Support Staff Does Excellent Job

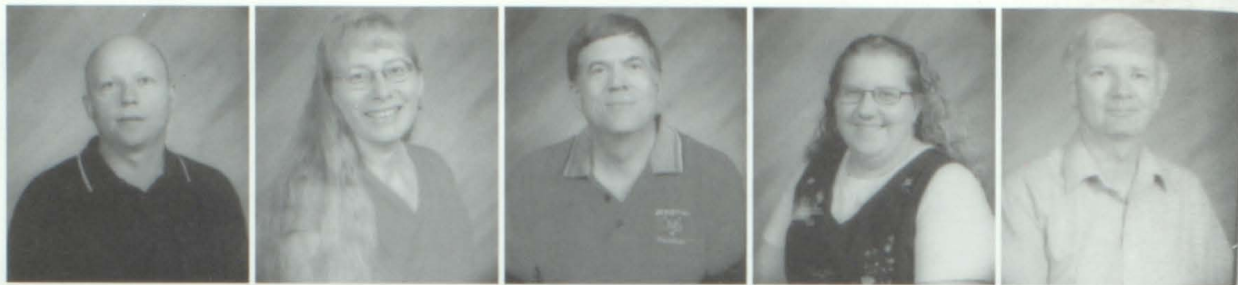

WAGNER BIDS FARE WELL TO FOUR TEACHING LEGENDS

Two-thousand four marks the end of an era at Wagner Community School as four teachers retire, taking with them 157 combined years of teaching experience. Mr. Glen Schoepf, Mrs. Lorean Schoepf, Mr. Verne Twitero, and Mrs. Jan Twitero have called this year their last, and are looking forward to the unstructured freedom of retirement.

Mr. Schoepf has taught 35 years at Wagner. In this time he has served as computer coordinator, a math teacher, and "almost any other class that needed to be taught. During his years he also served as athletic director, a coach for basketball, track, and junior high football. He has been either a junior or senior class advisor for as long as he can remember, and was the play director for twenty-five years.

Upon retirement Mr. Schoepf looks forward to doing nothing, but fears the "honey-do" list coming his way. He will miss the students and faculty of Wagner School. As he departs, he advises students to: "Work hard -- it's a long life ahead.

Mrs. Schoepf has also dedicated 35 years to the students of Wagner as an English teacher. Along with her teaching duties, Mrs. Schoepf has been an oral-interpretation coach for all 35 of her years. She has also served as a class advisor for all of her years. When she leaves, Mrs. Schoepf looks forward to a life free of a bell. She has always presented her students with the mantra,

"You might as well enjoy what you are doing since you have to do it anyway." Mrs. Schoepf will take with her many wonderful memories of her days at Wagner along with her self-defining idea that "teaching makes it so I never have to grow up."

Mr. Twitero has served all of his 40 years of teaching at WHS. He began with a semester contract and was then headed to a teaching job in Oregon. "This has been the longest semester of my life. Throughout his years here, Mr. Twitero has taught three generations of students

science, math, and most recently, computer graphics. Along with classes, Mr. Twitero has coached golf and was an assistant wrestling coach. He has "almost always" been a junior or senior class advisor.

When he finally does retire, Mr. Twitero is planning to fulfill his long-overdue trip to Oregon amongst his fishing, hunting, and golfing.

Mr. Twitero has taught at Wagner for 40 years; Mrs. Twitero for 37 years.



As he looks back on his time here, Mr. Twitero has concluded that each generation of students are better and brighter. He leaves his students with his wisdom: "Get as much education as you can because you never know where life will take you."

Mrs. Twitero has also dedicated 37 years of her life to teaching at Wagner -- the only school that she has ever worked in. Along with her duties as a math instructor, Mrs. Twitero served as annual advisor for eighteen years.

She looks forward to being free of SRB next year, but she will miss the student, staff, and atmosphere of Wagner. Her time will be well spent, though. Her retirement plans include golfing, fishing, hunting, reading, organizing, and gardening.

