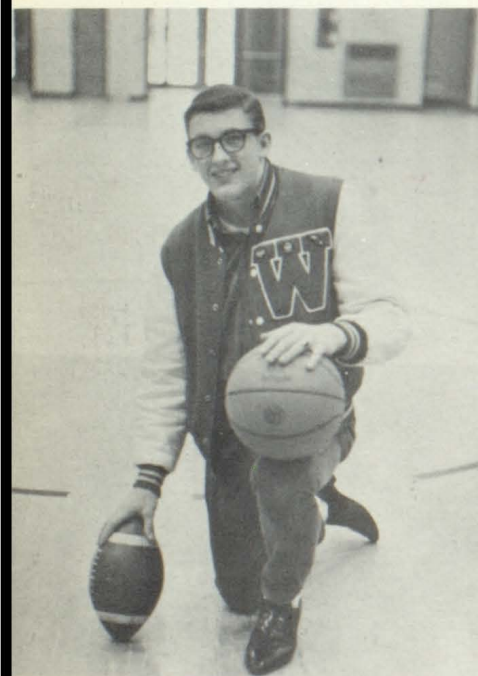


Chosen as All-State Football Player of the Year is Dennis Uecker. Because of his outstanding athletic ability in football, he was presented with a scholarship.

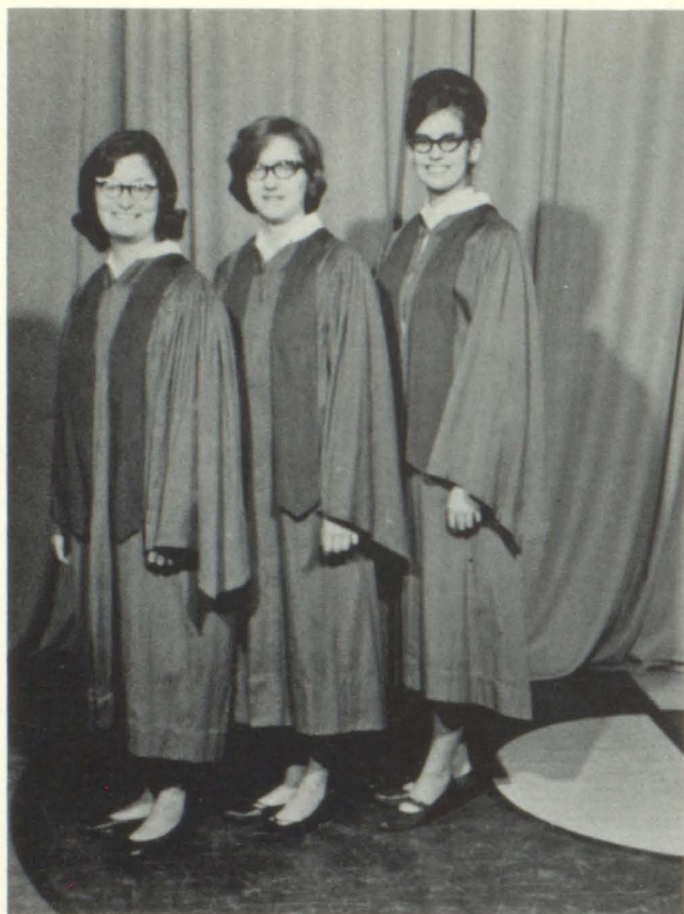

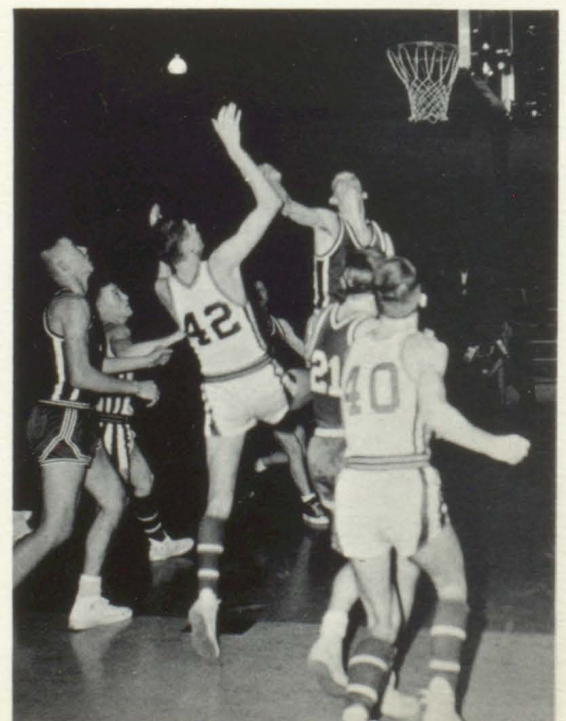

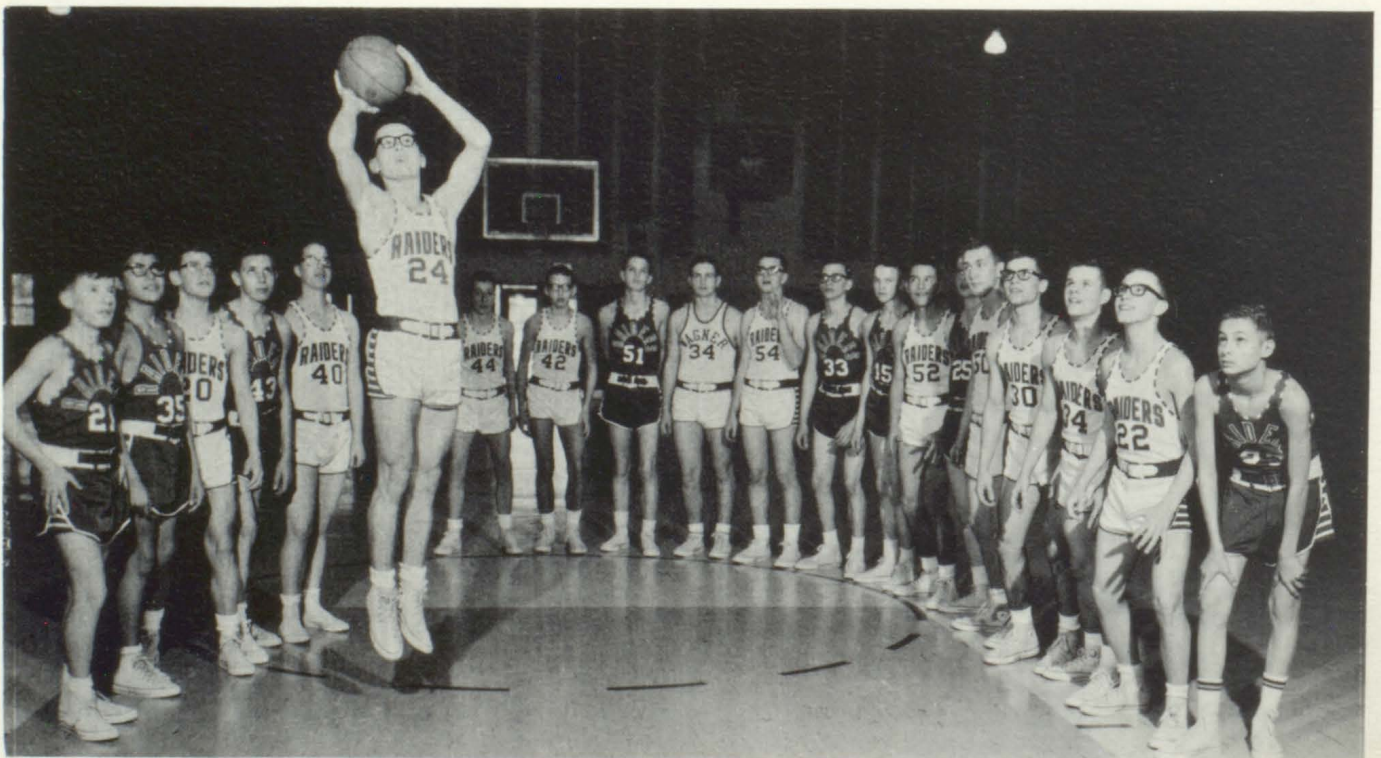