As she says good-bye, Mrs. Twitero leaves this bit of advise to students: "Get conscientious about learning as soon as possible." To teachers she says: "learn to go with the flow."

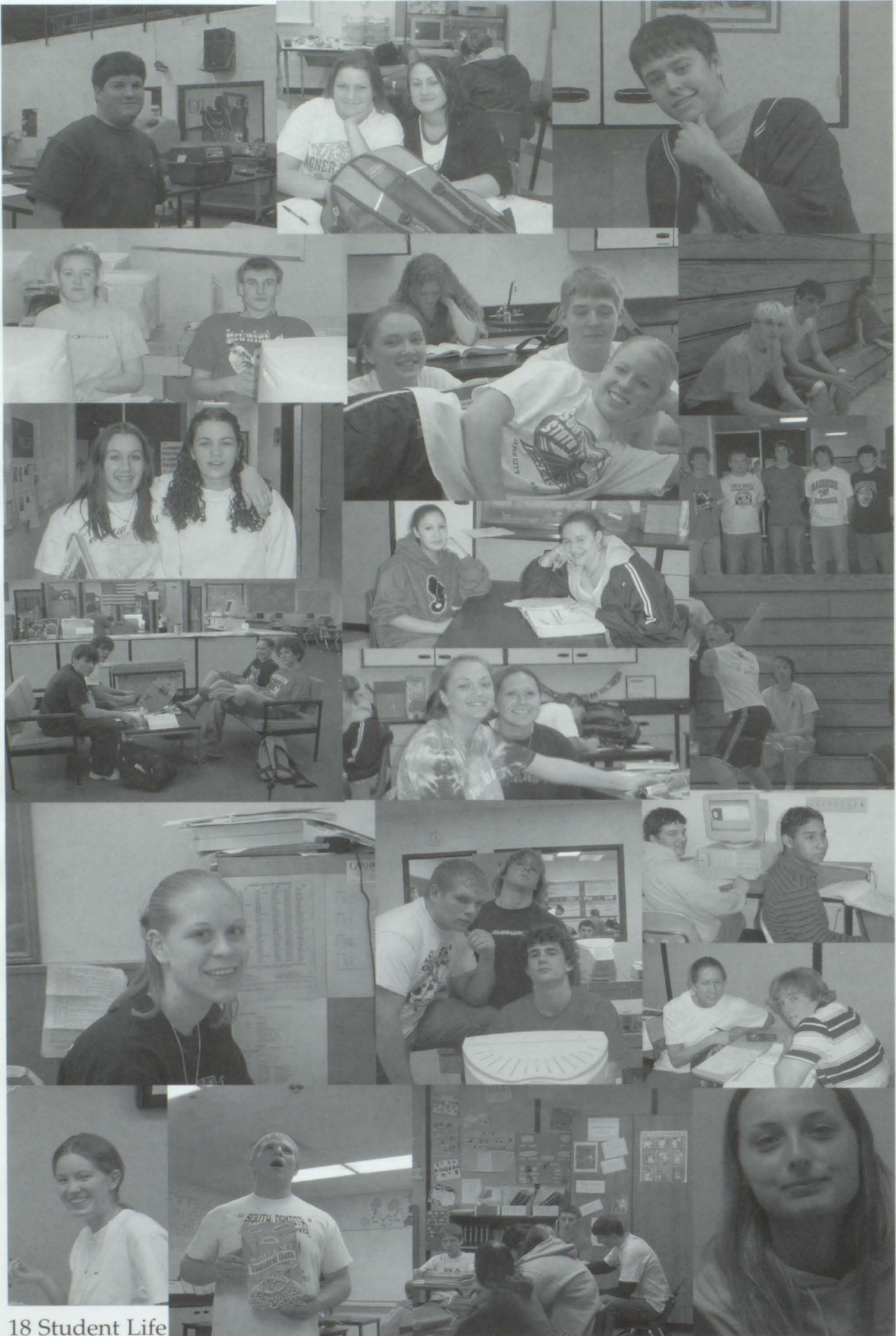

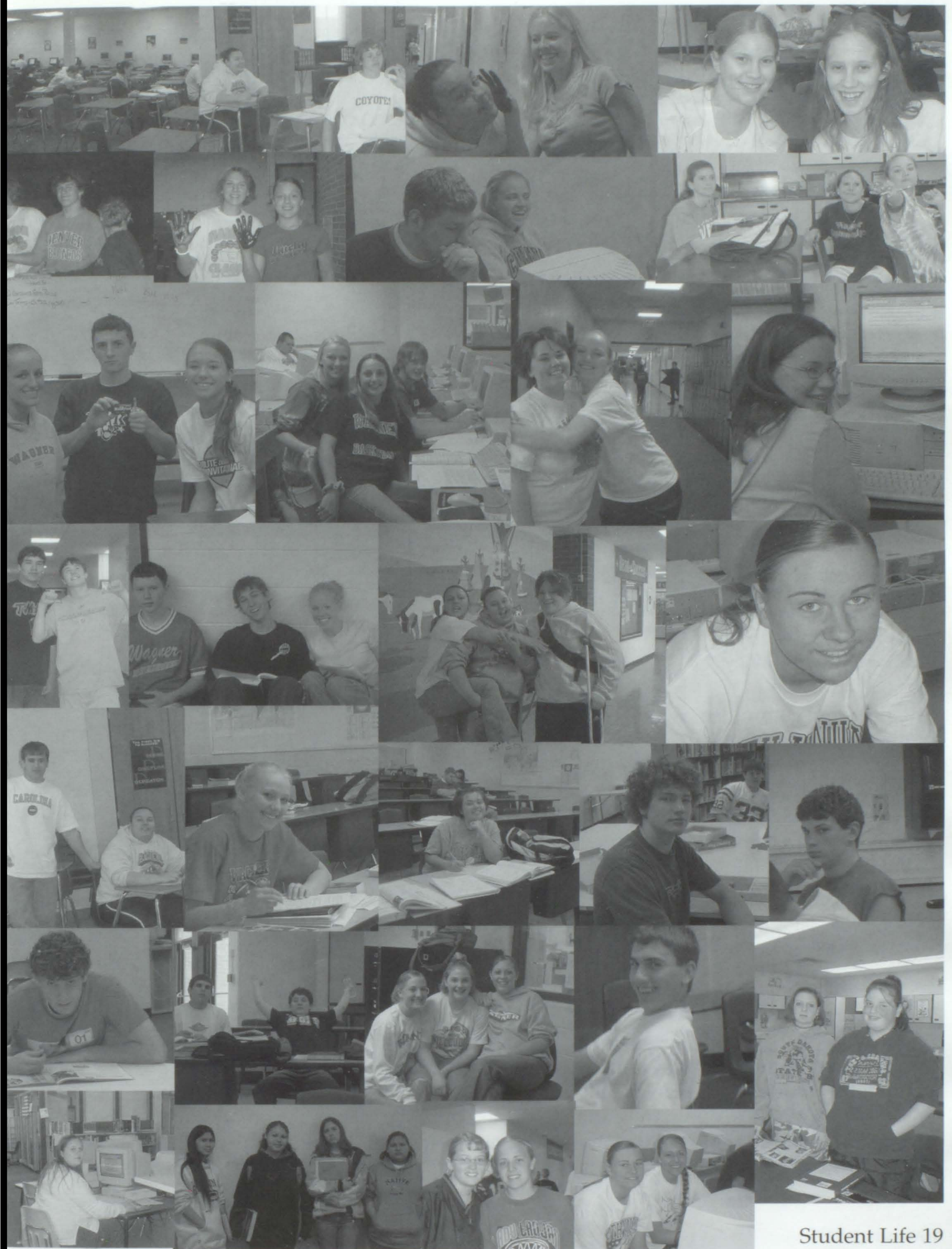

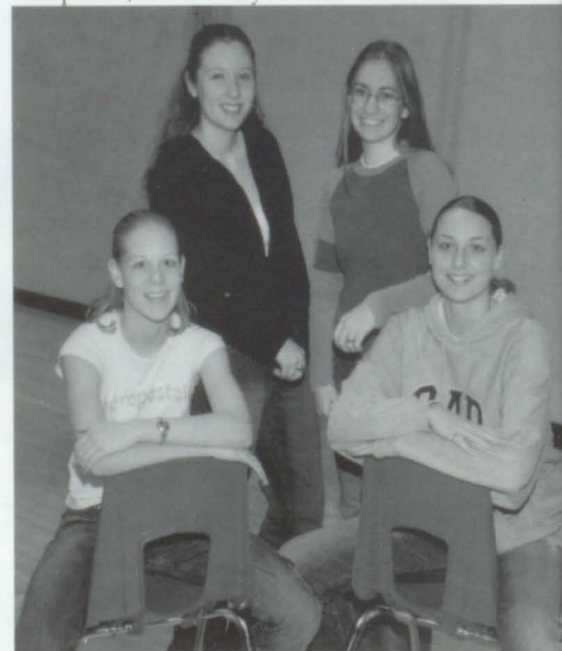
to elementary classes.

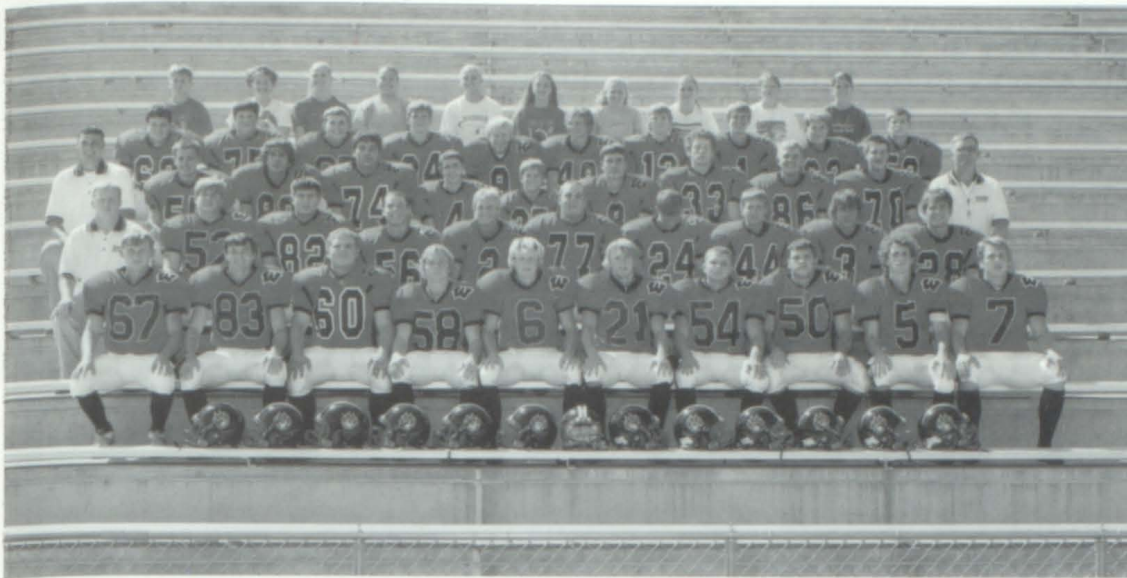

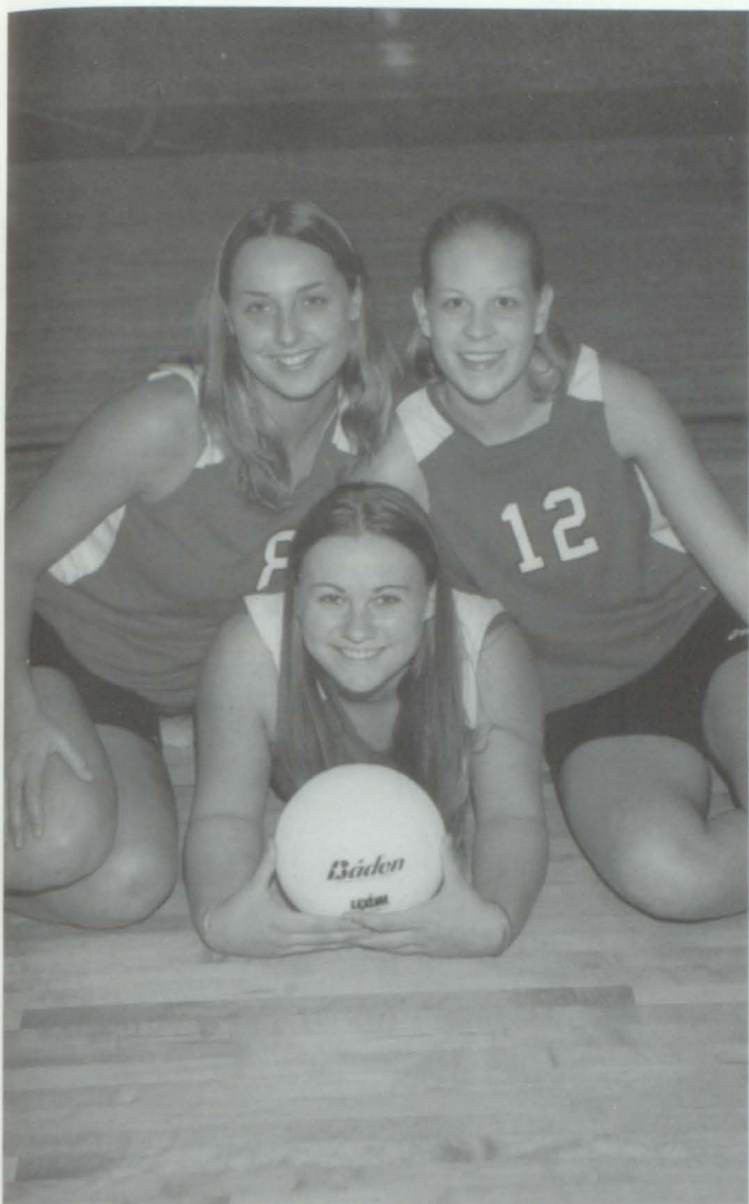

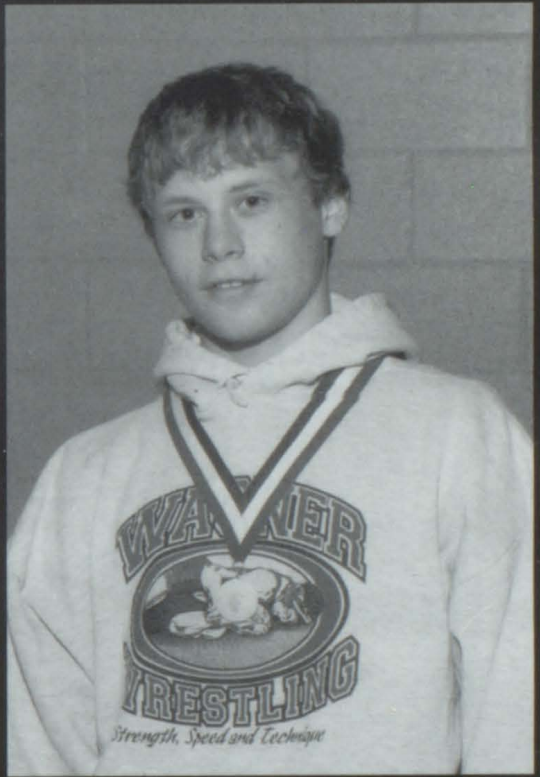

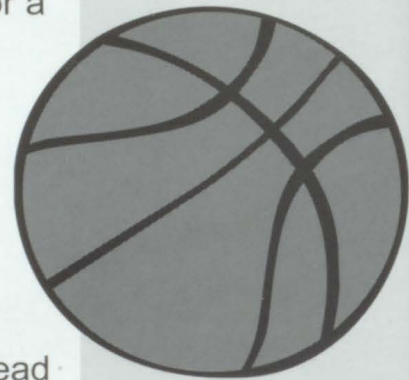
